Adoption

CONSENT ITEM

- The Board approved development of this revised Policy at the development reading on May 6, 2009.
- This revision provides guidelines for the establishment of bus routes and schedules for students to ensure safety, economy and efficiency.
- This revision provides a listing of factors to be considered by the Director of Transportation for the location of bus stops. The Superintendent approves the location of bus stops recommended by the Director of Transportation.
 - Bus stops for students needing accommodations are determined in accordance with the students' IEP and 504 Plan.
- The revision enables the Director of Transportation to change bus routes and stops for good cause. Good cause does not include a change for individual or personal needs or arbitrary or capricious reasons.
- The Board must designate non-transportation zones where services are unnecessary or impracticable, after the recommendation of the Superintendent.
- Buses are stored in accordance with policies set by the Director of Transportation. The personal use of buses by drivers is prohibited.
- The revisions require the Transportation Department to annually evaluate bus stops and routes, and to conduct periodic evaluations of stops and routes as deemed necessary.

personal/individual needs or decisions that are made in an arbitrary and
capricious manner.
- b. <u>Prohibition Against Driver Changes.</u> School bus drivers shall not discontinue
 <u>stops, begin new stops, or otherwise change a route without prior approval of</u>
 <u>the Director of Transportation.</u>
- 79 Non-Transportation Zones. -- The School Board shall designate, by map or 6. 80 otherwise, non-transportation zones based on the Superintendent's 81 recommendations. Such zones shall represent areas in the District where 82 transportation services are unnecessary or impracticable. Non-transportation 83 zones shall be designated by the Board annually prior to the opening of schools and prior to the designation of bus routes for the ensuing school year. 84
- 85 7. Bus Accidents. -- An accident report shall be prepared immediately after an accident involving a bus or school passenger. The Director of Transportation shall insure the appropriate forms are completed and filed in accordance with Florida Statutes, State Board of Education Rules, and School Board policy.
- 8. Bus Storage. -- Drivers shall park buses where designated by the Director of Transportation and under no condition will any driver vary from the parking area designated. When the driver parks his bus at the end of the run, it shall not be opened for the public to use in any way. Under no conditions shall the bus be used for a personal or private purpose.
- 949.Bus Route and Bus Stop Evaluations. -- School bus routes and safety of pupils
at bus stops shall be reviewed at least once each year (or prior to the beginning of
each school year) by the Department of Transportation. Periodic evaluations of
school bus routes and the safety of students at bus stops shall be conducted by the
Department of Transportation as deemed necessary by the Director of
Transportation or the Superintendent.
