Bullying

Dear Ms. Rodriguez,

Kim Mazauskas and I would like to express our appreciation to the Anti-Defamation League for providing the Peer Leadership Training to our District, via the generosity of Impact 100. Our nine secondary schools which participated in the training took the message to heart, and instituted programs which dramatically impacted their schools' climates. As you might imagine, the schools that most consistently followed through with their implementation plans had the best gains, as measured by reduced discipline statistics in two key indicators of student-to-student conduct. The chart below shows how the nine schools, which received their *No Place for Hate* designation, improved in the areas of bullying and fighting. As a basis of comparison, the schools, which have not yet received their designation, are also included in the shaded areas. For purposes of school confidentiality, the schools have been assigned a code. (H.S.=High School, M.S.= Middle School, E.S.= Elementary School.)

The data shows that the *No Place for Hate* schools' data either stayed the same or improved in 17 out of 18 indicators, comparing 2012 and 2013. As you can see, those schools still working at their projects showed gains for the most part, but have more work to do. While many variables go into creating the conditions that shape disciplinary statistics, we believe the work inspired by the ADL greatly contributed to our positive gains. Students are truly learning to treat each other with greater respect and consideration, and we hope that
