### **Development**

### **CONSENT ITEM**

- The revised policy is amended to include the following:
  - The policy’s application to students and their participation in competitive and noncompetitive local, state, national, or international events (See lines 13- 19);
  - A definition of extracurricular activity consistent with state law (See lines 17-19);
  - A prohibition against the providing of extracurricular activities based on any actual or perceived characteristic(s) listed as a prohibited category of discrimination by state or federal law, etc. (See lines 32-56);
  - General eligibility requirements for students to participate in extracurricular and interscholastic athletic activities (See lines 113-135);
  - Eligibility to participate in middle school interscholastic athletic activities (See lines 137-196);
  - Eligibility to participate in high school interscholastic athletic activities (See lines 197-260);
  - Participation of home education, charter school, and virtual education students in extracurricular activities as required by state law (See lines 312-341);
  - Responsibilities for principals, assistant superintendent of curriculum and learning support, and the superintendent related to extracurricular activities (See lines 353-359); and
  - A prohibition of staff recruiting students from another school for any extracurricular activity, including interscholastic athletics (See lines 343-351).

- The proposed policy is amended to delete the following provisions:
  - An annual survey by elementary school principals (See lines 59-64);
  - An annual survey by middle school principals of ten (10) extracurricular activities as designated by the superintendent (See lines 68-73);
  - An annual survey by high school principals of ten (10) extracurricular activities as designated by the superintendent (See lines 75-80);
  - Date for submission of the surveys to area superintendents (See lines 81-83);
  - Date for submission of reports to superintendent, with action plan to remove any barriers to diversity in student and staff (See lines 84-90); and
  - Date for superintendent's report to Board on extracurricular activities, with data on staff, participation and barriers, and recommendations (See lines 91-112).

## POLICY 5.60

### ELIGIBILITY FOR PARTICIPATION IN K-12 EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

#### 1. ~~Purpose~~

~~Pursuant to Fla. Stat. § 1001.43(3) (c), the Board may adopt policies providing for extracurricular activities, which include interscholastic programs. This policy is to provide guidelines for student participation in extracurricular and interscholastic athletic activities. Extracurricular activities are intended to supplement the regular curriculum of the school and to provide enrichment opportunities for students. As important as extracurricular activities are for growth and development of each student, they must remain supplemental to the student's learning and mastery of the basic skills in the regular curriculum.~~

#### 2. Scope

This policy applies to all District students and their participation in extracurricular activities, competitive and non-competitive, at local, state, national, or international events.

#### 3. Definition

Extracurricular activity means any school-authorized or education-related activity occurring during or outside the regular instructional school day, as defined by Fla. Stat. § 1006.15(2).

#### 4. Policy Statement

The Board recognizes that extracurricular activities promote a positive school climate and constitute an integral component of the student's educational experience. Extracurricular activities are intended to supplement the regular curriculum of the school and to provide enrichment opportunities for students. As important as extracurricular activities are for growth and development of each student, they must remain supplemental to the student's learning and mastery of the basic skills in the regular curriculum.

Whenever or wherever held, when conducted under the name of a District school, the District, or any class or organization thereof, extracurricular activities shall be under the supervision of school authorities, and all applicable District and school policies and regulations shall apply.

#### ~~5.2~~ Equitable Participation

No extracurricular activity shall be provided or conducted separately on the basis of any actual or perceived characteristics listed as a prohibited category of

35 discrimination in state or federal law, nor shall any student's participation in an  
36 extracurricular activity be required or refused on those bases.

- 37 a. ~~4.~~ Principals shall select faculty advisors, directors, coaches, sponsors,  
38 and staff who are diverse in racial, ethnic, and gender composition.
- 39 b. ~~2.~~ Students shall not be excluded from, nor denied positions of leadership  
40 in any extracurricular activity due to race, color, religion, sex, ethnicity,  
41 national origin, age, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression,  
42 genetic information, marital status, parental status, disability, limited  
43 English proficiency, or any other characteristic protected by law.
- 44 c. ~~3.~~ In general, students shall not be denied participation in any activity  
45 because of inability to pay for expenses/fees, materials or uniforms related  
46 to the activity; however, students may be required to pay for athletic  
47 insurance as a prerequisite to participation in extracurricular activities, and  
48 donors such as booster clubs may be encouraged to assist with insurance  
49 expenses for students who have difficulty covering the cost of such  
50 athletic insurance.
- 51 d. ~~4.~~ Pursuant to Fla. Stat. § 1006.28(3)(b) and Policy [8.1225](#), a student will  
52 be suspended from participation in extracurricular activities while owing an  
53 obligation after reasonable collection efforts by the principal for lost,  
54 destroyed, or unnecessarily-damaged instructional materials, unless the  
55 student elects to perform community service hours to satisfy the obligation  
56 pursuant to Policy [8.1225](#).

57 ~~a. The Superintendent or designee shall monitor fair and equitable~~  
58 ~~access to extracurricular activities for all students as follows:~~

59 ~~b. Students in Grades K-5. Elementary school principals will annually~~  
60 ~~complete a survey of extracurricular activities (instructional and non-~~  
61 ~~instructional). This survey will be disaggregated by total number of~~  
62 ~~participants, participants with Exceptional Student Education (ESE),~~  
63 ~~Limited English Proficient (LEP) students, sex, and race (African-~~  
64 ~~American, Hispanic, White and Other).~~

65 ~~c. Students in Grades 6-8. The Superintendent shall establish~~  
66 ~~procedures to ensure that the eligibility Bylaws of the Palm Beach~~  
67 ~~County Middle School Activities Association ("PBCMSAA") are~~  
68 ~~enforced. The middle school principals will annually complete a survey~~  
69 ~~of ten extracurricular activities (instructional and non-instructional)~~

71 ~~by number of participants, participants with Exceptional Student~~  
72 ~~Education (ESE), Limited English Proficient (LEP) students, sex, and~~

74 ~~d. Students in Grades 9-12. The eligibility Bylaws of the Florida High~~  
75 ~~School Activities Association ("FHSA") shall be enforced. The high~~  
76 ~~school principals will annually complete a survey of ten (10)~~  
77 ~~extracurricular activities (instructional and non-instructional) designated~~  
78 ~~by the Superintendent. This survey will be disaggregated by number of~~  
79 ~~participants, sex, and race (African American, Hispanic, White and~~  
80 ~~Other).~~

81 ~~Each school's survey will be submitted by May 30 to the appropriate~~  
82 ~~Area Superintendent, based on data from the Student Activity Screen~~  
83 ~~(A-26).~~

84 ~~e. By June 15 of each school year, Area Superintendents will submit~~  
85 ~~the survey results to the Superintendent, along with a written action~~  
86 ~~plan for removing any apparent barriers to diversity in staff and~~  
87 ~~student participation in extracurricular activities. If the level of~~  
88 ~~participation of any such category of students is substantially~~  
89 ~~different from the enrollment proportion of that category, it should~~  
90 ~~be supportable by a nondiscriminatory explanation.~~

91 ~~f. By June 30 of each year, the Superintendent shall submit a report~~  
92 ~~consistent with SBER 6A 19.004 to the Board regarding~~  
93 ~~participation in extracurricular activities at the elementary, middle,~~  
94 ~~and senior high school levels. This report shall be based on the~~  
95 ~~Area Superintendent's reports and data and include:~~

96 ~~i. District wide and individual school information regarding data~~  
97 ~~on faculty advisors, directors, coaches, and sponsors by~~  
98 ~~race, national origin, sex, LEP, and ESE;~~

99 ~~ii. Data on participation in selected activities by race, national~~  
100 ~~origin, sex, LEP, and ESE;~~

101 ~~iii. Identification of any barriers regarding equitable selection of~~  
102 ~~diverse faculty advisors, directors, coaches, and sponsors;~~

- 103 ~~iv. Identification of any barriers to equitable participation in~~
- 104 ~~extracurricular activities by students of diverse populations;~~
- 105 ~~v. Identification of any inequities in extracurricular activities~~
- 106 ~~offered at schools;~~
- 107 ~~vi. Recommendations for removing any barrier to equitable~~
- 108 ~~student participation in extracurricular activities;~~
- 109 ~~vii. Recommendations for removing any inequity regarding~~
- 110 ~~extracurricular activities offered at schools; and~~
- 111 ~~viii. Recommendations for ensuring diversity of faculty advisors,~~
- 112 ~~directors, coaches, and sponsors.~~

113 **6. General Eligibility Requirements for Extracurricular and Interscholastic**

114 **Athletic Activities**

- 115 a. A student may ONLY participate in extracurricular activities, excluding
- 116 interscholastic high school athletics, sponsored by the school in which
- 117 they are assigned.
- 118 b. A high school student is eligible to participate in interscholastic athletic
- 119 activities consistent with Fla. Stat. §§ 1002.20(17) and 1006.20(2)(a), and
- 120 the Bylaws of FHSAA.
- 121 c. Each principal is responsible for ensuring that each participant in an
- 122 extracurricular and interscholastic athletic program is a **bona fide** student
- 123 at his or her school.
- 124 d. Principals shall annually review reassignments or transfers.
- 125 e. Any student, who is found to have falsified eligibility information, including
- 126 his or her address in order to attend a school, shall be deemed ineligible
- 127 to compete in any public school within the District for one calendar year
- 128 from the date the falsification is discovered. The incident will be
- 129 documented.
- 130 f. The superintendent, area superintendent, principal, coach, or activity
- 131 sponsor may raise questions of a student's interscholastic athletic
- 132 eligibility at any time. Any question of eligibility shall be presented to the
- 133 principal of the school where the student's eligibility is being questioned.
- 134 g. Any student participating in extracurricular activities must have his or her
- 135 participation noted in the District's student data system.

136 7. **Eligibility for Participation in Interscholastic Athletic Activities**

137 a. ~~3.~~ ***Scholastic Eligibility in Middle School.*** In accordance ~~As stated in the~~  
138 ~~Student Progression Plan and consistent with the Bylaws of the Palm Beach~~  
139 ~~County Middle School Athletic Association (PBCMSAA),~~ the scholastic eligibility  
140 requirements for middle-school students to participate in interscholastic  
141 extracurricular student activities are as follows:

142 i. ~~ε.~~ *Eligibility Time Period.* Eligibility for each middle-school student shall  
143 be limited to three (3) consecutive years from the time the student first  
144 enters grade 6.

145 ii. ~~ε.~~ *Eligibility for Participation Commencing with 6<sup>th</sup> Grade.* To be eligible to  
146 compete in interscholastic athletic competition for the first grading period,  
147 a sixth-grade student must be a bona fide student in the school which  
148 he/she represents (unless in home education, ~~ε.~~ or a charter-school student,  
149 or a virtual school student as provided by law and this policy explained in  
150 ~~Section (7) below~~); must have been regularly promoted from the fifth  
151 grade; must be carrying a normal class load; and must doing satisfactory  
152 classroom work with a satisfactory conduct record.

153 iii. ~~ε.~~ *Temporary Ineligibility Due to Administrative Placement.* Any middle-  
154 school student who has been administratively placed will be ineligible for  
155 the first nine (9) weeks of the placement.

156 iv. ~~ε.~~ *Grade Point Average.* Failure in more than one (1) subject during a  
157 given nine-week grading period shall cause a student to be ineligible for  
158 practice and competition during the following nine-week grading period. In  
159 addition, a student must maintain a grade point average of 2.0 as well as  
160 acceptable conduct as determined by the principal.

161 v. ~~ε.~~ *Ineligibility Due to Age.* A middle-school student will lose eligibility  
162 upon reaching the age of 15 years prior to September 1 of the current  
163 school year.

164 vi. ~~£.~~ *Eligibility for Participation in Grade 9.* To participate in the first semester  
165 of grade 9, a student must have been promoted from grade 8 during the  
166 immediately-preceding school year.

167 vii. *Satisfactory Conduct.* A student shall maintain satisfactory conduct,  
168 including adherence to appropriate dress and other codes of student  
169 conduct as provided in Policies [5.182](#) and [5.1813](#), and Fla. Stat. §  
170 1006.07(2).

171 (a) In any event, if the student is convicted of, or is found to have  
172 committed, a felony or a delinquent act which would have been a  
173 felony if committed by an adult regardless of whether adjudication  
174 is withheld, the student should be disqualified from participation in  
175 interscholastic extracurricular activities.

176 (b) If the student violates the dress and other codes of student conduct  
177 policies by wearing clothing that exposes underwear or body parts  
178 in an indecent or vulgar manner or that disrupts the orderly learning  
179 environment, the student shall be disciplined as follows:

180 (i.) For a first offense, the student shall be given a verbal  
181 warning and the principal or designee shall call the student's  
182 parents or guardians.

183 (ii.) For a second offense, the student shall be ineligible to  
184 participate in any extracurricular activity for a period of time  
185 not to exceed five (5) days and the principal or designee  
186 shall meet with the student's parents or guardians.

187 (iii.) If the student receives a third or subsequent offense for  
188 wearing clothing that exposes the student's body parts or  
189 underwear in a vulgar or indecent manner, in violation of  
190 Board Policy 5.182 and 5.1813, and Sec. 1006.07(2) (d) (1),  
191 Fla. Stat., the student shall be ineligible to participate in any  
192 extracurricular activity for a period not to exceed thirty (30)  
193 days. The principal or designee shall call and send the  
194 parents/guardians a written letter regarding the student's in-  
195 house suspension and ineligibility to participate in  
196 extracurricular activities.

197 **b.4. Scholastic Eligibility in High School.** As stated in Fla. Stat. §  
198 1006.15(3)(a), the minimum requirements for scholastic eligibility for high  
199 school students to participate in interscholastic extracurricular student  
200 activities, are as follows:

201 i. Grade Point Average. Maintain a grade point average of 2.0 or  
202 above on a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent, in the previous semester or  
203 a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or above on a 4.0 scale, or  
204 its equivalent, in the courses required for high school graduation by  
205 Fla. Stat. § 1003.43(1).



- 206 ii. ~~ii.~~ Academic Performance Contract. Execute and fulfill the  
207 requirements of an academic performance contract between the  
208 student, the ~~Board district school board~~, the Florida High School  
209 Athletic Association (FHSA) ~~appropriate governing association~~,  
210 and the student's parents, if the student's cumulative grade point  
211 average falls below 2.0, or its equivalent, on a 4.0 scale in the  
212 courses required by Fla. Stat. § 1003.43(1) ~~or, for students who~~  
213 ~~entered the 9th grade prior to the 1997-1998 school year, if the~~  
214 ~~student's cumulative grade point average falls below 2.0 on a 4.0~~  
215 ~~scale, or its equivalent, in the courses required by Fla. Stat. §~~  
216 ~~1003.43(1) that are taken after July 1, 1997.~~ At a minimum, the  
217 contract must require that the student attend summer school, or its  
218 graded equivalent, between grades 9 and 10 or grades 10 and 11,  
219 as necessary.
- 220 iii. ~~iii.~~ GPA for Junior or Senior Year. Have a cumulative grade point  
221 average of 2.0 or above on a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent, in the  
222 courses required by Fla. Stat. § 1003.43(1) during the junior or  
223 senior year.
- 224 iv. ~~iv.~~ Causes of Ineligibility During a Semester. A student who is  
225 eligible at the beginning of a semester shall be eligible during the  
226 remainder of the semester, except for lack of attendance, improper  
227 conduct or other valid reasons which may cause the principal to  
228 declare the student ineligible before the end of the semester.
- 229 v. ~~v.~~ Satisfactory Conduct. The student must maintain satisfactory  
230 conduct, including adherence to appropriate dress and other codes  
231 of student conduct policies as provided in Board Policies [Policy](#)  
232 [5.182](#) and [5.1813](#), and Sec. 1006.07(2) ~~(d)2~~, Fla. Stat., as  
233 determined by the principal.
- 234 (a.) In any event, if the student is convicted of, or is found to  
235 have committed, a felony or a delinquent act which would  
236 have been a felony if committed by an adult, regardless of  
237 whether adjudication is withheld, the student should be  
238 disqualified from participation in interscholastic  
239 extracurricular activities.
- 240 (b.) A student violates the dress and other codes of student  
241 conduct policies by wearing clothing that exposes underwear

242 or body parts in an indecent or vulgar manner or that  
243 disrupts the orderly learning environment, the student shall  
244 be disciplined as follows:

245 (i.) For a first offense, the student shall be given a verbal  
246 warning and the principal or designee shall call the  
247 student's parents or guardians.

248 (ii.) For a second offense, the student shall be ineligible to  
249 participate in any extracurricular activity for a period of  
250 time not to exceed five (5) days and the principal or  
251 designee shall meet with the student's parents or  
252 guardians.

253 (iii.) If the student receives a third or subsequent offense  
254 for wearing clothing that exposes the student's body  
255 parts or underwear in a vulgar or indecent manner, in  
256 violation of Board Policies ~~Policy~~ 5.182 and 5.1813,  
257 and Sec. 1006.07(2) (d) (1), Fla. Stat., the student  
258 shall be ineligible to participate in any extracurricular  
259 activity for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days. The  
260 ~~school~~ principal or designee shall call and send the  
261 parents/guardians a written letter regarding the  
262 student's in-house suspension and ineligibility to  
263 participate in extracurricular activities.

## 264 **5. General Eligibility Requirements**

265 a. ~~Middle school principals are responsible for ensuring that each middle~~  
266 ~~school participant in interscholastic activities abides by the PBCMSAA~~  
267 ~~Bylaws and/or the Florida School Music Association ("FSMA") Bylaws.~~  
268 ~~Eligibility is established at the first school attended as assigned by Student~~  
269 ~~Services.~~

270 b. ~~High school principals are responsible for ensuring that each high school~~  
271 ~~participant in interscholastic activities, as a representative of his/her~~  
272 ~~school is eligible to participate under the FHSAA rules. Eligibility is~~  
273 ~~established at the first school attended as assigned by Student Services.~~  
274 ~~The principal also has the responsibility of reporting any discovered~~  
275 ~~eligibility irregularities to the FHSAA, the Area Superintendent, and the~~  
276 ~~Superintendent/designee.~~

- 277 c. ~~In addition to the FHSAA or PBCMSAA Bylaws, the following rules shall~~  
278 ~~apply:~~
- 279 i. ~~No student may participate in the interscholastic activities of a~~  
280 ~~school other than the school to which the student was first assigned~~  
281 ~~for a given school year unless the student:~~
- 282 A. ~~actually and legitimately resides in the attendance area of~~  
283 ~~the school; or has a transfer approved by Student Services;~~  
284 ~~or~~
- 285 B. ~~has been admitted to a magnet/choice school or program~~  
286 ~~pursuant to the magnet/choice application process (provided~~  
287 ~~that the student shall become ineligible for sports at the~~  
288 ~~magnet/choice school if he/she drops out of, or is removed~~  
289 ~~from, the magnet/choice program); or~~
- 290 C. ~~transferred to the new school under the Opportunity~~  
291 ~~Scholarships Program or the McKay Scholarships for~~  
292 ~~Children with Disabilities Program under Fla. Stat. §§~~  
293 ~~1002.38 or 1002.39; or was administratively placed.~~
- 294 ii. ~~Principals shall annually review reassignments.~~
- 295 iii. ~~Any student who is found to have falsified eligibility information,~~  
296 ~~shall be deemed ineligible to compete in any public school within~~  
297 ~~the School District of Palm Beach County for one calendar year~~  
298 ~~from the date the falsification is discovered.~~
- 299 iv. ~~The Superintendent, Area Superintendent, principal, coach, or~~  
300 ~~activity sponsor may raise questions of eligibility at any time. Any~~  
301 ~~question of eligibility shall be presented to the principal of the~~  
302 ~~school where the student's eligibility is being questioned.~~
- 303 d. ~~An Interscholastic Eligibility Appeals Committee (IEAC) shall be~~  
304 ~~established to review eligibility questions which cannot otherwise be~~  
305 ~~resolved. Neither this Policy nor any recommendation from the committee~~  
306 ~~shall be construed as waiving applicable FHSAA, or PBCMSAA Bylaws or~~  
307 ~~regulations.~~
- 308 1. ~~**Clubs and Non-Sports Activities.** The minimum scholastic standards for~~  
309 ~~eligibility for competitive interscholastic participation in extracurricular~~  
310 ~~competitive interscholastic non-sports activities and clubs will be the same~~

311 ~~GPA required for sports participation by Fla. Stat. 1006.15(3) (a), the FHSAA,~~  
312 ~~and the PBCMSAA.~~

313 **8. Participation of Home Education, and Charter School, and Virtual**  
314 **Education Students**

315 Home education, charter school, and virtual education students who meet the  
316 specified academic and conduct requirements as required by Fla. Stat. § 1006.15  
317 and this policy are eligible to participate in extracurricular and interscholastic  
318 athletic activities consistent with the provisions below.

319 a. *Home Education Student.* ~~Home educated students are governed by~~  
320 ~~the same eligibility regulations as all public school students. "An individual~~  
321 home education student is eligible to participate at the same District  
322 school to which the student would be assigned according to Board policy,  
323 consistent with Fla. Stat. §§ 1002.20(18) and 1006.15(3)(c) ~~district school~~  
324 ~~board attendance area policies or which the student could choose to~~  
325 ~~attend pursuant to district or interdistrict controlled open enrollment~~  
326 ~~provisions, . . . in the interscholastic extracurricular activities of that~~  
327 ~~school," subject to the conditions in Fla. Stat. § 1006.15(3) (c).~~

328 b. *Charter School Student.* A charter school student is eligible to participate  
329 at the District school to which he or she would be assigned in  
330 accordance with Board policy, consistent with Fla. Stat. §§ 1002.20(18)  
331 and 1006.15(3)(d), unless the activity is provided by the charter school..  
332 ~~"An individual charter school student. . . is eligible to participate at the~~  
333 ~~public school to which the student would be assigned according to district~~  
334 ~~school board attendance area policies... or which the student could~~  
335 ~~choose to attend, pursuant to district or interdistrict controlled open-~~  
336 ~~enrollment provisions, in any interscholastic extracurricular activity of that~~  
337 ~~school, unless such activity is provided by the student's charter school,"~~  
338 ~~subject to the conditions set forth in Fla. Stat. § 1006.15(3)(d).~~

339 c. *Virtual Education Student.* A full-time virtual education student is eligible  
340 to participate at the District school to which his or she would be assigned  
341 in accordance with Board policy, consistent with Fla. Stat. §§ 1002.20(18)  
342 and 1006.15(3)(e).

343 **9. Recruiting for Extracurricular Activities Prohibited**

344 ~~School~~ District employees are prohibited from recruiting students from other  
345 schools for any extracurricular activity, which includes interscholastic athletic  
346 activity, either directly or indirectly, and may be subject to disciplinary action, up  
347 to and including termination for violation of this policy. Any principal who  
348 knowingly allows or encourages recruitment from other schools will be subject to

349 disciplinary action, up to and including termination. Any employee who knowingly  
350 and willfully withholds information regarding eligibility when questioned by his/her  
351 superiors will be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination.

352 10. **Responsibility**

353 a. Principals are responsible for implementing this policy.

354 b. The Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Learning Support is  
355 responsible for addressing any questions regarding participation in  
356 interscholastic activities.

357 c. The Superintendent, or his designee, is responsible for ensuring that this  
358 policy is followed and monitoring fair and equitable access to  
359 extracurricular activities for all students.
