5-N I recommend that the Board approve development of the proposed revised Policy 2.06, entitled "School Visitation."

Development CONSENT ITEM

- This revised policy provides guidelines for visitors or any person who is not an employee of the School District that enters a school campus by providing (See paragraph 3):
 - All visitors to report to the school's office to sign-in , obtain permission and to secure a visitor's pass.
 - Non-enrolled students, without parents, to obtain approval for school visit.
 - No interference with or disruption in the school's operation during the visit.
 - No loitering in or around school premises, or presence on school premises without legitimate reasons.
 - Agents, solicitors and sales persons are permitted to visit school premises only if for demonstrating materials or services used in the educational setting.
 - Prohibiting political activities or campaigning on school campuses or facilities.
- The term "visitor" is defined to include parents, volunteers, business partners, community members, public officials, news media, salespersons or any non-District employees. See paragraph 3.
- This revision also updates statutory references.

2 3 4	1.	Purpose The purpose of this policy is to provide guidelines for visitors or any person who is not an employee of the School District that enters a school campus.

6 7		a. <u>This policy applies to all visitors or any person who is not an employee of the</u> <u>School District.</u>
8 9		b. <u>This policy does not apply to routine deliveries or scheduled maintenance</u> <u>visits.</u>

Policy The Palm Beach County School Board welcomes visits by parents and guardians in schools, especially if prearranged and for the purpose of conferences with teachers. Patrons Any visitor, which for the purpose of this policy shall mean, parents, volunteers, business partners, community members, public officials, professional representatives of the press news media, salespersons or any other non-School District employee, shall report to the principal's office to explain the purpose of and get permission for the visit, sign-in and to receive a visitor's pass/badge. All visitors shall be welcomed, treated with dignity and respect and be allowed to express their concerns and/or questions to the appropriate person. a. All visitors entering a school campus must report to the school's office to signing and evelope of and permission for the permission for the visit. All visitors will
20 21		in and explain the purpose of, and get permission for, the visit. All visitors will be issued a visitor's pass.
22 23 24 25		b. Any request for visitation shall be made to the principal of the school to be visited and be arranged prior to the visit. Any visitation upon which the principal has a question shall be referred to the superintendent's office, appropriate Area Superintendent, or to the <u>Chief PP</u> ublic iInformation office.
26 27		c. <u>Visits by a non-enrolled student unaccompanied by his/her parent(s) are</u> prohibited unless prior approval has been granted by the principal.
28 29 30		d. <u>Parents/guardians are invited to visit the schools</u> . <u>To avoid interrupting the</u> <u>school's daily schedule, the parents should request a conference as noted in</u> <u>the Student and Family Handbook</u> .
31 32		e. There shall be no interference in <u>or disruption to</u> the operation of the school or undue interruption <u>or disruption</u> in classroom procedure.

33 34 35 36		i. <u>Any visitor who is disruptive, threatening or abusive shall be asked to</u> relocate to a location in the school where no students are present and where school personnel can discuss and resolve the matter in a professional manner.
37		ii. Loitering in and around school premises is prohibited.
38 39 40 41		iii. <u>Any visitor who enters or remains on District property without legitimate</u> <u>purpose may be found to be trespassing and, therefore, in violation of</u> <u>Florida Statutes and subject to arrest and penalties as defined by</u> <u>statutes.</u>
42 43 44 45		iv. Except as may be approved in advance by the principal and the teacher, parental observation in the classroom is not permitted in order to protect the privacy of the other students and to avoid the disruption of the instructional process.

Visitation by persons with legal authority, such as School Police, law enforcement or Department of Children and Families personnel, are the only persons allowed to interrogate and/or question a student on School Board property without the consent of the student's parent(s) or guardian(s).
50 51 52	g.	Visitors that are agents, solicitors or salespersons may only come on school premises if the visits are for demonstrating materials or services used in an educational setting.
53 54		i. <u>The principal, after determining the purpose of the visit, shall have the</u> <u>sole discretion to permit visits</u> by agents, solicitors and salespersons.
55 56		ii. <u>Agents, solicitors and salespersons shall sign in at the school's main</u> office upon arrival.
57 58		iii. <u>The principal shall prohibit all other forms of canvassing or soliciting of</u> teachers or students on school premises during school hours.
59 60 61 62 63	h.	Visits from elected officials, candidates for national office, representatives of the United States executive branch, Florida government officials, elected officials representing local constituencies and/or spouses of all of the aforementioned must be cleared by the Superintendent via the Department of Public Affairs.
64 65 66		i. <u>Once cleared by the Superintendent, the Principal and/or Department of</u> <u>Public Affairs will contact the appropriate Area Superintendent's office to</u> <u>coordinate the visit.</u>
67		ii. Political activities and/or campaigning by candidates are prohibited on

68	school campuses or in School District facilities. This includes the
69	distribution of campaign materials, displayed posters, or other
70	paraphernalia, including the presence of a candidate on campus for
71	campaign purposes. The only exception is when a recognized group
72	rents a facility after school hours or, when on Election Day, the School
73	District follows the county election law regarding voting polls located at
74	many Palm Beach County schools.
