Repeal-Adoption

CONSENT ITEM

- The Board approved development of this repeal of Policy at the repeal-development reading on August 8, 2012.
- This rule is being replaced by updated and modified Policy 5.1812 – Student Conduct Code for Elementary Students and Policy 5.1813 – Student Conduct Code for Secondary Students.

POLICY 5.18

STUDENT CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOR

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3 ~~1. The schools are established for the benefit of all students. The educational~~
4 ~~purposes of the schools are accomplished best in a climate of student behavior~~
5 ~~that is socially acceptable and conducive to the learning and teaching process.~~
6 ~~Student behavior that disrupts this process or that infringes upon the rights of other~~
7 ~~individuals will not be tolerated.~~

- 8 ~~2. The school board supports the administrative staff and teachers in taking all~~
9 ~~necessary and reasonable steps to enforce and implement all board policies and~~
10 ~~administrative directives to maintain appropriate student behavior. Important~~
11 ~~among these policies and directives are those in the areas of conduct, suspensions~~
12 ~~and expulsions, and enhancing the climate for learning.~~

- 13 ~~3. Policies inclusive of 5.18 through 5.1899 serve as the basis for the code governing~~
14 ~~student conduct and discipline and are applicable to all students except as required~~
15 ~~by law as to those students as stated within Section 4 below, under the jurisdiction~~
16 ~~of the School District of Palm Beach County. These policies shall constitute the~~
17 ~~Code of Elementary Student Conduct and Code of Secondary Student Conduct,~~
18 ~~which are incorporated as board policy pursuant to § 230.23(6)(d), Fla. Stat.~~
19 ~~Copies of these documents are on file in the board minutes office, the public affairs~~
20 ~~department, and shall be available in each school and area superintendent's office.~~

- 21 ~~4. The School Board of Palm Beach County recognizes that the code of student~~
22 ~~conduct must be construed to be consistent with the Individuals with Disability~~
23 ~~Education Act ("IDEA") and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act ("Section 504").~~
24 ~~Therefore, students eligible for services under IDEA or Section 504, will be~~
25 ~~disciplined in accordance with these Acts and are governed by those School Board~~
26 ~~policies which specify that they apply to students covered under IDEA and 504.~~

- 27 ~~5. The school board establishes guidelines for the conduct and discipline of students.~~
28 ~~The superintendent shall recommend, based on these policies, a Code of Student~~
29 ~~Conduct ("CSC") for elementary students and a Code of Student Conduct for~~
30 ~~secondary students for adoption annually by the school board. In accordance with~~
31 ~~§ 230.23(6)(d), F.S., the codes shall be distributed to all elementary or secondary~~
32 ~~teachers, school personnel, students, and parents or guardians and discussed at~~
33 ~~the beginning of every school year.~~

- 34 ~~6. The school board adopts these policies for the control, discipline, suspension, and~~
35 ~~expulsion of students, in accordance with § 230.23(6)(c) and (d), F.S.~~
 - 36 ~~a. Establishing policies and specific grounds for disciplinary action, including in-~~
37 ~~school suspension, expulsion, and any disciplinary action that may be~~

38 ~~imposed for the possession or use of alcohol on school property or while~~
39 ~~attending a school function or for the illegal use, sale, or possession of~~
40 ~~controlled substances, as defined in Chapter 893, F.S.~~

41 ~~b. Establishing procedures to be followed for acts requiring discipline and~~
42 ~~establishing procedures for the assignment of violent or disruptive students to~~
43 ~~an alternative educational program.~~

44 ~~c. Defining and explaining the responsibilities and rights of students with regard~~
45 ~~to attendance, respect for persons and property, knowledge and observation~~
46 ~~of rules of conduct, the right to learn, free speech and student publications,~~
47 ~~assembly, privacy, and participation in school programs and activities.~~

48 ~~7. In accordance with § 230.235, F.S., the board adopts a policy of zero tolerance for~~
49 ~~crime, substance abuse and the possession of a firearm.~~

50 ~~8. These policies recognize that pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 922(q)(1)(I)(2)(A) (The Gun-~~
51 ~~Free School Zones Act), "It shall be unlawful for any individual knowingly to~~
52 ~~possess a firearm . . . at a place that the individual knows, or has reasonable cause~~
53 ~~to believe, is a school zone"⁴ and 18 U.S.C. § 922(q)(3)(A) ". . . [I]t shall be~~
54 ~~unlawful for any person, knowingly or with reckless disregard for the safety of~~
55 ~~another, to discharge or attempt to discharge a firearm . . . at a place that the~~
56 ~~person knows is a school zone."~~

57 ~~9. These policies recognize that pursuant to § 893.13(1)(c), F.S. (The Drug Free~~
58 ~~School Zone), it shall be unlawful for any person to sell, manufacture, or deliver, or~~
59 ~~possess with intent to sell, manufacture, or deliver a controlled substance in, on, or~~
60 ~~within one thousand (1,000) feet of the real property comprising a child care facility~~
61 ~~as defined in § 402.302, F.S., or public or private elementary, middle, or secondary~~
62 ~~school, between the hours of 6 a.m. and 12 a.m.~~

63 ~~10. In addition, pursuant to §§ 230.23(6)(d)(4-8) & (10) & (11), F.S., notice is provided~~
64 ~~that:~~

65 ~~a. ". . . [P]ossession of a firearm, a knife, or a weapon, by any~~
66 ~~student while the student is on school property or in attendance at a school~~
67 ~~function is grounds for disciplinary action and may also result in criminal~~
68 ~~prosecution."~~

69 ~~b. "[A]ny student who is determined to have brought a firearm...to school, to any~~
70 ~~school function, or on to any school-sponsored transportation will be expelled,~~
71 ~~with or without continuing educational services, from the student's regular~~
72 ~~school for a period of not less than one (1) full year and referred for criminal~~
73 ~~prosecution."~~

74 ~~c. ". . . [I]llegal use, possession, or sale of controlled substances, as defined in~~

75 Chapter 893, or possession of electronic telephone pagers, by any student
76 while such student is upon school property or in attendance at a school
77 function is grounds for disciplinary action by the school and may also result in
78 criminal penalties being imposed."

79 d. ~~" . . . [V]iolence against any school district personnel by a student is grounds~~
80 ~~for in-school suspension, out-of-school suspension, expulsion, or imposition of~~
81 ~~other disciplinary action by the school and may also result in criminal penalties~~
82 ~~being imposed."~~

83 e. ~~" . . . [V]iolation of district school board transportation policies, including~~
84 ~~disruptive behavior on a school bus or at a school bus stop, by a student is~~
85 ~~grounds for suspension of the student's privilege of riding on a school bus and~~
86 ~~may be grounds for disciplinary action by the school and may also result in~~
87 ~~criminal penalties being imposed."~~

88 f. ~~" . . . [V]iolation of the district school board's sexual harassment policy by a~~
89 ~~student is grounds for in-school suspension, out-of-school suspension,~~
90 ~~expulsion, or imposition of other disciplinary action by the school and may also~~
91 ~~result in criminal penalties being imposed."~~

92 g. ~~" . . . [A]ny student who is determined to have made a threat or false report, as~~
93 ~~defined by §§ 790.162 and 790.163, [F.S.], respectively, involving school or~~
94 ~~school personnel's property, school transportation, or a school-sponsored~~
95 ~~activity will be expelled, with or without continuing educational services, from~~
96 ~~the student's regular school for a period of not less than 1 full year and~~
97 ~~referred for criminal prosecution."~~

98 11. ~~To the extent that any definition, recommended disciplinary action or any provision~~
99 ~~in the policies serving as the basis for code governing student conduct are contrary~~
100 ~~to state law or state board of education rule, the law or state board rule shall~~
101 ~~control.~~

102 12. ~~Grievance Against Schools~~

103 a. ~~Students, parents, or guardians are required to follow the district's established~~
104 ~~procedure for addressing grievances against the school.~~


105 b. ~~The superintendent shall establish procedures by which students and parents~~
106 ~~may present grievances to appropriate school authorities. Grievances~~
107 ~~associated with student boycotts, walkouts and sit-ins must be presented by~~
108 ~~the parents themselves rather than by students.~~

109 ⁴~~The term "school zone" means in or on the grounds of a public, parochial or~~
110 ~~private school; or within a distance of one thousand (1,000) feet from the grounds~~
111 ~~of a public, parochial or private school.~~


