District Policy allows for Smart Snack compliant snacks and beverages to be sold in **High Schools**

Any time during the school day except when meals are being served.

If they do not meet the guidelines, they may only be sold 30 minutes after the end of the school day.



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Competitive Foods Entrées



- May not contain both a grain and protein
- May not be sold to students during the school day

School Day = Midnight to 30 minutes after the end of the official school day



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Vending Machines and School Stores in High Schools

- May be operational anytime during the school day except when meals are being served
- All snacks & beverages must be Smart Snack Compliant



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Fundraisers

The Smart Snacks in School Regulations also adds nutritional requirements to the snacks and beverages being sold as part of fundraisers

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Fundraisers - High Schools

- 15 days worth of exemptions
- May only occur thirty minutes or more after the conclusion of the last lunch period.
