CONSENT ITEM

• The proposed policy has been re-drafted to include the governing provisions for all advisory committees as outlined in Board Policy 1.09 (Advisory Committees to the Board); thus, eliminating the provisions from this policy.

POLICY 1.095

TITLE

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1. <u>Purpose</u>. Independent Advisory Authority

- a. The establishment of the Independent Sales Surtax Oversight Committee (ISSOC) was authorized by a resolution of the School Board adopted July 26, 2004 ("the Resolution"), contingent upon the voters' approval of a half-cent sales surtax by referendum on November 2, 2004. As stated in Section 5 of the resolution:
- 9 Project Oversight by an Independent Committee. There is hereby authorized the establishment of an independent oversight committee of 10 volunteers (the "Committee") for the purpose of overseeing and approving 11 the implementation of the Plan [for the use of the proceeds of the levy 12 and collection of the surtax, and any interest accrued thereto, for capital 13 14 outlay projects, upgrades to the newest technology and land acquisition, 15 and which may also be used for the purpose of servicing bond indebtedness to finance the authorized capital outlay projects set forth in 16 17 Exhibit A to the Resolution] commencing upon approval of the surtax and 18 extending through the date of completion of the projects to be funded 19 under the Plan. The Oversight Committee shall consist of nine volunteer 20 citizen members who are residents of Palm Beach County. One 21 representative each from these current standing committees: CORC, 22 Finance, and TAG; one representative appointed by the Education 23 Commission; one representative appointed by the League of Cities; one 24 representative from the Black Community; one representative from the 25 Hispanic Community; and two representatives appointed by the Business Forum. The role of the Committee in overseeing the implementation of 26 27 the Plan shall constitute an integral part of the Plan and shall not be subject to repeal prior to completion of the Plan. 28
- b. The committee shall function consistent with Board Policy 1.09, "Advisory Gommittees to the Board," to assist the Board through independent oversight of the District's use of the proceeds of the half-cent sales surtax to be collected in Palm Beach County from January 1, 2005, through December 31, 2010 as well as reviewing the implementation of the 2005-2009 five-year capital facilities plan as it relates to the proceeds of the sales surtax.
- c. The ISSOC will reasonably be given support by the School Board to discharge
 its responsibilities, consistent with Board Policy 1.09.
- 37 2. Term of the Charter

- a. Consistent with the section 5 of the Resolution and with Policy 1.09(1)(f), this
 charter shall remain in effect until all proceeds of the sales surtax revenues
 from the six-year period from January 2005 through December 2010 have
 been expended and accounted for, i.e., when the projects to be funded under
 the Plan in the Resolution have been completed.
- b. The School Board may modify the ISSOC charter as set forth in this Policy
 upon recommendation of the Superintendent. This Policy shall be evaluated
 on an annual basis for possible revisions, and any revisions shall be
 consistent with the Resolution and any amendments thereto.
- 47 3. Responsibilities and Mission
- a. <u>The ISSOC shall function consistent with Board Policy 1.09 (Advisory</u> <u>Committees to the Board), to assist the Board through independent oversight</u> of the District's use of the proceeds of the half-cent sales surtax to be collected in Palm Beach County from January 1, 2005, through December 31, 2010 as well as reviewing the implementation of the 2005-2009 five-year capital facilities plan as it relates to the proceeds of the sales surtax.
- 54 b. The ISSOC will provide oversight of the District's usage and expenditures of the proceeds of the sales surtax to verify consistency with the projects and 55 56 purposes set forth in the Resolution, as set forth in subsection (1)(a) above. 57 The ISSOC acknowledges that changes to, deviations from, modifications to, 58 or non-compliance in relation to, the projects in Exhibit A to the Resolution 59 may occur due to Acts of God or the public enemy, hurricanes or other natural 60 disasters or other emergency situations affecting the operation of the public 61 school system; compliance with an order of any governmental authority having 62 jurisdiction or with state court judgments concerning the School District's state 63 constitutional or statutory obligation to provide a uniform system of free public 64 education; orders, consent decrees, or compliance agreements involving 65 federal courts or the Office for Civil Rights of the U.S. Department of 66 Education or the Florida Department of Education; shortage or unavailability of 67 materials, equipment, labor or technical personnel; breakdowns, epidemics, or 68 pandemics; riots, civil disorder, warfare, or terrorism; strikes, slowdowns, 69 walkouts, blockouts, or other industrial disturbances, whether direct or indirect; 70 or any other events, circumstances, forces, or causes not within the 71 reasonable control of the School District, whether or not of the same class or 72 kind as those specifically named above.
- c. The ISSOC will hold meetings on a regular basis such as quarterly. To
 facilitate preparation for each meeting, the agenda and backup materials shall
 be available to committee members a week in advance of each regular
 meeting. If a special meeting is called, the agenda and backup materials shall
 be available upon calling and noticing the meeting, at least 48 hours in

- 78 advance.
- 79d.The committee will report its observations, opinions, and advice in a high level80executive summary to the School Board at the Board's regular monthly81meetings. The reports should indicate whether a recommendation is82unanimous or what ratio of the voting membership supported a83recommendation, along with summary of the basis for the majority and84minority positions. The School Board continues to make all final decisions.
- 85 4. Membership Composition and Procedures
- a. Because of the special nature of this committee, any conflicting provisions of this Policy are intended to supersede and control over the provisions of Policy
 1.09. The ISSOC membership shall consist of:
- 89 i. the nine (9) voting members as set forth in section 5 of the Resolution 90 (quoted in section (1) of this Policy) and not more than four (4) additional 91 voting members (one representative each from the Glades, the senior 92 community, condominium residents, and the NAACP) totaling not more 93 than thirteen (13) voting members, who: shall be residents of Palm Beach 94 County; shall serve in a voluntary capacity; are not employed by the 95 School District; and are approved ratified by the School Board upon 96 recommendation of the Superintendent; and
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- 104 Upon adoption of this policy, ISSOC members shall be provided with a copy of b. this policy and a copy of Board Policy 1.09 (Advisory committees to the 105 106 Board). Upon the appointment of an individual(s) to an advisory committee, 107 the individual(s) shall be provided with a copy of this policy and Board Policy 108 The terms of ex-officio members shall be consistent with their term of 1.09. 109 service in the position which qualified them to serve ex-officio on the ISSOC. 110 The terms of the voting members shall be up to a maximum of up to eight 111 continuous years, provided that the organization represented by a member 112 may recommend at any time that its representative be changed, and provided that the term of each existing member shall be terminated upon dissolution of 113 114 the committee at such earlier time as the date when all projects to be funded 115 under the Plan have been completed and the expenditures of the sales surtax 116 proceeds have been accounted for.

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- 117 Any voting member may be removed for missing three (3) consecutive regular C. meetings or more than 25% of the meetings during the previous twelve (12) 118 119 months, unless by request of that member, the committee's Chair shall grant compassionate leave due to extenuating personal, business, or familial 120 121 reasons. A guarterly report will be made to the Board regarding the attendance 122 of voting ISSOC members. The School Board shall have discretion to remove 123 any committee member at any time and to seek nominations for a replacement 124 from the represented community. The appointment mechanism shall be 125 consistent with Board Policies and protocol and the Resolution.
- 126d.A-quorum shall consist of 40% (rounded to the nearest whole number) of the
existing voting members.
- e. The ISSOC elected a Chair and a Vice Chair from among the voting members
 on February 2, 2005, and shall elect voting members to those positions
 annually thereafter as needed.
- 131 5. <u>Committee Meetings, Operations, Procedures and</u> Administrative Matters
- 132a.<u>Meetings. The ISSOC will hold its meetings consistent with the provisions of Board Policy 1.09.</u>
- b. <u>Operations and Procedures.</u> ISSOC shall conduct its meetings consistent with, and ISSOC members shall abide by, the provisions of Board Policy 1.09.
- 136 Sunshine, Public Records, and Ethics Guidelines
- c. All ISSOC meetings shall be conducted under uniform rules of parliamentary procedures such as *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised*. All committee and subcommittee meetings are governed by the open-meetings provisions of Fla. Stat. § 286.011, the Sunshine Law. All documents maintained by persons in their capacity as ISSOC members are subject to public disclosure unless exempt under Fla. Stat. Chapter 119.07 or related statutes.
- 143d.Committee members and/or their company(ies) in which they may have a
direct financial interest, shall not do business with the School Board during the
members' term, in accordance with Fla. Stat. § 112.313 and pertinent145Opinions of the Florida Commission on Ethics.
