## Adoption CONSENT ITEM

- The Board approved this new policy as a first reading for development on October 13, 2003, with the following changes: Lines 78-79 now provide: "School Board meetings, workshops, and other public meetings will be covered, to the extent possible . . . ." Lines 104-105 now state: "Programming that promotes political candidates or issues [is not permitted] except as allowed under Policies 2.59 and 2.591, FCC Regulations, and this Policy."
- The adoption notice was published on November 10, 2003.
- This new Policy will formally authorize the Superintendent and designees to produce, air, and distribute educational programming on The Education Network for the educational benefit of the community.
- The proposed Policy defines the function of the Palm Beach County School District's Open Access Channel 19 (The Education Network); provides information and direction to District staff regarding the network; and assists the public in understanding the services offered by the network.

- 46 4. **Programming Guidelines.--** All programming on T.E.N. must fall within one of the 47 channel's designated categories as listed above in section (3). The District shall 48 allocate programming time among the designated categories. The following 49 additional guidelines shall apply: 50
  - All programming on T.E.N. must support, and be consistent with, the channel's a. mission and goals.
  - b. All programming on T.E.N. must be of local educational interest and provide community benefit.
  - All programming on T.E.N. must be either produced or approved for use by the C. T.E.N. Manager. The Superintendent shall have final authority to approve or reject programming on T.E.N.
    - The School District, through the Department of Instructional Support and i. T.E.N., may produce, supervise, broadcast, and distribute original programming.
    - ii. Any District department may co-sponsor a programming proposal by submitting a request to the manager of T.E.N.
    - The District may cooperate with other media in the delivery, production, iii. broadcast or other use of programming consistent with the mission of <u>T.E.N.</u>
    - Upon recommendation of the Superintendent, the School Board may iv. enter into memoranda of understanding, interlocal agreements, cooperative agreements, or other contracts to further the purpose of producing and distributing educational and cultural programming through <u>T.E.N.</u>
  - School Board meetings, workshops, and other public meetings will be d. covered, to the extent possible, gave-to-gavel, without editing or interruption. Introductory or supplementary information which will aid the viewer in understanding the context or issues may be provided.
- 83 e. Live-broadcast or videotaped coverage on T.E.N. of Board or public meetings 84 shall not be considered an official record of those meetings, and the Board

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85 shall have no liability for access to or lack of access to coverage of such 86 meetings. The District will archive broadcast videotapes of public meetings as 87 required by law and the District's records retention schedule. 88 89 Prohibited Programming.-- T.E.N reserves the right to refuse to transmit all or 5. 90 any portion of a program which promotes any activity which is deemed 91 inappropriate under local. state. or federal law or this Policy or other Board 92 Policies. All material shall be consistent with the scope and sequence of the District 93 curriculum, family involvement goals, or other identified educational purposes. The 94 following types of programming shall be prohibited on T.E.N.: 95 96 a. Programming that is deemed inappropriate or illegal under Board Policy or 97 state or federal law or is inconsistent with the mission and goals of the Board. 98 the District School System. or T.E.N. 99 100 b. Programming that violates FCC guidelines for access television, including: 101 Commercial/for-profit making enterprises, trade or business announcements, 102 or obscene. indecent. libelous or slanderous speech. 103 104 Programming that promotes political candidates or issues, except as allowed C. 105 under Policies 2.59 and 2.591, FCC Regulations, and this Policy. 106 **Programming Authority and Responsibility** 107 6. 108 109 The School District reserves the right to program T.E.N. Channel 19 in a. 110 accordance with the objectives identified above in subsection (2)(a). 111 112 The District shall follow all FCC guidelines for access television. b. 113 114 The School District reserves the right to refuse any request for cable C. 115 programming or operations which is deemed inappropriate or illegal under Board policy or state or federal law or is inconsistent with the mission and 116 goals of the Board, the District School System, or T.E.N. For First 117 Amendment purposes. T.E.N. is not a public forum: it is subject to the 118 119 oversight, direction, and editorial control of the Superintendent/designee. 120 As appropriate, any grievance regarding programming decisions shall be filed 121 d. with the manager of T.E.N. If not resolved at that level, the issue may be 122 123 forwarded to the T.E.N. Advisory Committee. Their recommendations will be 124 forwarded to the Superintendent of Schools for review and, if not resolved, the 125 Superintendent will present a recommendation to the School Board, whose 126 decision shall be final. 127

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- 128 Public issue forums or debates carried on T.E.N. must relate to the channel's e. mission and must comply with copyright laws. Use of T.E.N. by individuals 129 130 seeking public office or reelection is prohibited. The District may provide 131 programming designed to address public policy issues on the ballot or 132 candidate forums that do not advocate a specific position and do not restrict 133 access by all candidates for a specific office, consistent with Policy 2.59. The 134 program content shall be restricted to information and support of voter 135 registration and participation.
- 137f.Duplicates of tapes of original programming produced by T.E.N. may be<br/>available by submitting a request for duplication and paying the fees set forth<br/>in Policy 2.041. Requests should be made at least two weeks prior to the<br/>desired completion date. Certain programming produced for T.E.N. may be<br/>copyrighted by third parties and not subject to duplication for public records<br/>requests.143
- 144g.To the extent allowed under Fla. Stat. Chapter 119, the School Board shall145retain all rights to all material and programs developed by the staff of T.E.N. or146other District employees. To the extent allowed under Chapter 119 and147federal copyright law, works created for hire by employees or contractors on148behalf of the District shall designate ownership of all material or production to149the District. Programming produced by T.E.N. may be marketed or distributed150as directed by the School Board, consistent with Chapter 119.
- 152 7. Emergency Response.-- Channel 19 may be used at any time for the purpose of 153 emergency communication and response, consistent with the interlocal agreement 154 with the Emergency Management Services for cooperative support throughout an 155 identified emergency.
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  157 8. <u>Revisions to Operational Policies and Procedures.--</u> The School Board may 158 modify these policies and procedures at any time through the rulemaking process. 159 <u>The Superintendent may develop administrative procedures for T.E.N., to be</u> 160 recommended for incorporation into this Policy.
