 - iii. The District may cooperate with other media in the delivery, production, broadcast or other use of programming consistent with the mission of <u>T.E.N.</u>
 - iv. Upon recommendation of the Superintendent, the School Board may enter into memoranda of understanding, interlocal agreements, cooperative agreements, or other contracts to further the purpose of producing and distributing educational and cultural programming through <u>T.E.N.</u>
 - d. School Board meetings, workshops, and other public meetings may be covered, to the extent possible, gavel-to-gavel, without editing or interruption. Introductory or supplementary information which will aid the viewer in understanding the context or issues may be provided.
- <u>e. Live-broadcast or videotaped coverage on T.E.N. of Board or public meetings</u>
 <u>shall not be considered an official record of those meetings, and the Board</u>
 <u>shall have no liability for access to or lack of access to coverage of such</u>
