4-A I recommend the Board adopt the proposed revised Policy 6.03, to be re-titled "Cost of School Meals."

Adoption

CONSENT ITEM

- This revised Policy specifies new prices for meals served in schools for adults and adds new prices for student meals. Student meal prices have not increased in over fifteen years. Due to increased costs and anticipated inflation, School Food Service recommends slightly increasing prices.
- Breakfast: It is recommended to increase breakfast prices for the 2005-2006 school year, as illustrated in the table below. (However, the breakfast price for students eligible for the reduced price at all school levels will continue to be set by USDA guidelines, which the USDA may evaluate annually [the current price is \$0.30]).

- Lunch: It is recommended to increase lunch prices for the 2005-2006 school year and again for the 2007-2008 school year, as illustrated in the table below. (However, the lunch price for students eligible for the reduced price at all school levels will continue to be set by USDA guidelines, which the USDA may evaluate annually [the current price is \$0.40]).

2 COST OF ADULT LUNCHES SCHOOL MEALS

4 1. Regular-Priced Meals.-- The formula for determining the price of adult meals
5 shall be in accordance with prescribed Florida State Department of Education
6 rules.

7 a. For the 2005-2006 and 2006-2007 school years, the price of meals
8 provided by School Food Service shall be as follows:

10 i. Breakfast.-- Breakfast shall cost \$1.00 for all levels of students.

12 ii. Lunch.-- Lunch shall cost: \$1.50 for elementary students; \$1.75 for
13 secondary students; and \$3.00 for adults.

15 b. For the 2007-2008 school year and onward, the Superintendent or
16 designee will annually evaluate whether to recommend that breakfast
17 prices be increased through revision of this Policy, considering factors
18 such as the School Food Service statement of revenues and
19 expenditures, the impact of School Food Service salaries and benefits,
20 increases in delivery service costs and prices of purchased goods,
21 reductions in USDA commodity allocations, and indirect and direct costs
22 (such as monies paid to the District from Food Service).

23
24 c. For the 2007-2008 school year, lunch shall cost: \$1.75 for elementary
25 students; \$2.00 for secondary students; and a price to be determined,
26 through revision of this Policy, for adults.

28 d. For the 2008-2009 school year and onward, the Superintendent or
29 designee will annually evaluate whether to recommend that lunch prices
30 be increased through revision of this Policy, considering factors such as
31 those listed in subsection (1)(b).

33 2. Reduced-Priced Meals.-- In all years, for eligible students at all levels, the cost
34 for reduced-price meals will continue to be set annually according to USDA
35 federal guidelines (which were \$0.30 for breakfast and \$0.40 for lunch at the
36 time of this Policy revision in mid-2005), and the USDA may evaluate for
37 possible price adjustments on an annual basis.
