CONSENT ITEM

- This Policy was approved as a first reading for development on March 24, 2003.
- This revision updates the existing Policy to reflect current procedures and inform parents of the requirements of the District's home education program.
- The revision was requested by the District's Home Education Office.
- The proposed Policy revision was reviewed and approved by the District's instructional specialist for home education; the director of Charter Schools and Home Education; an associate superintendent; a principal; a guidance specialist in Student Services; a school guidance coordinator; and a director at PBCC. It was also reviewed by two home education parents, one of whom is the local director for a statewide home education support group.

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THE FLORIDA HOME EDUCATION PROGRAM

- 3 1. Definitions.-- As stated in Fla. Stat. § 1002.01(1), a "home education program" is defined as the sequentially progressive instruction of a student directed by his or 4 5 her parent in order to satisfy the attendance requirements of Fla. Stat. §§ 1002.41, 6 1003.01(4), and 1003.21(1). The District's home education program includes students age-appropriate for kindergarten through age 18. As used herein, 7 8 "parent" means "either or both parents of a student, any guardian of a student, any 9 person in a parental relationship to a student, or any person exercising supervisory 10 authority over a student in place of the parent," as defined in Fla. Stat. § 11 1000.21(5).
- 12 2. **District Responsibilities.--**The Superintendent shall establish procedures District's Home Education Office is the Superintendent's designee to receive and 13 review correspondence notification from parents who are operating directing home 14 education programs, maintain a files of home education students' names, apply the 15 access and privacy provisions of Fla. Stat. § 1002.22 to any student records or 16 17 reports created, maintained, or used by the Home Education Office, and review 18 and evaluate the results of annual educational evaluations of home education 19 students in the District.
- Initiating a Home Education Program. -- Pursuant to Fla. Stat. § 1002.41(1)(a), a parent residing in Palm Beach County who desires to direct a home education program for his/her school-age child shall submit a Notice of Intent by U.S. mail, fax, or hand delivery to the Home Education Office of the School District within 30 days of establishing a home education program.
- 25 a. The Notice of Intent shall be in writing, signed and dated by the parent and shall include the full name, address, and birthdate of each child who will be registered with the Home Education Office.
- b. <u>If the child is already enrolled in a public or private school, the withdrawal</u> process should be completed prior to initiating the home education program.
- 30 c. <u>Parents directing home education programs should be familiar with, and are responsible for complying with, Fla. Stat. § 1002.41, "Home Education Programs."</u>
- 4. Portfolio Requirement.-- As required by Fla. Stat. § 1002.41(1)(b), the parent directing a home education program shall maintain a portfolio of records and materials, consisting of a log of educational activities, ensuring that the log is made contemporaneously with instruction, designates by title any reading materials

- used, and includes samples of any writings, worksheets, workbooks, or creative
 materials used or developed by the student.
- a. The portfolio shall be preserved by the parent for two (2) years and shall be made available for inspection by the Home Education Office upon 15 days'
 written notice.

- b. Students with a prior pattern of public school nonattendance may be subject to regular monthly portfolio reviews in accordance with Fla. Stat. § 1003.26(1)(f) until the home education review committee reaches consensus that the student's home education program is in compliance with Fla. Stat. § 1002.41(1)(b).
 - i. If the parent fails to provide a portfolio to the committee, the Home Education Office, as the Superintendent's designee, shall terminate the home education program as required by Fla. Stat. § 1003.26(1)(f)2, and the parent shall be required to enroll the child within three (3) days in an attendance option that satisfies regular school attendance in: a public school; a parochial, religious, denominational, or other private school; or private tutoring program that meets the requirements of Fla. Stat. § 1002.43.
 - ii. Pursuant to § 1003.26(1)(f)2, a parent whose home education program is terminated under this paragraph shall not be eligible to reenroll the child in a home education program for 180 calendar days.
- 58 5. Annual Evaluation.-- As required by Fla. Stat. § 1002.41(c), the parent must provide for an annual evaluation demonstrating that the student's educational progress is commensurate with his/her ability.
 - a. The annual evaluation must be submitted by each anniversary date of the student's registration with the Home Education Office and must comply with the requirements of § 1002.41(c)1, 2, 3, 4, or 5. One acceptable method of satisfying § 1002.41(c)5 is providing an official transcript from an accredited correspondence/distance learning institution.
 - b. The <u>Home Education Office</u>, as the Superintendent's <u>designee</u>, shall <u>review</u> the results of the annual evaluation and notify the parents of home education students regarding their probationary status if the students' progress is not at a level commensurate with their abilities. The <u>Superintendent Home Education Office</u> shall review and re-evaluate probationary students' evaluations at the end of one year to determine if remediation has been achieved. Removal of probationary status and continuation of a home education program are

- contingent upon the student's demonstrating educational progress commensurate with his/her ability at the end of the probationary period.
- 75 6. <u>Eligibility for Public Participation</u>.-- Registered home education students are eligible to participate in certain public education programs as follows:

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- a. An individual home education student shall be eligible to participate in: the interscholastic extracurricular activities at a public school assigned by the District, provided the conditions of Section 232.425(3)(c) Fla. Stat. § 1006.15(3)(c), Florida Statutes, are met; the Bright Futures Scholarship Program in accordance with §§ 1009.53-1009.539; and dual enrollment programs in accordance with §§ 1007.27(4) and 1007.271(10). Home education students are eligible for: admission to community colleges in accordance with § 1007.263 and admission to state universities in accordance with § 1007.261.
- b. Home education students may receive testing and evaluation services at diagnostic and resource centers in accordance with § 1006.03. Home education students may access some instruction at their zoned public school if the class is available and related to an interscholastic extracurricular activity in which the home education student participates at the zoned school and/or if the class is related to the student's Individual Education Plan (IEP) for exceptional student education.
- 7. Instructional Materials.-- The parent of a home education student shall be responsible for obtaining and paying for instructional materials; the District does not provide books, curricula, or materials for home education students. However, book series no longer in use in the District may be available, from the District's textbook depository, for lending or free disposition to the public pursuant to Fla. Stat. § 1006.41.
- 99 Support Groups: Neutrality .-- Solely for the convenience of parents directing home education programs, the Home Education Office is authorized to provide a 100 101 list of home education support groups, which may be able to provide assistance 102 with curriculum, instruction, annual evaluations, and other educational matters of 103 interest to those directing a home education program. However, provision of such 104 list shall not imply any direct or indirect endorsement or sponsorship of any group 105 on the list, and the District shall not be responsible for any act or omission of any 106 such independent support group.
- 9. <u>Termination of the Home Education Program .-- If the student's home education program is discontinued, a written notice of termination shall be filed by the parent program is discontinued.</u>

109	with the Home Education Office, as the designee of the Superintendent, within 30
110	days after such termination, as required by Fla. Stat. § 1002.41(1)(a).
111	10. Enrollment in Public School If a home education student enrolls full-time in a
112	public school within the District, grade placement and transferable credits shall be
113	determined by the school administrator(s) in accordance with School Board policies
114	such as 8.022, 8.20, and the Student Progression Plan. The student's home
115	education curriculum, portfolio, and evaluations may be reviewed at the school
116	prior to placement or credit decisions.
117	11. Diploma. The District is not authorized to provide a regular high school diploma
118	to home education students. However, such students may take the General
119	Education Development (GED) test at an adult education center and be awarded a
120	GED diploma by the State of Florida if the student achieves a passing score.
121	Alternatively, the student may be eligible to receive a diploma from an accredited
122	correspondence or distance learning program if the student has completed the high
123	school course of study required by such institution. Parents may access a list of
124	regionally accredited institutions, without any implication of the endorsement by the
125	District, from the Home Education Office.
