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POLICY 5.183

5-C I recommend that the Board approve development of the proposed revised Policy 5.183, entitled "Cellular Telephones and Other Wireless Communications Devices."

Development CONSENT ITEM

- This policy is to implement the provisions of Section 1006.07(2) (f), Florida Statutes, which permits students to possess wireless communications devices on school property and authorizes the School Board to regulate the possession and use of such devices.
- The amended policy provides that students may possess cellular phones and wireless communication devices on school property and school-sponsored transportation, provided such devices are not visible, used or activated and are kept in the "off" position throughout the instructional school day and while on school-sponsored transportation. Students are required to keep their phones stored in a vehicle, locker, purse, backpack, or other non-visible secure location during the day and while on school transportation. See Sec.
 3. A definition is provided for instructional school day. See Sec. 2c.
- An exception to the above provision is provided to high schools, if High School Principals desire to modify the instructional school day and establish times of authorized use of wireless communication devices for high school students for time periods in addition to when students are waiting for the beginning of the instructional school day or waiting for a school bus at the end of the instructional school day, including the designation of areas of the school campus for use of such devices. If the Principal modifies the instructional day to authorize more time for usage, the Principal is required to provide notice to students and parents. See Sec. 3c.
- For elementary and middle schools, the policy provides the times of authorized uses of cell phones to be while waiting for the beginning of the instructional school day or waiting for a school bus at the end of the instructional school day. See 3(a)(i) and 3(b)(i).
- Section 4 of the policy outlines unauthorized uses of wireless devices to include but not be limited to matters as:
 - Interference with or disruption of the instructional or educational environment.

- Use which violates academic integrity, as the reproduction of images of tests, communication of test or examination contents or answers, to provide access to unauthorized school information, or assistance to students in any aspect of their instructional program in a manner that violates school board policy or the Student Code of Conduct.
- The communication of the marks or grades assigned to students resulting from evaluation or the actual contents, or parts thereof, of any evaluation activity being completed by an individual(s).
- Use to commit a crime, under federal or state law.
- Violation of a student's or other person's reasonable expectation of privacy, by using such devices with photographic capabilities in student locker-rooms, restrooms, any other student changing areas, or the classroom, whether such use occurs during the instructional school day or on school property.
- Use in a manner that is profane, indecent, obscene, threatening, discriminatory, bullying or harassing language, pictures or gestures. Cellular phones which have the capability to take "photographs" or "moving pictures" shall not be used for such purposes while on School property, while on school-sponsored transportation or while a student is engaged in school-sponsored activities.
- The amended policy provides for other acceptable uses of wireless devices for:
 - Instructional or educational purposes.
 - o IEP, 504, or Health Care/Medical Plan.
 - Health, Safety or Emergency Reasons
 - School Trips or School Sponsored Activities
 - o Other Reasons as determined by the Principal.

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POLICY 5.183

1 CELLULAR TELEPHONES AND OTHER WIRELESS COMMUNICATIONS DEVICES

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- 3 1. Purpose. The School Board is committed to providing a safe, positive and 4 productive learning environment for its students. The School Board recognizes 5 that, depending on how they are used, cellular phones and wireless communication 6 devices can be either a valuable learning tool or a source of disruption in the 7 learning environment. This policy is to implement the provisions of Section 8 1006.07(2)(f), Florida Statutes, which permits students to possess wireless 9 communications devices on school property and authorizes the School Board to 10 regulate the possession and use of such devices. In order to maintain a secure and orderly learning environment, student use and possession of wireless 11 12 communication devices shall be subject to the limitations as set forth in this policy. 13 For ease of reference, this Policy updates and expands upon existing portions of 14 Policies 5.1812 and 5.1813 concerning wireless communications devices, to clarify that students may possess wireless communications devices as allowed by Fla. 15 16 Stat. § 1006.07(2) (e), (except for camera phones), but students shall not use or 17 display such devices at any time on school property, at a school function, or on **District transportation.** 18
- 19 2. **Definitions**. As used herein, the terms below are defined as follows:
- "Wireless communications device" means a handheld electronic device having 20 a. 21 the ability to receive and/or transmit voice, text, or data messages without a cable connection, such may include, but is not limited to, as cellular 22 23 telephones, digital wireless phones, radio-phones/walkie-talkies, telephone 24 pagers, PDA phones (personal digital assistants with wireless communications 25 capabilities), I Phones, or RIM ("research in motion") wireless devices. This definition also will include any current or emerging wireless handheld 26 technologies or portable information technology systems developed for similar 27 Excluded from this definition is any device with communication 28 purposes. capabilities that has been approved for instructional purposes. 29
- 30 "School property" means any school center, bus, facility, including grounds b. owned or occupied by the School Board. The definition includes the location 31 32 of a School District sponsored activity as well as transportation provided by the School District to attend a School District sponsored activity. School property 33 34 excludes a mass transit system, such as Palm Tran, and any student utilizing 35 such services is expected to abide by the rules of the carrier. "Camera phone" means any cellular phone (or other wireless communications device) capable 36 37 of taking digital photographs.
- 38 "Instructional school day" means the moment a student enters the school C.

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- 39center until the final dismissal bell. The "instructional school day" includes, but40is not limited to, study halls, lunch break, class changes and any other41structured or non-structured instructional activity that occurs during the normal42school day, including the administration of examinations, and regardless of43whether a student is on campus or at an off-campus curriculum-related school44sponsored-activity.
- 45 3. Policy Statement. In accordance with state law, students may possess cellular phones and wireless communication devices on school property and 46 47 school-sponsored transportation, as long as students adhere to the restrictions 48 provided herein. Any unauthorized use of wireless devices during the instructional 49 school day, while on school sponsored transportation, or at such times as not 50 authorized by the school principal or designee, is prohibited as it disrupts the 51 instructional program or distracts from the educational environment.
- 52 a. Elementary School Students. Elementary school students may possess 53 cellular phones and wireless communication devices on school property and 54 school-sponsored transportation, provided such devices are not visible, used 55 or activated and are kept in the "off" position throughout the instructional 56 school day and while on school-sponsored transportation. Students must keep 57 their wireless communication devices stored in a vehicle, locker, purse, 58 backpack, or other non-visible secure location during the instructional school 59 day and while on school-sponsored transportation.
- i. <u>Times of Authorized Use on Elementary School Grounds</u>. While waiting
 for the beginning of the instructional school day or waiting for a school
 bus at the end of the instructional school day.
- 63 Middle School Students. Middle school students may possess cellular phones b. and wireless communication devices on school property and school-64 sponsored transportation, provided such devices are not visible, used or 65 66 activated and are kept in the "off" position throughout the instructional school 67 day and while on school-sponsored transportation. Students must keep their 68 wireless communication devices stored in a vehicle, locker, purse, backpack, 69 or other non-visible secure location during the instructional school day and 70 while on school-sponsored transportation.
- 71 i. <u>Times of Authorized Use on Middle School Grounds</u>. While waiting for
 72 <u>the beginning of the instructional school day or waiting for a school bus at</u>
 73 <u>the end of the instructional school day</u>.
- c. <u>High School Students.</u> High school students may possess cellular phones and wireless communication devices on school property and schoolsponsored transportation, provided such wireless communication devices are not visible, used or activated and are kept in the "off" position throughout the

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- 78 instructional school day, and while on school-sponsored transportation. 79 However, Principals have the discretion to modify the instructional school day 80 and establish times of authorized use of wireless communication devices for high school students for time periods in addition to when students are waiting 81 82 for the beginning of the instructional school day or waiting for a school bus at 83 the end of the instructional school day, including the designation of areas of the school campus for use of such devices. Otherwise, high school students 84 85 must keep their wireless communication devices stored in a vehicle, locker, purse, backpack, or other non-visible secure location. 86 87 i. Communication to Students and Parents. If the Principal modifies the
- instructional school day to permit high school students to use cell phones
 or wireless communication devices at times other than when students are
 waiting for the beginning of the instructional school day or waiting for a
 school bus at the end of the instructional school day, the Principal shall
 include such information in the school's student/parent handbook and
 other communications to parents/students.

Restrictions

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- 95 a. Students shall not possess, display, or use a wireless communication device
 96 (a camera phone) at any time on school grounds or during any school-sponsored
 97 program or activity, including school transportation.
- b. Although students may possess wireless communications devices pursuant to
 Fla Stat. § 1006.07(2)(e), s Students must abide by section (4)(a)(iii)(G) of Policies
 5.1812 and 5.1813, "if students possess a cellular phone [or other wireless
 communications device], it should be turned off and kept inside a book bag, purse,
 or similar container, and it may not be used (and may not be allowed to emit any
 ringtone or other noise) on school grounds or during any school-sponsored
 program or activity, including school transportation."
- 4. <u>Unauthorized Use of Devices.</u> A student's possession, display or use of a wireless communication device on School property contrary to the provisions of this policy shall be viewed as the unauthorized use of wireless devices when such possession, display or use of such devices results in conduct which includes, but is not limited to:
- a. <u>Interference with or disruption of the instructional or educational environment.</u>
- 111b.Use which violates academic integrity, as the reproduction of images of tests,
communication of test or examination contents or answers, to provide access
to unauthorized school information, or assistance to students in any aspect of
their instructional program in a manner that violates school board policy or the
Student Code of Conduct.
- 116 c. <u>The communication of the marks or grades assigned to students resulting from</u>

- 117evaluation or the actual contents, or parts thereof, of any evaluation activity118being completed by an individual(s).
- 119 d. <u>Use to commit a crime, under federal or state law.</u>
- e. <u>Violation of a student's or other person's reasonable expectation of privacy, by</u>
 using such devices with photographic capabilities in student locker-rooms,
 restrooms, any other student changing areas, or the classroom, whether such
 use occurs during the instructional school day or on school property.
- 124f.Use in a manner that is profane, indecent, obscene, threatening,125discriminatory, bullying or harassing language, pictures or gestures. Cellular126phones which have the capability to take "photographs" or "moving pictures"127shall not be used for such purposes while on School property, while on school-128sponsored transportation or while a student is engaged in school-sponsored129activities.
- 130 5. Other Acceptable Uses. The requirement that cell phones or wireless
 131 communication devices be turned off shall not apply in the following circumstances.
- 132a.Instructional or Educational Purposes.Cell phones or wireless133communication devices may be used during a class period or school activity134when specifically approved by the Principal in conjunction with educationally135appropriate objectives.
- b. <u>IEP, 504, or Health Care/Medical Plan.</u> Students may use electronic devices during class time when authorized pursuant to an Individual Education Plan (IEP), a Section 504 Accommodation Plan, or a Health Care/Medical Plan with supportive documentation from the student's physician.
- c. <u>Health, Safety or Emergency Reasons</u>. Exceptions to the restrictions in this
 policy, in part or in its entirety, may be made for health, safety and emergency
 reasons by the Principal.
- 143d.School Trips or School Sponsored Activities. The use, display or activation of
cell phones or wireless communication devices during school trips or school
sponsored activities shall be at the discretion of the Principal or designee, but
shall not be disruptive to the activity.
- 147 e. <u>Other Reasons.</u> Other reasons determined appropriate by the Principal.
- 148 6. **4.** Consequences.
- 149a.An offense shall occur each time this policy is violated regardless of the
specific device or devices involved. However, the possession of multiple
devices at one time shall be regarded as one offense.
