POLICY 6.28

COMPREHENSIVE LIABILITY INSURANCE FOR SUMMER CAMPS/DAY CARE

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3 1. **District Summer Camps.** -- Comprehensive general liability insurance for school-
4 based district-run summer camps is required in an amount sufficient to protect the
5 board as determined by the superintendent/designee after considering the nature
6 of the camp and the exposure. Cost of the insurance shall be included in the
7 summer camp budget, and may be passed to the participants.

- 8 2. **Other Summer Camps.** -- Summer camps that are not run by the district but are
9 using district facilities are required to carry comprehensive general liability
10 insurance in an amount sufficient to protect itself and the board as determined by
11 the superintendent/designee after considering the nature of the camp and the
12 exposure. A certificate of insurance naming the district as an additional insured
13 shall be furnished annually to the principal at the location where the camp is being
14 held. Any premiums or cost of this insurance is the responsibility of the summer
15 camp and may be passed on to the participants.

- 16 3. **Day Care Programs.** -- This policy shall also apply to day care programs
17 (excluding school age child care ("SACC"), migrant worker programs, and federally
18 funded early intervention programs, such as head start) as determined by the
19 superintendent/designee after considering the nature of the program and the
20 exposure. Any premiums or costs of this insurance is the responsibility of the
21 program and may be passed on to the participants.
