 - The proposed changes to Policy 1.07 are to conform the terms of this policy with the vote of the electorate in March 2000 regarding single member district representation, pursuant to School Board of Palm Beach County Resolution CL99-2587, and the School Board of Palm Beach County Resolution adopted in November 2001 relating to Board elections.

PROPOSED REVISIONS TO POLICY 1.07

BOARD ELECTIONS

- 1. The School Board of Palm Beach County consists of seven (7) members each of whom shall be nominated and elected only by the qualified electors of the entire School District.
- Each member is elected for a term of four (4) years and shall maintain said residency throughout the duration of his/her office term.

3. 2. Elections Held

<u>a.</u> <u>First Primary Party Nomination Election</u>

The election of school School board members elections shall be held at the same time as the first primary party nomination. If no candidate receives a majority of the votes cast in a nonpartisan school board election held at the same time as the first party election, a run-off election for such candidates will be held at the same time as the general election.

b. General Election

A runoff election will be held at the same time as the general election. A runoff will be held if no candidate in a board member district residence area receives a majority of the votes cast during the nonpartisan school board election held at the same time as the first primary party nomination election.

- 4. "Said residence" means the school board member residence area from which he/she was elected.
- 5. The office of any School Board member shall be vacant when the member removes his/her residence area from the school board member residence area from which he/she was elected.
- 6. Any vacancy on the School Board shall be filled by the Governor's appointment.

7. 3. District Numbering

- <u>a.</u> Board members' districts and their respective successors in office will be designated by numbers as District No. number one (1), No. number (2), No. number (3), No. number (4), No. number (5), No. number (6) and No. number (7). The board member district residence areas are shown by resolution spread upon the minutes of the board and recorded and filed as required by law.
- b. In all proceedings for the nomination or election of candidates for or to the office of Board members, every petition for nomination, declaration of candidacy, certificates of nomination, ballot or other document used in connection with the nomination or election will state the position and district number to which the candidate aspires.
- 4. In accordance with the proposition voted upon by a majority of the electors pursuant to School Board Resolution CL99-2587, implementing single-member representation, qualified electors within each of the seven (7) district residence areas will elect a board member from within their district in the 2002 election.
- 8. <u>5.</u> Starting with the 2004 election, Three three (3) members shall be elected at the time of the presidential election, and four Four (4) members shall be elected at the time of the gubernatorial election. Each board member shall be elected only by qualified electors who reside in the same residence area as the member.
- 9 <u>6.</u> Reelections <u>Elections</u> for Board positions <u>starting with the 2004 election</u> will occur as follows:
 - <u>i.</u> District No. 1: Year 2000 2004, and every four (4) years thereafter;
 - <u>ii.</u> District No. 2: Year 1998 <u>2004</u>, and every four (4) years thereafter;
 - <u>iii.</u> District No. 3: Year 2000 <u>2006</u>, and every four (4) years thereafter;
 - <u>iv.</u> District No. 4: Year <u>19982006</u>, and every four (4) years thereafter;
 - v. District No. 5: Year 1998 <u>2004</u>, and every four (4) years thereafter;
 - vi. District No. 6: Year 1998 <u>2006</u>, and every four (4) years thereafter;
 - vi. District No. 7: Year 2000 2006, and every four (4) years thereafter.
