## **POLICY 5.183**

**5-B** I recommend that the Board approve development of the proposed revised Policy 5.183, entitled "Cellular Telephones and Other Wireless Communication Devices."

#### **Development**

## CONSENT ITEM

- This policy is to implement the provisions of Section 1006.07(2) (f), Florida Statutes, which permits students to possess wireless communication devices on school property and authorizes the School Board to regulate the possession and use of such devices.
- The amended policy provides that students may possess cellular phones and wireless communication devices on school property and school-sponsored transportation, provided such devices are not visible, used, or activated, and are kept in the "off" position throughout the instructional school day and while on school-sponsored transportation. Students are required to keep their phones stored in a vehicle, locker, purse, backpack, or other non-visible secure location during the day and while on school-sponsored transportation. See Sec. 3. A definition is provided for instructional school day. See Sec. 2c.
- An exception to the above provision is provided to middle and high schools. Middle and High School Principals may modify the instructional school day and authorize use of wireless communication devices for additional time periods. See Sec. 3b and c.
- For elementary and middle schools, wireless communication devices may be used while waiting for the beginning of the instructional school day or waiting for a school bus at the end of the instructional school day. See 3(a)(i).
- Section 4 of the policy outlines unauthorized uses of wireless devices to include, but not be limited to, matters as:
  - Interference with or disruption of the instructional or educational environment.
  - Use which violate academic integrity, as the reproduction of images of tests, communication of test or examination contents or answers, to provide access to unauthorized school information, or assistance to students in any aspect of their instructional program in a manner that

violates school board policy or the Student Code of Conduct.

- The communication of the marks or grades assigned to students resulting from evaluation or the actual contents, or parts thereof, of any evaluation activity being completed by an individual(s).
- o Use to commit a crime, under federal or state law.
- Violation of a student's or other person's reasonable expectation of privacy, by using such devices with photographic capabilities in student locker-rooms, restrooms, any other student changing areas, or the classroom, whether such use occurs during the instructional school day or on school property.
- Use in a manner that is profane, indecent, obscene, threatening, discriminatory, bullying or harassing language, pictures or gestures. Cellular phones which have the capability to take "photographs" or "moving pictures" shall not be used for such purposes while on school property, while on school-sponsored transportation, or while a student is engaged in school-sponsored activities.
- The amended policy, in Section 5, provides for other acceptable uses of wireless devices for:
  - Instructional or educational purposes
  - o IEP, 504, or Health Care/Medical Plan
  - Health, Safety or Emergency Reasons
  - School Trips or School Sponsored Activities
  - Other Reasons as determined by the Principal

#### **POLICY 5.183**

## 1 CELLULAR TELEPHONES AND OTHER WIRELESS COMMUNICATION DEVICES

## 1. Purpose

4 The School Board of Palm Beach County (Board) is committed to providing a safe, 5 positive and productive learning environment for its students. The Board recognizes that, depending on how they are used, cellular phones and other 6 7 wireless communication devices can be either a valuable learning tool or a source 8 of disruption in the learning environment. This policy is to implement the 9 provisions of Section 1006.07(2)(f), Florida Statutes, which permits students to 10 possess cellular phones and other wireless communication devices on school 11 property and authorizes the Board to regulate the possession and use of such 12 devices. In order to maintain a secure and orderly learning environment, student use and possession of cellular phones and other wireless communication devices 13 14 shall be subject to the limitations as set forth in this policy. For ease of reference, this Policy updates and expands upon existing portions of Policies 5.1812 and 15 16 5.1813 concerning wireless communications devices, to clarify that students may possess wireless communications devices as allowed by Fla. Stat. § 1006.07(2) 17 18 (e), (except for camera phones), but students shall not use or display such devices 19 at any time on school property, at a school function, or on District transportation.

## 20 2. **Definitions**.

- 21 As used herein, the terms below are defined as follows:
- 22 "Wireless communications device" means a handheld electronic device having a. 23 the ability to receive and/or transmit voice, text, or data messages without a 24 cable connection, such may include, but is not limited to, as cellular telephones, digital wireless phones, radio-phones/walkie-talkies, telephone 25 pagers, PDA phones (personal digital assistants with wireless communications 26 27 capabilities), iPhones, iPads, iPods, or RIM ("research in motion") wireless devices. This definition also includes any current or emerging wireless 28 handheld technologies or portable information technology systems developed 29 30 for similar purposes.
- 31b."School property" means any school center, bus, facility, including grounds32owned or occupied by the Board. The definition includes the location of a33School District sponsored activity as well as transportation provided by the34School District to attend a School District sponsored activity. School property35excludes a mass transit system, such as Palm Tran, and any student utilizing36such services is expected to abide by the rules of the carrier.

- 37 means any cellular phone (or other wireless communications device) capable
   38 of taking digital photographs.
- c. <u>"Instructional school day" means the moment a student enters the school</u>
   <u>center until the final dismissal bell. The "instructional school day" includes, but</u>
   is not limited to, study halls, lunch break, class changes and any other
   <u>structured or non-structured instructional activity that occurs during the normal</u>
   <u>school day, including the administration of examinations, and regardless of</u>
   whether a student is on campus or at an off-campus school-sponsored activity.
- d. <u>"Kept in the "off" position" means powered completely off and is not simply set</u>
   <u>on a vibrate, silent, standby, hibernation or airplane mode.</u>

# 47 3. Policy Statement

In accordance with state law, students may possess cellular phones and other wireless communication devices on school property and school-sponsored transportation, as long as the students adhere to the restrictions provided herein. Any unauthorized use of cellular phones and other wireless communication devices during the instructional school day, while on school-sponsored transportation, or at such times as not authorized by the school principal or designee, is prohibited as it disrupts the instructional program or distracts from the educational environment.

- 55 a. Elementary School Students. Elementary school students may possess cellular phones and other wireless communication devices on school property 56 57 and school-sponsored transportation, provided such devices are not visible, used, or activated, and are kept in the "off" position throughout the 58 59 instructional school day and while on school-sponsored transportation. 60 Students must keep their cellular phones and other wireless communication 61 devices stored in a purse or backpack, or other non-visible secure location 62 during the instructional school day and while on school-sponsored 63 transportation.
- i. <u>Times of Authorized Use on Elementary School Grounds</u>. While waiting
   for the beginning of the instructional school day or waiting for a school
   bus at the end of the instructional school day, students may use their
   cellular phones and other wireless communication devices.
- 68 b. Middle School Students. Middle school students may possess cellular phones 69 and other wireless communication devices on school property and schoolsponsored transportation, provided such cellular phones and other wireless 70 71 communication devices are not visible, used or activated, and are kept in the 72 "off" position throughout the instructional school day and while on schoolsponsored transportation. Middle school students must keep their cellular 73 phones and other wireless communication devices stored in a vehicle. locker. 74 02/08/2012 11:33 AM

- 88 C. *High School Students.* High school students may possess cellular phones and other wireless communication devices on school property and school-89 90 sponsored transportation, provided such cellular phones and other wireless communication devices are not visible, used or activated, and are kept in the 91 "off" position throughout the instructional school day and while on school-92 93 sponsored transportation. High school students must keep their cellular phones and other wireless communication devices stored in a vehicle, locker, 94 95 purse, backpack, or other non-visible secure location. High school principals 96 may modify the instructional school day to establish other authorized times of use in addition to when students are waiting for the beginning of the 97 98 instructional school day or waiting for a school bus at the end of the 99 instructional school day, including the designation of areas of the school 100 campus for such use.
- 101i.Communication to Students and Parents.If the principal modifies the<br/>instructional school day to permit high school students to use cellular<br/>phones or other wireless communication devices at times other than<br/>when students are waiting for the beginning of the instructional school<br/>day or waiting for a school bus at the end of the instructional school day.<br/>the principal shall include such information in the school's student/parent<br/>handbook and other communications to parents/students.
- 108 Restrictions
- 109a. Students shall not possess, display, or use a wireless communication110device (a camera phone) at any time on school grounds or during any111school-sponsored program or activity, including school transportation.

- 150 <u>Cellular phones and other wireless communication devices are permissible in the</u>
   151 <u>following circumstances:</u>
- 152a.Instructional or Educational Purposes.Cellular phones or wireless153communication devices may be used during a class period or school activity154when specifically approved by the principal in conjunction with educationally155appropriate objectives.
- 156b.IEP, 504, or Health Care/Medical Plan.Students may use cellular phones.157wireless communication devices and other electronic devices during class time158when authorized pursuant to an Individual Education Plan (IEP), a Section 504159Accommodation Plan, or a Health Care/Medical Plan with supportive160documentation from the student's physician.
- 161 c. <u>Health, Safety or Emergency Reasons</u>. Exceptions to the restrictions in this 162 policy, in part or in its entirety, may be made for health, safety and emergency 163 reasons by the principal.
- 164d.School Trips or School Sponsored Activities. The use, display or activation of165cellular phones or other wireless communication devices during school trips or166school sponsored activities shall be at the discretion of the principal or167designee, but shall not be disruptive to the activity.
- 168 e. <u>Other Reasons.</u> Other reasons determined appropriate by the principal.

# 169 6. **4- Consequences**-

- 170a.An offense shall occur each time this policy is violated regardless of the<br/>specific device or devices involved. However, the possession of multiple<br/>devices at one time shall be regarded as one offense.171172
- 173i.Any cellular phone or wireless communication device possessed or used<br/>in violation of this policy shall be confiscated by school personnel, absent<br/>compelling and unusual circumstances, and only returned to the student's<br/>parent or guardian or another adult designated by the parent or guardian.176parent or guardian or another adult designated by the parent or guardian.177If a cellular phone or wireless communication device is confiscated, the<br/>device shall be taken to the school's main office to be identified and<br/>placed in a secure area.
- 180ii.Students will be disciplined as provided for in Board Policies 5.1812 and1815.1813, as now or hereafter amended.
- 182b.The application of discipline for violations under this policy will be progressive<br/>except for those instances where there are additional aggravating factors as<br/>outlined in the non-exclusive listing in paragraph 4 of this policy. Any184outlined in the non-exclusive listing in paragraph 4 of this policy. Any

   additional aggravating factors may subject the student to more stringent

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   discipline consequences and /or reports to law enforcement agencies.
- 187 The following consequences may be imposed for violation of this Policy:
- 188a. As stated in section (4)(a)(iii)(G) of Policies 5.1812 and 5.1813, use or189display of a wireless communications device (other than a camera phone)190constitutes a display or use of an item that is "disruptive to the general191peace and welfare to a school center, school bus, or a school sponsored192activity" and consequences will be imposed accordingly.
- A student's possession or use of a camera phone on school grounds or during any school-sponsored program or activity, including school transportation, shall
- 195 constitute "possession and/or use of items or contraband designated by the school
- 196 as inappropriate materials" under Policy 5.1812 or 5.1813, section (4)(a)(iii)(H)
- 197 ("Prohibited Items, Non-Criminal") and consequences will be imposed accordingly.

# 198 7. <u>Responsibility/Liability</u>

- 199Any student who chooses to bring a cellular phone or other wireless200communication device to school shall do so at his or her own risk and shall be201personally responsible for the security of his or her cellular phone or wireless202communication device. Neither the school personnel or Board will assume any203responsibility or liability for loss, theft, damage or vandalism to a cellular phone or204other wireless communication device.205unauthorized use of any such device.
