## Development CONSENT ITEM

- This proposed revised policy provides for newly constructed, remodeled or renovated school sites to comply with applicable federal laws; state requirements, as the State Board of Education rule and the *State Requirements for Educational Facilities;* the District Master Specification; the District Design Criteria; and other applicable District policies.
- The proposed policy prohibits the construction, modernization or renovation of a building prior to the development and approval of educational specifications. The educational specifications are intended for use as a planning guide by architects and others responsible for developing physical facilities of the School District. The Superintendent or designee is required to direct the preparation of educational specifications for the design and construction.
- A listing is provided in, section 4, of the items to be incorporated into an educational specification.
- A contractor of record for each capital project that has an educational specifications approved by the Board is required to provide a detailed list of any deviation from the Board approved educational specifications, by providing a detailed list to an attachment to the Guarantee Maximum Price (GMP) for the contractor's project.
- This revision also updates statutory references.
