## **CONSULTANT EVALUATION**

Participants will complete an evaluation form, and the Director of Instructional Enhancement will write a summative statement based on the participants' responses to substantiate the extent to which the consultant(s) fulfilled the following goals:

 To present the root causes of racism and how they impact educational objectives and goals in the school district

 To facilitate the understanding of internal and external factors and implications associated with racism among the participants

Based on participants' evaluations, the facilitators did an exceptional job of presenting the root causes of racism and the history of the racist paradigm in the country. There was some controversy regarding the definition of the term "racist" with a good number of participants disagreeing with the facilitators' definition. However, there was overall agreement regarding the dire implications of the racism for certain groups and a broad understanding of how white privilege favors some and harms others.

While participants generally applauded the presentation, many expressed that they would have liked to have learned how the implications of racism impact educational objectives and district goals. In other words, many questioned how what they learned can transfer into the classroom and improve student achievement among all groups of students. Internal and external factors were well developed and explored. However, participants would have benefited from follow-up projects and action research to determine how the negative effects of racism can indeed be 'undone.'

 To facilitate the group in creating solutions to racism results and negative effects in school district operations

As discussed in previous paragraphs, the facilitators from the Peoples' Institute were experts who very effectively presented the curriculum. However, there is no adequate follow-up and workplace transfer component in the curriculum. Therefore, the extent to which the outstanding presentation corrected the effects of racism in schools is an unanswered question.
