Offers from the bidders listed herein are the only offers received timely as of the above opening date and time. All other bids submitted in response to this solicitation, if any, are hereby rejected as late.

In accordance with F.S. 255.0516, bid protests by educational boards, with respect to state contracts and bids, pursuant to competitive bidding, whether under Chapter 235, relating to educational facilities, or under this chapter, relating to public buildings, if a school board, a community college board of trustees, or the Board of Regents uses procedures pursuant to Chapter 120 for bid protests, the board will require the protestor to post a bond amounting to:

- (1) Twenty-five thousand dollars or 1 percent of the lowest accepted bid, whichever is greater, for projects valued over \$500,000; and
- (2) Five percent of the lowest accepted bid for all other projects.
