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PROPOSED NEW POLICY 1.015

PARENTAL/FAMILY INVOLVEMENT

- <u>Definitions.--</u> Unless the context requires otherwise, the following terms have the following meanings in this Policy:
- a. Parent: Although involvement of a student's mother, father, or legal guardian is the specific focus of this Policy, the Board recognizes that all persons concerned with the education of students should work together cooperatively to meet the needs of students; thus, as used herein, the term "parent" refers in a broad sense to any of the caring adults who play a significant role in the care of a student enrolled in the School District, such as the student's mother, father, legal guardian, grandparent, aunt, uncle, adult sibling, or mentor.
- 15b. School: As used herein, the term "school" refers in a broad sense not only to16the sites providing the customary K-12 program, but also to the17prekindergarten, adult education, and community education programs.
- 18 **<u>2. Parental/Family Involvement: A School-Home Partnership</u>**
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 a. The Board recognizes that among the factors necessary to improve learning

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 are:
- 21 <u>i. a sound instructional program; and</u>

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- 22 <u>ii. consistent voluntary involvement of parents and other influential adults.</u>
- b. The Board recognizes that parental involvement is a desirable element in
 effective education, and that student achievement can reach higher levels
 when parents, schools, and the community work together in a collaborative
 endeavor to support student learning. To assist with achieving the intent of
 this paragraph, the Office of Public Affairs shall be available to assist schools
 in developing and distributing information encouraging parental involvement.
- 29c. Although parents are of diverse cultures, languages, and needs, they share30the desire for the educational success of their children. Hence, the programs31and practices established by the District, in collaboration with parents and32communities through the school improvement process, shall support family33involvement and reflect the specific needs of students and their families.

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- 34d. Accordingly, the School Board seeks to actively bring together families,35schools, and the community in the education of children. Schools have the36responsibility to involve parents, and parents have the responsibility to37become involved in the school.
- 38 <u>3.</u> Communication.-- In accordance with Fla. Stat. § 230.23(15)(b), the Board
 39 encourages teachers and administrators to keep parents and guardians informed
 40 of student progress, student programs, student attendance requirements and the
 41 availability of resources for academic assistance.
- 42 <u>a. Special efforts should be made to assist parents in understanding the needs.</u>
 43 <u>responsibilities, and educational rights of the student.</u>
- 44b. Communication with parents should be in the home language as documented45by the TERMS student demographic screen, unless the parent states in writing46that he/she is more comfortable with another language.
- 47 <u>4. Family-Friendly Schools.--</u> The school building should be a welcoming place,
 48 <u>clearly accessible to parents, consistent with established security procedures and</u>
 49 <u>the principal's authority under the School Code and case law. Parental access</u>
 50 <u>shall not interfere with rights of students, teachers, and school administrators to</u>
 51 <u>have an orderly instructional environment.</u>
- 52 <u>5. Flexible Time.--</u> The Board is supportive of District employees being given flexible
 53 time to visit their children's schools. Further, the Board hereby encourages Palm
 54 <u>Beach County businesses to adopt practices that promote their employees'</u>
 55 <u>parental participation in education.</u>
- 6. Accommodation of Parent Schedules.-- The Board supports flexibility in school
 personnel's use of creative methods of accommodating parents' schedules, within
 the parameters of the School Code, State Board of Education Rules, and sound
 educational principles.
- 60 <u>7. National Standards for Parent/Family Involvement Programs.--</u> The School
 61 <u>Board endorses the following standards as set forth in the National Standards for</u>
 62 <u>Parent/Family Involvement Programs as adopted by the National PTA:</u>
- 63a.Standard I:Communicating. -- The Board encourages communication64between the home and the school that is on-going, interactive, and reasonably65accommodates all parents, including those with limited English proficiency or66disabilities. Interaction with parents should be handled in a non-judgmental

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- 67manner that recognizes a variety of parenting styles, family structures, and68circumstances; as well as individual differences reflected in the values,69cultures, and diversity of the student population. Regular parent/teacher70dialogue is encouraged at all grade levels.
- 55Standard II: Parenting.-- The Board is supportive of basic adult literacy and72programs on topics such as nutrition, health, self-esteem, parent-child73communication, motivation, discipline, child development, monitoring television74viewing, monitoring Internet usage, assisting with homework, and other topics75that enable parents to be full partners in the education of their children.
- 76c. Standard III: Student Learning.-- The Board endorses assisting parents to77play an integral role in student learning by providing parents information on78grade-level expectations and their children's program toward proficiency,79specific activities that can be done at home, and how to partner with teachers80to maximize student achievement.
- 81d. Standard IV: Volunteering.--The Board is supportive of the creation of82meaningful volunteer opportunities and ensure that parents are welcome in the83school pursuant to Board Policy 2.53, "Volunteers in Public Schools," and that84their support and assistance are sought.
- 85 <u>e. Standard V: School Decision-Making and Advocacy.--</u> The Board
 86 <u>encourages the involvement of parents as full partners in the decisions and</u>
 87 <u>practices of the school that affect children and families through the school</u>
 88 <u>improvement process, the School Advisory Council (SAC), PTA/PTO, and</u>
 89 <u>other decision-making groups as appropriate.</u>
- 90f.Standard VI: Collaborating with the Community.-- The Board supports the91strengthening of school programs, family practices, and student learning92through the integration of community resources and business partnerships93consistent with Fla. Stat. § 230.23005(5). Schools and parent groups should94actively recruit persons to serve as role models and mentors.
- 95 <u>8. Parent Resources</u>
- 96a. Where feasible, schools should set aside space within the building for parents97to meet, obtain resource information about parenting, the school system, and98specific materials and strategic and strategies to use at home with their99children.

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100 Schools should seek to identify a parent liaison whose primary responsibility b. would be to ascertain the needs of parents and to communicate this 101 102 information to appropriate school staff. 103 9. Office of Family Involvement .-- Consistent with the recommendation of the 104 Superintendent, the Board will act in accordance with Fla. Stat. § 230.23(5)(a) to establish an Office of Family Involvement ("OFI"). Establishment of the OFI will 105 include the Superintendent's recommendation, and the Board's designation, of a 106 107 Family Involvement Coordinator, who shall be responsible for: promoting parent/family involvement in schools through the school 108 a. 109 improvement process: 110 maintaining contact with various District departments and community groups b. 111 and agencies; and 112 c. facilitating the implementation of this Policy. 113 114 SPECIFIC AUTHORITY: §§ 230.22(1), (2); 230.23(22); 230.23005(5), Fla.
