- The Board approved development of this revised Policy at the development reading on January 7, 2009.
- This proposed revision incorporates by reference the Public School Concurrency Interlocal Agreement. It also re-defines Level of Service standards consistently with the Interlocal Agreement and school district and local government practices and Florida Statutes.

CSA modifications are governed by Article V of the Interlocal.

26 27			i. One hundred and ten percent (110%) of capacity (utilization) as determined by the Florida Inventory of School Houses (FISH); or

If a school is planned and under contract and will relieve capacity at an existing school, upon determination by Technical Advisory Group (TAG), the school shall be allowed to exceed the 110% maximum utilization for a period not to exceed 2 years. This is intended to prevent the movement of students more than once.			
33 34 35			iii. Up to one hundred and twenty percent (120%) of FISH capacity (utilization/LOS) (test two), for individual schools provided that the results of School Capacity Study (SCS) determines that a particular school can			

operate in excess of one hundred ten percent (110%) capacity.

38	Equivalency (FTE) student count of the first semester reaches one

40	b Level of Service ("LOS") To ensure that the capacity of schools is						
41	sufficient to support student growth at the adopted LOS for each year of the						
42	five-year planning period for each CSA, the District shall establish for all						
43	schools of each type within each CSA and each individual school that:						
44	i. A tiered LOS shall be in force pursuant to the Tiered Level of Service						
45	Table in the Public Schools Facilities Element until August 1, 2004.

School Capacity Study: When a SCS is required by District policy or the adopted Interlocal, the SCS shall determine if the growth rate within each

73 74 75		CSA, causing a particular school's LOS to exceed one hundred ten percent (110%) of capacity, is temporary or reflects an ongoing trend affecting the LOS for the five-year planning period.			
76		i.	At a minimum, the SCS shall consider:		
77			A. Demographics in the CSA within which the school is located;		
78			B. Student population trends;		
79 80			C. Real estate trends, e.g. existing redevelopment and new development;		
81			D. Teacher/student ratios; and		
82 83			E. Core facility capacity (which will also be taken into consideration when adding modular capacity).

If the SCS concludes that the school can operate within the FISH guidelines and not exceed one-hundred <u>and</u> twenty percent (120%) LOS (utilization), then that school shall be considered to be operating within the adopted LOS and the CSA LOS shall be amended. Local governments will be notified to amend their comprehensive plans in the next round of amendments to reflect this additional capacity.

92 93 94		i.	The District shall regularly review and institute necessary program adjustments to not exceed the LOS in each CSA and each individual school.		
95 96 97 98 99		ii.	The Board shall establish policies for achieving and maintaining optimum effective enrollment capacities for program options within school facilities. These policies shall address the impacts on sending and receiving schools while meeting the requirements of school concurrency. <u>Policy 5.01 on Student Assignment addresses this.</u>		
100 101 102 103		iii.	The Board shall establish objectives for the Choice Program. The program shall be evaluated for its effectiveness. Consideration shall be given to optimizing resources for the program's implementation, timing and phasing. Policy 5.016 addresses this.		
104 105			Upon achieving the maximum utilization of capacity (LOS) at a particular school facility with a program option, the subsequent program option		

- students applying from outside the school assignment area shall be assigned to the closest magnet school with the same program which has not exceeded its LOS.
- 109 4. **Capacity Measurement.-** For purposes of this Policy, capacity shall be calculated as follows:
- a. Capacity of an existing school is its FISH capacity as measured in October,
 2002 reported in the most recent School Board-approved 5 Year Capital Plan.
 Capacity for new future facilities or additions shall be that shown on the School
 Board-approved educational specifications for that school.
- b. Capacity added by modulars shall be calculated using 100% of the 2002 FISH-capacity formula. Beginning August 2004, capacity added through modulars shall be calculated at 100% of the state FISH capacity then in effect.

118 5. **New Capacity**

- 119 a. The Board shall initiate the necessary program and/or boundary adjustments 120 to reflect the new capacity for the schools that are scheduled to be constructed 121 and opened for each year of the District's Program.
- b. These adjustments shall be consistent with the data and analysis provided in the CSA Tables of the District's Program.

124 6. Modification of the Adopted LOS

- a. The Technical Advisory Group ("TAG"), established by Article VI of the Interlocal, may evaluate and recommend a modification of the adopted LOS standard requested by the District or participating local government.
- The adopted LOS, not to exceed one-hundred twenty percent (120%), will be modified by an addendum to the adopted Interlocal.
- b. At least fifty-one percent (51%) of the parties to the Interlocal and the Board must concur to the modification of the adopted LOS.
