FINAL ORDER

THIS MATTER came to be heard by the School Board of Palm Beach County, Florida, ("School Board") for the purpose of entering a Final Order in the above-styled cause. In consideration of the Recommendation of the Superintendent and the attached exhibits, the School Board makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.


FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent's parents were notified by the Principal of John F. Kennedy Middle Magnet School that the Respondent was being recommended for expulsion on March 28, 2005. The Recommendation for Expulsion is incorporated by reference and made a part hereof as (Exhibit A).
2. Respondent's parents were notified by the Superintendent of the School District of Palm Beach County, Florida ("School District") on November 15, 2005, via certified and regular mail, that the Respondent would be recommended to the School Board to be expelled from the School District. The Notice of Recommendation for Expulsion is incorporated by reference and made a part hereof as (Exhibit B).
3. Said notice advised Respondent's parents of their right to an administrative hearing to contest the charges contained therein provided they requested a hearing within ten (10) days of receipt of same.
4. No hearing request has been received in the Office of the Chief Academic Officer.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The School Board has jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties hereto.
2. The School Board finds that the Respondent is guilty of the acts alleged by the Superintendent in the letter dated November 15, 2005, to wit:

Committed battery/aggravated battery on School Board Employee and disruption of school/disorderly conduct while on the campus of John F. Kennedy Middle Magnet School on March 18, 2005.

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED by the School Board in regular session that the recommendation of the Superintendent be accepted and confirmed.  hereby expelled from the School District for one calendar year from April 11, 2005. Respondent may choose to continue educational services during his expulsion

period at the ACS site. However, if Respondent is dismissed from that program by ACS, no further educational services will be offered by the District until the expulsion period is ended.

This Order may be appealed within thirty (30) days by filing a notice of appeal with the District Court of Appeal. Except in cases of indigence, the Court will require a filing fee and payment for preparing the record on appeal. For further explanation of the right to appeal, refer to § 120.68, Fla. Stat., and the Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.

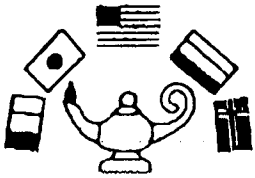

- Police Report #05-1101

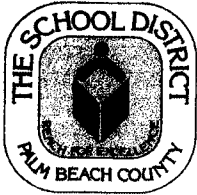

NOTICE OF RECOMMENDATION FOR EXPULSION

Based upon the recommendation of Ethel L. Randolph, Principal of John F. Kennedy Middle Magnet School, and in accordance with Florida Statute § 1006.07, and Palm Beach County School Board Policy 5.1813, I will request that the School Board of Palm Beach County, Florida, expel your son, [REDACTED] from the Palm Beach County School District. This decision is based upon the following action:

Committed battery/aggravated battery on School Board Employee and disruption of school/disorderly conduct while on the campus of John F. Kennedy Middle Magnet School on March 18, 2005.

Pursuant to Florida Statute § 120.569, you have the right to an administrative hearing. Your request must be received by the Office of the Chief Academic Officer within ten (10) days of the date of this letter. If you request a hearing, a hearing officer will be appointed pursuant to Florida Statute § 120.81(1)(e). If you do not request a hearing, this recommendation will become final.

Your son may receive educational services at the ACS Transition Program during this expulsion due process. If you have any questions regarding the expulsion due process or the educational services available at the ACS Intensive Site, please contact the Office of the Chief Academic Officer at 561-649-6888.

BY LEGAL SERVICES

On Thursday March 17, 2005 at approximately 1445, I heard someone yell out, "There is a fight in front of one the buses in front of the gym." As I responded to the area, bus driver Shandal Holmes stopped me as she was getting off her bus, stopped me and stated, "A teacher just pushed a student, then slapped him several times.

[REDACTED], the student involved in the altercation had already been detained by a school administrator. He stated, "I was trying to get on the bus, when a teacher pushed me, then hit me in the head with a bottle."

Student [REDACTED], who happened to be standing besides [REDACTED] when the incident happened, stated, "[REDACTED] was getting on the bus when Mrs. Joseph was pushing us back, and pushed the boy back and hit him in the head with a bottle."

Mrs. Joseph, who had entered the gymnasium shortly after the incident, returned to the bus area where I was taking statements and informed me she was "OK". Then, while holding a plastic 16 oz coca cola bottle in her hand, shook it toward me and stated "I wish it was fuller so I could have hit him harder." She then walked over to some teachers and proceeded to converse with them.

I informed Mrs. Randolph, the school Principal, of the situation. Mrs. Randolph in return contacted the abuse line. I continued gathering information and acquiring documentation. When I attempted to contact Mrs. Joseph, I was unable to locate her on the campus.

On Friday March 18, 2005, Deloris Joseph contacted School Police Dispatch requesting to report and acquire a case number regarding the previous day's incident. At approximately 1200 hours, I spoke with Mrs. Joseph via the telephone. Since she kept insisting she needed to present a statement regarding the incident, I informed her that I would be willing to meet with her at her disposal. After I informed her that I would be reading her the Miranda Rights prior to taking her statement, she demanded to know why did she need to have her rights read to her since she believed she was the victim in this case. She then proceeded to explain that the student had walked up to her and punched her in the face. At this point in time, I explained to Mrs. Joseph that I could not discuss this case with her over the telephone, but I would be here at the school (John F. Kennedy Middle) to take her statement. I then asked her that if she was still willing, I would gladly meet with her before the end of the day. At first, she did not give an answer. A few seconds later, after I repeated the question, she responded by saying, "I am on my way to the doctor, I don't know how long I will be there, ok! Shortly after our conversation, School Dispatch informed me that

Labor Relations had called and explained that Mrs. Joseph would not be giving a statement without her lawyer present. Also, since her lawyer would not be able to make it today, an appointment would be set up on Monday. I contacted Lt. Arroyo and informed him of the situation.

At present, and per departmental procedure, this case will be forwarded to internal affairs for further investigations.

A follow up investigation was conducted at JFK Middle School in reference to a complaint from Principal Ms. Ethel Randolph regarding the actions of teacher Ms. Delores Joseph. School District Police Officer Brenda Senkier had conducted a preliminary investigation after school bus driver Shandal Holmes verbally reported that a teacher had pushed a student and slapped him several times. This incident occurred in an area where students board the school buses known as the bus loop.

I spoke to Ms. Randolph about possible adult witnesses to the incident. Ms. Randolph provided the names of two teachers, Shelly May Forrester and Augustus Harris, who witnessed part of the incident that occurred between Delores Joseph and student [REDACTED]. An interview was next conducted with teacher Ms. Shelly May Forrester. The interview was audiotape recorded and Ms. Forrester was placed under oath. According to Ms. Forrester, she was standing in the bus loop area in front of the gymnasium monitoring students going to the buses. She looked at an area where a fight was occurring and saw Delores Joseph on the ground holding on to the shirt of a student. The student was stepping back and punching Ms. Joseph on her face. Ms. Forrester jumped in and held on to the arm of the student pulling him away from Ms. Joseph. Another teacher, Ms. Harris, also helped by holding on to the student. Forrester did not know the name of the student. Forrester then took Ms. Joseph into the gym where she searched for ice. Joseph's lip was bleeding and her finger was swollen. After searching for ice Ms. Forrester took Ms. Joseph to the school nurse. Forrester did not see how the altercation began.

I next met with Mr. Augustus Harris. An audiotape-recorded interview was conducted with Mr. Harris who was placed under oath. According to Mr. Harris, he was standing at the back fence near the gymnasium waiting for the last bus to load up with students. He was talking to some other teachers. He saw students lined up to board one of the buses then noticed a student punching one of the teachers. Harris saw the teacher grab the student's shirt as the student punched teacher Delores Joseph who stumbled back. Ms. Joseph fell on the ground and the student continued to punch Ms. Joseph. The student was backing up while hitting Ms. Joseph who was holding the student's shirt with her hand. There were teachers trying to pull the student away from Ms. Joseph, but they were unable to. Harris said he grabbed the student around the upper chest and neck area and pulled him away from Ms. Joseph. The School Police Officers then arrived and took the student away. Ms. Joseph was holding part of the student's t-shirt in her hand.

Over a several day period, I attempted to contact student/witness [REDACTED] who previously wrote a brief statement for Officer Senkier. [REDACTED] had not been attending school and was unable to be located and

interviewed.

On 04-11-05, the investigation continued. I met with school bus driver Ms. Shandal Holmes at the North Area Bus Compound. An audiotape-recorded interview was conducted with Ms. Holmes who was placed under oath. According to Ms. Holmes, as she arrived at JFK Middle School there was a school employee who told her to close the door to the bus while she tried to line up the students. Holmes did not know the person's name or title. I advised Ms. Holmes that the person in question is a teacher. The students were refusing to get in a straight line and were pushing to get on the bus. The teacher was pushing one student who was in front of her with her hand and elbow. Some of the students were on the side of the employee trying to get on the bus. Ms. Holmes was sitting on the driver's seat of the bus at this time. The student who was in the front of the line moved to the left side of the teacher. The student started taking off his shirt and the teacher walked toward him and started hitting the student with a plastic water bottle on his neck and face area. Holmes said the water bottle had a small amount of water in it. Holmes did not know why the teacher started hitting the student. The student then hit the teacher back recalling that the student may have pushed the student. Ms. Holmes did not see what else occurred because both the student and teacher moved to a location where she could not see them.

I obtained medical treatment information on Delores Joseph from the School District Risk Management Department. According to the records from Pinecrest Occupational Medicine, Joseph was diagnosed as sustaining a fracture to her left ring finger, contusion to her scalp and a right shoulder sprain.

On 05-06-05, an interview was conducted with Ms. Delores Joseph. Present for the interview was Attorney Mark Wilensky. The interview was audiotape recorded and Ms. Joseph was placed under oath. A Garrity rights form was read to Ms. Joseph who stated the following: She was attempting to line up the students in two lines prior to them boarding the school bus. At first, students were in a hurry to get on the bus so Ms. Joseph got in front of them and the bus driver closed the door while Joseph was on the steps of the bus. The driver said she was going to leave if the students did not line up. When Joseph got off the bus she told the students what the driver said. At this time, the students were pushing toward her. Joseph does not remember pushing any of the students. There were students saying they were not getting in line and were cursing. Ms. Joseph said she probably had a bottle of coke in her hand. She further did not recall talking to Officer Senkier and making comments about the bottle being more full so she could have hit the student harder. Ms. Joseph did recall the student, whom she had the altercation with, taking off his jersey while students were getting on the bus. At the time Joseph did not know why the student was taking off his jersey. The next event that happened, according to Joseph, was

being attacked by the student who took his jersey off. Joseph said she was punched in the face by the student. Joseph at first did not remember hitting the student with her plastic bottle, then after further questioning, Joseph said she did not hit the student until after he punched her on her face. Joseph further said that prior to being hit by the student he was cursing at her while she told him he was not getting on the bus until he got in line. The student refused to get in line. Ms. Joseph further said that the student pulled her to the ground while punching and kicking her. A teacher named Ms. Forrester then tried to pull the student away along with another teacher. Ms. Joseph said she did not hit the student until he hit her.

The interviews conducted with the witnesses and suspect has been summarized. Detailed statements received during the interview were not reiterated within this report as they are contained within the audiotaped statements. It is recommended that authorized individuals review the audiotaped interviews or transcriptions in their entirety.

This investigation concludes there is a lack of sufficient evidence to support probable cause for pursuing criminal charges toward teacher Delores Joseph for battery. All witnesses confirmed that student [REDACTED] retaliated against Delores Joseph who received medical treatment for her injuries. No reported injuries on student [REDACTED]. Case referred to the Department of Professional Standards for review.
