Adoption

CONSENT ITEM

- This proposed new policy establishes guidelines to govern free and reduced price meals as required by the National School Breakfast and Lunch Programs and the State of Florida.
- Definitions are provided for free and reduced priced meals in Sec. 3.
- The proposed policy:
 - Requires the District to make applications for free and reduced price meals available on the District's website, and paper copies in schools, prior to the beginning of the school year. See Sec. 3.
 - Authorizes the Director of School Food Services or designee to administer the application process and to determine student eligibility. See Sec. 5.
 - Provides for notification to parents of the approval or denial of an application, rights to appeal a determination, appeal procedures, and the designation of a hearing officer. See Sec.5 and 9.
 - Prohibits discrimination in the food service program, including the segregation of students due to inability to pay and publication of eligible student names. See Sec.6.
 - Prohibits meals being used to discipline students. See Sec.7.
 - Outlines responsibilities for School Food Service regarding the free and reduced priced meal program.
 - Requires applications and records to be confidential, and permits the superintendent to designate certain employees to use such records for disaggregation of academic data and/or identification of students for certain programs/services. See Sec. 8.

POLICY 6.186

FREE AND REDUCED PRICE MEALS

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3 1. **Purpose**
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5 The Board recognizes the importance of good nutrition to each student's
6 educational performance, and that some families may be unable to provide
7 breakfast and lunch meals for their children. This policy is to ensure that well-
8 balanced, nourishing meals are provided to District students while ensuring the
9 District's compliance with the federal laws and regulations governing the National
10 School Breakfast and Lunch Programs, Fla. Stat. § 570.981 and Florida
11 Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services Rules.
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13 2. **Scope**
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15 This policy applies to all District students whose families qualify for free or reduced
16 price meals in accordance with federal and state laws and regulations.
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18 3. **Definitions**
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20 For the purposes of this policy, the following definitions shall be applicable.
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- 22 a. "Free Meal" means a meal served under the National School Lunch or School
23 Breakfast Program to a child from a household eligible for such benefits under
24 7 CFR part 245 and for which neither the child nor any member of the
25 household pays or is required to work.
26 b. "Reduced Price Meal" means a meal served under the National School Lunch
27 Program or School Breakfast Program: (a) to a child from a household eligible
28 for such benefits under 7 CFR part 245; (b) for which the price is less than the
29 School Board designated full price of the lunch and which does not exceed the
30 maximum allowable reduced price specified under 7 CFR part 245; and (c) for
31 which neither the child nor any member of the household is required to work.
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33 4. **Policy Statement**
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35 In accordance with law, the District shall provide nutritionally adequate free and
36 reduced price meals to District students whose families meet the applicable federal
37 eligibility criteria. Prior to the beginning of each school year, applications for such
38 free and reduced price meals shall be made available on the District's website and
39 as paper copies in District schools.
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41 5. **Administration of the Free and Reduced Price Meal Program**
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43 The Board authorizes the School Food Service Director or designee to administer
44 the Free and Reduced Price Meal Application Process, including the responsibility
45 for determining a student's eligibility for the free or reduced price meal program
46 based on the criteria specified by USDA and Florida Department of Agriculture and
47 Consumer Services.

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49 The School Food Service Director or designee shall notify the parent/guardian of
50 the approval or denial of an application within ten (10) operating days of the receipt
51 of the application. If the application is denied, parents/ guardians will be informed
52 of the reason for denial, the availability of a hearing procedure to address a denial,
53 and the name and address of the designated hearing official.

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55 **6. Assurance of Nondiscrimination**

56 a. No child shall be discriminated against because of his or her race, color,
57 national origin, sex or sexual orientation, marital status, age, religion, disability,
58 genetic information, gender identity or expression in the operation of the
59 District's School Food Service program.

60 b. There will be no physical segregation of, or any other discrimination against,
61 any student because of his or her inability to pay the full price of the meal.
62 There shall be no overt identification of any such children. The names of
63 students eligible to receive free or reduced price meals or free milk shall not
64 be posted, published, or announced in any manner. Eligible students will not
65 be required to:

66 i. use special tokens or tickets, or other means of identification;

67 ii. work for their meals or milk;

68 iii. use a separate dining area;

69 iv. go through a separate serving line;

70 v. enter the dining area through a separate entrance;

71 vi. eat meals at a different time than students who pay full price; and/or

72 vii. eat a different meal from the meal sold to students who pay full price.

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74 **7. Denial of Meals**

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76 By law and regulations, no student may be denied a meal for disciplinary reasons.

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78 **8. Confidentiality/Release of Records**

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80 All applications and records related to eligibility for free and reduced price meal
81 program shall be confidential except as provided by law.

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83 The Board, in accordance with U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) regulations,
84 authorizes the Superintendent to designate employees to use individual
85 records pertaining to student eligibility for any free and reduced price meal
86 program for the purposes of:

- 87 a. disaggregation of academic achievement data and
88 b. identification of students eligible for school choice and supplemental
89 educational services in any school identified for program improvement under
90 Title I of the No Child Left Behind Act.
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92 9. Right to Appeal
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- 94 a. Hearing Officer. Parents or guardians shall have the right to appeal the
95 District's decision on the application for free or reduced price meals, a
96 subsequent reduction or termination of benefits as a result of review
97 procedures or verification, and when the District challenges the correctness of
98 information in an application or the continued eligibility of a child for a free or
99 reduced price meal benefit or free milk. During the appeal, hearing and
100 disposition of the case, the student will continue to receive free or reduced
101 price meals. The hearing officer for such appeals shall be the Chief
102 Operating Officer.
103 b. Hearing Procedure. If the parent/guardian is dissatisfied with the ruling of
104 the approving official, he/she may wish to discuss the decision with the
105 approving official on an informal or formal basis. If the parent wishes to make a
106 formal appeal, he/she may make a request either orally or in writing to the
107 hearing official: Chief Operations Officer, 3340 Forest Hill Blvd, West Palm
108 Beach, FL 33406-5813, (561) 434-8454, for a hearing to appeal the decision.
109 i. A parent/guardian shall have an opportunity to examine, before and
110 during the hearing, the documents and records presented to support the
111 decision appealed. The hearing shall be held with reasonable promptness
112 and convenience to the parent/guardian, and adequate notice shall be
113 given as to the time and place of the hearing. The parent/guardian shall
114 have an opportunity to present verbal or documentary evidence and
115 arguments supporting his/her position and an opportunity to question or
116 refute any testimony or other evidence and to confront and cross-examine
117 any adverse witness(es).
118 ii. The hearing official's decision shall be based on the verbal and
119 documentary evidence presented at the hearing. The parent/guardian and
120 designated representative, if any, shall be notified in writing of the
121 decision.
122 iii. A written record shall be prepared with respect to each hearing, which
123 shall include: the decision under appeal; any documentary evidence and
124 a summary of any oral testimony presented at the hearing; the decision of
125 the hearing officer, including the reasons therefore; and a copy of the
126 notification to the parties concerned of the decision of the hearing official.
127 The written record of each hearing shall be preserved for a period of three
128 years beyond the current year and shall be available for examination by
129 the parent/guardian or a representative at any reasonable time and place
130 during such period.
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10. Responsibilities of School Food Service

Palm Beach County School Food Service will:

- a. Communicate to all households in Palm Beach County with registered students the availability of free or reduced price meals and the application process. Applications are available on-line at www.palmbeachschools.org/sfs. Application form for free or reduced price meals will be reviewed based on the prototypes and directions provided by Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.
- b. Make free and reduced price meals available to eligible enrolled children whose household's income falls within the federally regulated income guidelines or who qualify based on federal direct certification requirements.
- c. Ensure that there is no overt identification of any child's meal status.
- d. Establish and follow a collection procedure that will not overtly identify those students receiving free or reduced-priced meals. Refer to Policy [6.185](#)(School Food Service Management).
- e. Maintain applications and direct certification letters for five (5) years plus the current year.
- f. Accept applications at any time during the year. Any parent/guardian enrolling a child in a school for the first time will be supplied with a family application or a link to an electronic application.
- g. Ensure that if a child transfers from one school to another within the District, his/her status eligibility for a free or reduced price meal will remain the same.
- h. Immediately serve meals to children upon the establishment of their eligibility.
- i. Conduct verification annually of approved applications for free and reduced price meals as required by the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (FLDACs) and USDA.


