Smart Snacks compliant snacks and beverages may be sold in Middle schools 30 minutes after the end of the last lunch period.

If they do not meet the guidelines, they may only be sold 30 minutes after the end of the school day.


Competitive Foods Entrées

Fundraisers-Middle and Combination Schools

- 10 days worth of exemptions
- May only occur thirty minutes or more after the conclusion of the last lunch period.


