- Development
 - Florida Statutes § 230.23(20) mandates that the Board must adopt a Policy *encouraging* (but not necessarily requiring) large schools to subdivide into a "school-within-a-school" operational program for the 2002-03 school year and thereafter. The statute limits these programs to be operated *within existing resources*.

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4 5	1	The School Board recognizes the Florida Legislature's findings that smaller schools

11	2.	Pursuant to § 235.2157(2), a school on a single campus which operates as a school-

13		each unit located on the single campus meets the standards of this Policy.	
14	3	The term "school-within-a-school" shall be defined as an operational program that	
15	<u>J.</u>	uses flexible scheduling, team planning, and curricular and instructional innovation to	
16		organize groups of students with groups of teachers as smaller units, so as to	
17		functionally operate as a smaller school.	
18	1	As mandated by § 230.23(20), the School Board hereby adopts a policy of	
19	<u> </u>	encouraging (but not requiring) schools to subdivide into "schools-within-a-school" for	
20		the 2002-03 school year and thereafter, if such schools fall within the following	
21		categories:	
22		a. elementary schools with a student population of more than 500 students.	
23		b. middle schools with a student population of more than 700 students.	
24		c. high schools with a student population of more than 900 students.	
25		d. any school serving kindergarten through grade 8 with a student population of	
26		more than 700 students.	
27		e. any school serving kindergarten through grade 12 with a student population of	
28		more than 900.	

5. A school-within-a-school shall operate within existing resources, as required by §

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230.23(20), Fla. Stat.

- When planning for and implementing a school-within-a-school, the school principal
 shall advise and counsel with the Area Superintendent and School Advisory Council
 to develop a program patterned after one of the following models set forth in §
 230.23(20), Fla. Stat., or a similar model:
- a. An organizational arrangement assigning both students and teachers to smaller
 units in which the students take some or all of their coursework with cohorts in
 this group and from the teachers assigned to this smaller unit. A unit may be
 grouped together for either one (1) year or on a vertical, multiyear basis.
 - b. An organizational arrangement similar to that described in paragraph (a), with additional variations in instruction and curriculum. The smaller unit usually seeks to maintain a program different from that of the larger school, or of other smaller units. It may be vertically organized, but is dependent upon the school principal for its existence, budget, and staff.
- 44 c. A separate and autonomous smaller unit formally authorized by the school board
 45 or superintendent. The smaller unit plans and runs its own program, has its own
 46 staff and students, and receives its own separate budget. The smaller unit must
 47 negotiate the use of common space with the larger school and defer to the
 48 building principal on matters of safety and building operation.
- Unless otherwise specifically authorized by the School Board, when a school-within-aschool is created, the school principal shall maintain oversight of all portions of the school site, consistent with School Board Policy 1.014 and § 231.085, Fla. Stat., although the immediate supervision of the smaller unit may be delegated to another administrator.
- 54 <u>8. The establishment of a school-within-a-school will be carried out consistent with</u>
 55 <u>Article IX of the Classroom Teachers Association Collective Bargaining Agreement, or</u>
 56 <u>other applicable collective bargaining Agreement, if said Article or Agreements are</u>
 57 <u>deemed applicable.</u>
