4-C I recommend that the Board adopt the proposed revised Policy 1.04, entitled "Unitary School District."

CONSENT ITEM

- Minor revisions correspond to the concurrent revision or adoption of other Policies affecting attendance areas and reassignments.
- The substance of the majority-to-minority transfer rule is moved from this Policy to the proposed new Policy 5.015, Student Reassignment.
- In accordance with the Board's request at the special meeting on Policies on March 29, this Policy will reflect an amendment to Policy 5.015, adding socioeconomic status (classified by whether or not the student is eligible for free/reduced-price lunch) and ethnicity, so that students attending their regularly assigned school and who are of the majority race/ ethnicity/socioeconomic status at that school will have first priority for a transfer assignment to a school in which their race/ethnicity/socioeconomic status is in the minority (lines 31-36).

2 3 4		UNITARY SCHOOL DISTRICT
5 6 7 8	1.	The School Board of Palm Beach County shall strive to maintain a unitary school system that will provide equal educational opportunity for all students without placing such burdens on the students that their ability to achieve a quality education is impaired.
9 10 11 12	2.	Faculty and Staff Composition It shall be the policy of this School District that principals, teachers, teacher aides <u>paraprofessionals</u> and other employees of the District shall be employed and assigned to work locations in a non-discriminatory manner.
13 14 15 16 17	3.	Transportation System The transportation system shall be reviewed regularly to insure that the assignment of students to buses shall be on a nondiscriminatory basis. In situations where it is not feasible to provide bus transportation, the Superintendent shall recommend to the Board that custodial parents/guardians be paid mileage at the current state reimbursement rate.
18 19 20 21	4.	<u>Site Selection and</u> School Construction, site selection All school construction, school consolidation, and site selection (including the location of temporary classrooms) in the District shall be done in a manner which will maintain a unitary School District.

Student Transfers Into and Out of District In the event the Board <u>might</u> grants transfers to students to attend public schools outside the District, or if it permits transfers into the District of students who live outside the District, it shall do so on a nondiscriminatory basis.

Intra-District Student Transfer In the event the School District grants transfers to students living in the District to attend a school center other than that determined by approved attendance boundaries, such transfers shall be approved on a nondiscriminatory basis. The Superintendent will develop such administrative procedures as necessary to implement this Policy.

Majority to Minority Transfer Rule Students attending their regularly assigned school and who are of the majority race/ <u>ethnicity/socioeconomic status (as classified by whether or not the student is eligible for free/reduced-price lunch)</u> at that school have first priority for a transfer assignment to a school in which their race/ <u>ethnicity/socioeconomic status</u> is in the minority. <u>as provided by Policy 5.015(5)(g)</u> . Parents requesting such majority to minority transfers for their children should select a school reasonably close to their home, such that the distance traveled or time required for travel is not substantially increased. Should such transfer substantially increase the distance traveled, the Superintendent may deny the transfer.

41	Transportation will be provided to those exercising their right to transfer under
42	this rule. The Superintendent shall inform all parents about the provisions of the
43	majority to minority transfer rule by placing the information about the rule in the
44	student/parent handbook and by providing each student a copy of the handbook.
45	8. The following procedure shall apply to exercising the right to transfer under this rule:
46	b. For returning students and new students entering the first day of school, this
47	rule shall operate for a period of thirty (30) calendar days commencing with
48	the opening day of school. New students entering after opening day shall
49	have (30) days from the date of enrollment to elect a transfer under this rule.
50	c. An application for transfer form must be completed by the parent or legal
51	guardian of the student and forwarded to the District office designated on the
52	application form.
53	d. Application for transfer forms will be available in each public school in Palm
54	Beach County and at the District office.
55	e. All transfer requests will be processed in the order they are received.
56	f. Custodial parents/guardians will be notified in writing of approval or
57	disapproval of the request.
58	g. A request for transfer, once granted, cannot be changed during the school
59	year.
60	h. All students are required to attend their regularly assigned school unless they
61	receive an approved transfer. No student may enroll in a school outside their
62	attendance boundary in anticipation of receiving an approved transfer.
63	9. When attendance boundaries are changed, elementary and secondary students with
64	one (1) year remaining in their present school should have the option of remaining at
65	that school. Students exercising the option of remaining at their present school must
66	provide their own transportation. When considering attendance boundary
67	adjustments, the Board by its own discretion may extend this option to other
68	students with more than one (1) year remaining. [Addressed in Policy $5.01(1)(C)$.]
