Entries must be a school project that focuses on a specific school initiated parent/family involvement program or strategy.

Program winners will have their program outlined in the SPARKPLUGS FOR FAMILY INVOLVEMENT and THE FAMILY RESOURCE DIRECTORY. These are circulated throughout the state by volunteer coordinators, PTA leaders and other family involvement program coordinators. The Commissioner of Education will recognize the parent representatives of these programs at the Florida PTA Leadership Conference in July 2013.

The deadline for submission is January 31, 2013 to the Office of Community Involvement (VIPS), FHESC, Suite B-102. This is an excellent opportunity to showcase your school programs that involve the families of the students in your school. Thank you for your participation.

Overview of Award

The purpose of this award is to promote and recognize innovative school practices that increase family involvement. Each school selected as a regional winner will designate a parent to represent the school in accepting the award during the Florida PTA Leadership Conference in July, 2013. Expenses for the school representative that will be reimbursed include: airfare over 200 miles, car mileage under 200 miles, two nights lodging, awards luncheon ticket.

Award Categories

Entries will be judged in each of two categories: Elementary School (PreK-5) and Middle/High School (6-12). Statewide, there will be a total of ten winners. Each district may submit two nominations: one elementary and one middle/high school.

Criteria for Selection

A nomination should reflect an innovative practice for recruitment, training, and/or recognition of parents and other family members. These could include, but not be limited to, programs that address: removing barriers, parenting, student learning, communicating, volunteering, training at school or at home, decision making, collaborating with the community, and others.





Judging

At the district level, the selection process will be organized by the District Community Involvement/ Volunteer Coordinator. Nominations will be evaluated on:

- 1) Impact on family involvement
- 2) Ability to be replicated
- Relationship to the goals and objectives of the schools
- Participation of parents/families in planning and implementation
- 5) Uniqueness and innovation
- 6) Impact on school improvement
- Numbers of parents participating in relationship to program capability to accommodate
- 8) Cost
- 9) Collaborative efforts

Entry Deadline for School Volunteer Coordinators:

An original and one copy of the complete nomination form are to be received in the Office of Community Involvement (VIPS), 3300 Forest Hill Blvd., Suite B-102, West Palm Beach, FL 33406, no later than January 31, 2013.

Eligibility

The nomination is to be generated by the School Advisory Council, with input from the school's PTA or parent organization. Entries must be school projects that focus on a specific school-initiated parent/family involvement program or strategy. These could include innovative parent involvement strategies that place parent training sites away from the school and in the workplace, the church, or other convenient locations.
