SUBJECT: GRADUATION RATE

Attached are three tables related to graduation rate within the School District of Palm Beach County (SDPBC):

1. Table 1 reports the FY2003¹ graduation rate, the expenditure per student, and key student demographic characteristics of the 25 largest districts within the United States. The list is sorted by graduation rate.
2. Table 2 reports the results of progress made by SDPBC student groups in increasing the graduation rate from FY2002 to FY2006.
3. Table 3 reports the extent of gap closures in SDPBC graduation rates between traditionally lower performing students and their higher performing counterparts from FY2002 to FY2006.

Summary of the Attached Tables Related to Graduation Rate in SDPBC

1. In FY2003, SDPBC was ranked eighth of the 25 largest districts in graduation rate and sixteenth in the expenditure per student (see Table 1).
2. From FY2002 to FY2006 the graduation rate among all students as a group, White students, students in the free or reduced lunch program, and ESE students has increased statistically. However, the graduation rate among Black, Hispanic, and LEP students has not increased statistically (See Table 2).
3. From FY2002 to FY2006, the gap between the graduation rate of all traditionally lower performing student groups and their higher performing counterparts has not closed statistically. In fact, the gap between LEP students and non-LEP students has widened (See Table 3).
