## **CONSENT ITEM**

- The purpose of this policy is to provide for the emergency evacuation drills and procedures, for actual emergencies, including, but not limited to fires, natural disasters, and bomb threats for all Palm Beach County public schools, including the scheduling, in accordance with Sections 1001.43(7) and 1006.07(4), Fla. Stat. and other laws.
- The Superintendent or designee shall ensure schools have implemented procedures for the handling of school emergencies, which include a plan for the prompt and safe evacuation of the schools and safe dispersal of students from School Board property which shall be practiced in such emergency drills conducted in accordance with law.
- The superintendent or designee shall annually review and communicate to schools/departments procedures for fire exit or emergency evacuation drills and other hazard precautionary measures as applicable.
