Question: #1

On page 18 of the RFP you are asking if the firm has a Certified Indoor Air Quality Manager (CIAQM) on staff. Is this really the type of certification the School District wants?

Answer:

According to the American Indoor Air Quality Council which offers the CIAQM certification, successful candidates must have a combination of education and/or experience in property management, facilities management, asset management, corporate policy making or as a corporate advisor to qualify for certification.

The same organization offers the Certified Indoor Air Quality Consultant (CIAQC) certification that requires a 4 year scientific college degree and a minimum of three years of documented field experience in conducting indoor air quality investigations.

MZA feels this or a similar certification that meets the same criteria may be more appropriate for the type of services described in Section 1.2 of the RFP.

District Response: If you do not have a CIAQM on staff, the answer would be NO. There is room for additional comments on the page. That would be the appropriate space to list other pertinent certifications.

Question: #2

Section 1.2 states that the RFP is on an "as needed" basis with no guarantee of work quantity. Section 30.2 and Attachment "C" and "D" of the RFP require that a responder list the extent of MWBE participation based on percentage and dollar amount. Does the School District have a dollar value in mind for the services to be rendered based on historical need? Is this dollar value broken down by trade; i.e. plumber, electrician, mold remediation, etc.?

Answer:

District Response: No, there is no dollar value or project identified.

Question: #3

Would the School District consider creating a separate service category that allows professional services firms such as environmental consulting and architecture/engineering firms to propose on professional services including inspection, testing and design services without construction services? This avoids the inherent conflict of interest that results from having construction work and approval of the work performed by the same entity. This also solves an insurance problem that arises from the differences between contracting firms and professional services firms. As written Category A allows contracting firms to propose based on insurance carried in their ordinary course of business. However, a professional firm would have to purchase very expensive and relatively unavailable design-build insurance in order to propose. This makes it difficult and expensive for a professional firm to propose as the lead for Category A services and may severely restrict response to this category.

Answer:

District Response: NO, Category A firms should have the capability of providing a "turn-key" operation for the project, whether or not the District uses the turn-key or just the consulting portion. Category A firms should have the capabilities on staff or through subcontractors to perform all services. The District will decide on an individual project basis, which categories or part of categories to use.

1.0 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 This is a Request for Proposal (RFP) for INDOOR AIR QUALITY SERVICES to the School District of Palm Beach County, Florida (the District).
- 1.2 These services will be broken into categories A, B and C. Please submit your proposal ONLY under one category, which best fits the services your firm is most capable of providing.

<u>Category A</u>: Firms responding to this category will need to be a "turn-key" operation, providing investigation, defining work scope, and putting together a team to remediate and correct the Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) problem. Companies may be required to testify in legal proceedings and should be able to interpret medical evaluations and the relationship to IAQ complaints. Companies submitting under Category A should have staff able to perform IAQ investigations and provide corrective recommendations. They should have staff or subcontractors to perform corrective actions that would be all encompassing including all services under categories B and C as well as laboratory services.

<u>Category B</u>: Firms responding to this category will need to provide the District with services that include corrective actions needed and identified by District staff or firms awarded from Category A. District staff will provide the scope of work. These services are to include, HVAC services, mold mitigation, drywall repair and painting, and general cleaning. Work connected to those services may also include plumbing, electrical, carpentry, and painting needs as well as furniture moving & storage.

<u>Category C</u>: Firms responding to this category will need to provide general cleaning services, who can provide complete cleaning of building surfaces and furnishings. The scope of work will be provided by the District on a job by job basis.

All services will be on an "as needed" basis with no guarantee of work quantity. All work will be performed in compliance with District accepted industry standards and by firms holding appropriate licenses, permits and insurance. The District may use any combination of awarded firms regardless of category at its discretion.

The District will select a minimum of 3 firms from each category as outlined above. Work will be assigned by firms submitting a "not to exceed" price for large projects and for small projects the District will assign all work in a manner to benefit the District in relation to cost and schedule. The District will determine which category(s) of contractor to use dependent upon District needs for each project.

- 1.3 All terms and conditions of this RFP, any addendum, proposer's submissions and negotiated terms, are incorporated into the contract by reference as set forth herein.
- 1.4 Document files may be examined, during normal working hours, ten days after proposals have been opened.

2.0 <u>INSTRUCTIONS TO PROPOSER</u>

- All proposals must be received no later than 2:00 PM, on February 28, 2005. If a proposal is transmitted by US Mail or other delivery medium, the proposer(s) will be responsible for its timely delivery to the Department of Purchasing, Suite A-323, 3300 Forest Hill Boulevard, West Palm Beach, Florida 33406-5813.
- Any proposal received after the stated time and date, will not be considered and will be returned unopened to the proposer(s) after the RFP posting period has expired.
- One manually signed original and SEVEN (7) photocopies of the proposal must be sealed in one package and clearly labeled "REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL FOR INDOOR AIR QUALITY SERVICES" on the outside of the package. The legal name, address, proposer's contact person, and telephone number must also be clearly annotated on the outside of the package.
- 2.4 All proposals must be signed by an officer or employee having authority to legally bind the proposer(s).
- 2.5 Any corrections of unit prices must be initialed. This includes corrections made using correction fluid (white out) or any other method of correction.
- 2.6 Proposer should become familiar with any local conditions which may, in any manner, affect the services required. The proposer(s) is/are required to carefully examine the RFP terms and to become thoroughly familiar with any and all conditions and requirements that may in any manner affect the work to be performed under the contract. No additional allowance will be made due to lack of knowledge of these conditions.
- 2.7 Proposals not conforming to the instructions provided herein will be subject to disqualification at the sole option of the District.
- 2.8 Any proposal may be withdrawn prior to the date and time the proposals are due. Any proposal not withdrawn will constitute an irrevocable offer, for a period of 90 days, to provide the District with the services specified in the proposal.
- 2.9 DELIVERY OF RFPS: When hand delivering your RFP, bidders must follow the School District's security access procedures. The procedures are as follows:

 - C. Present RFP to Purchasing Department receptionist for official date/time stamping.

- Response to inquiries regarding the status of a proposal must not be made prior to the posting of 3.3 award recommendation.

4.0 **AWARD**

- 4.1 The District reserves the right to accept or reject any or all proposals.
- The District reserves the right to waive any irregularities and technicalities and may, at its sole 4.2 discretion, request a clarification or other information to evaluate any or all proposals.
- The District reserves the right, before awarding the contract, to require proposer(s) to submit 4.3 evidence of qualifications or any other information the District may deem necessary.
- The District reserves the right, prior to Board approval, to cancel the RFP or portions thereof, 4.4 without penalty.
- The District reserves the right to: (1) accept the proposals of any or all of the items it deems, at 4.5 its sole discretion, to be in the best interest of the District; and (2) the District reserves the right to reject any and/or all items proposed or award to multiple proposers.
- The proposal with the highest number of points will be ranked first; however, nothing herein will 4.6 prevent the School Board of Palm Beach County, Florida, from making multiple awards and to deem all proposals responsive, and to assign work to any firm deemed responsive.
- 4.7 The District reserves the right to further negotiate any proposal, including price, with the highest rated proposer. If an agreement cannot be reached with the highest rated proposer, the District reserves the right to negotiate and recommend award to the next highest proposer or subsequent proposers until an agreement is reached.

5.0 **TERM OF CONTRACT / RENEWAL**

The term of this contract shall be for five years from the date of award. If needed, the contract 5.1 will be extended 90 days beyond the contract expiration date. The awardee will be notified when the Board has acted upon the recommendation. All prices shall be firm for the first two years. Beginning in year three, price increases may be requested if presented in writing a minimum of 30 days in advance of the next term. All submitted price changes must be based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI). The awardee agrees to this condition by signing their proposal.

9.0 SCOPE OF SERVICES

9.1 The District has a diverse array of indoor air quality (IAQ) service requirements. Some examples of these requirements include: "turn-key" operations, providing investigation, defining work scope, testifying in legal proceedings, HVAC services, mold mitigation, drywall repair and painting, and general cleaning services.

10.0 **EVALUATION COMMITTEE MEETINGS**

10.1 As stated in Section 3.1 and Section 12.2 a committee will be convened on March 9,2005 @ 1 PM at the Fulton Holland Educational Services Center, 3300 Forest Hill Blvd., West Palm Beach, FL. to review and evaluate responsive proposals, for the purposes of making a decision as to an intended award. Per <u>F.S. 286.011</u>, this is an open public meeting. Notification will also be posted for review by interested parties at the School District Purchasing Department, 3300 Forest Hill Boulevard, Suite A-323, West Palm Beach, FL 33406.

11.0 PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION

- 11.1 In order to maintain comparability and enhance the review process, it is requested that proposals be organized in the manner specified below. Include all information in your proposal. It is required that SEVEN (7) copies of the proposal be submitted with the original proposal.
- 11.2 <u>Title Page:</u> Show the RFP number, subject, name of the proposer, address, telephone number, email address and the date.
- 11.3 <u>Table of Contents</u>: Include a clear identification of the material by section and by page number.
- 11.4 <u>Letter of Transmittal</u>: Give the names of the persons who will be authorized to make representations for the proposer, their titles, addresses and telephone numbers.
- 11.5 <u>Request for Proposal</u>: Required Response Form (page 1 of RFP) with all required information completed and all signatures as specified.
- 11.6 <u>Experience and Qualifications of the Firm</u>: Provide a list of five major clients for whom your firm has provided Indoor Air Quality Services during the past 5 years. Include the following information: Name of client, contact name with phone number, dates of service, type of service provided and a brief description of the project. The District may contact these references as well as others that may have used your firm.

- 11.7 Qualifications of Staff: Give the names of individuals who will be assigned to this contract, including their resumes and expand on their experience in the area they will be serving.
- 11.8 <u>Firm's Location and Time Consideration</u>: Geographical location of the firm, field staff and subcontractors will be considered regarding how it relates to availability and timely scheduling of services I.E. response time to mobilize to or in Palm Beach County for both regularly scheduled work and emergencies such as hurricane recovery efforts. List the address, days and hours of operation. State whether staff assigned to this project are available for emergencies and or how your firm could respond from a staffing level.
- 11.9 <u>Capabilities of the Firm</u>: Identify your capabilities by completing Attachment A; based on which category A, B or C, your firm is submitting a proposal for.
- 11.10 <u>Cost of Services</u>: Provide a fee schedule for all personnel and services that may be used in the performance of this contract, in addition to completing the list outlined in Attachment B. Costs must remain fixed for the duration of this contract as outlined in Section 5.1.
- 11.11 Minority/Women Business Participation: Proposers are to indicate the extent and nature of the M/WBE's scope of work with specificity as it relates to the services described in the RFP. Proposers shall provide certification with the District, or the State of Florida, Office of Supplier Diversity, or its successors. Proposers that are District, or State of Florida Office of Supplier Diversity, or its successors certified minority, women, or disadvantage business enterprises, at the time of submittal, will be awarded a maximum of ten points. Maximum points will be awarded for 15% or greater minority participation. Points will be pro-rated for less than 15% minority participation. Proposers that do not meet the above requirement may sub-contract minority business participation in accordance with Section 30.0 and receive participation points

Points for utilization of certified M/WBE subcontractors shall be assigned as follows:

15% and over 10 points

9% - 14% 8 points

4% - 8% 6 points

1% - 3% 4 points

0% 0 points

11.12 <u>Insurance</u>: Provide proof of your company's insurance as required in Section 21.0 of this RFP or submit a letter of your intention to have the required insurance within ten days of notification by the District.

12.0 PROPOSAL EVALUATION PROCESS:

- 12.1 RFPs are received and publicly opened. Only names of respondents are read at this time.
- 12.2 An Evaluation Committee, consisting of District personnel, will convene, review and discuss all proposals submitted. Purchasing personnel will participate in an advisory capacity only.
- 12.3 The Evaluation Committee will assign points in the evaluation and recommendation process in accordance with the evaluation criteria listed in Evaluation Criteria, Section 13.0. and rank all proposals accordingly.
- The Evaluation Committee reserves the right to interview any or all proposers and to require a formal presentation with the key people who will administer and be assigned to work on the contract before recommendation of award. This interview is to be based upon the written proposal received.

- 12.5 The Evaluation Committee or their designees reserves the right to negotiate further terms and conditions, including price with the highest ranked proposer. If a mutually beneficial agreement with the first ranked proposer or all proposers being considered for award cannot be resolved, the negotiation committee reserves the right to enter into negotiations with the next highest ranked proposer and continue this process until agreement is reached with the number of programs required to meet the needs of the District.
- 12.6 The results of the evaluation committee is reviewed and approved by the Department Director and the Purchasing Director prior to posting the recommendation.
- 12.7 The Purchasing Department will prepare and submit an agenda item to the Superintendent of Schools, Palm Beach County, Florida.
- 12.8 The Superintendent will recommend to the School Board, the award or rejection of any and/or all proposal(s).
- 12.9 The School Board will award or reject any or all proposal(s).

13.0 EVALUATION CRITERIA

The Evaluation Committee shall rank all proposals received, which meet the submittal requirements, in order to establish a pool of qualified proposers. Each category, A, B or C, as outlined in Section 1.2 will be compared independently. I.e. only respondents for Category A will be ranked together.

Qualified proposers will be issued purchase orders authorizing a maximum cost of services on an as-needed basis although there is no guarantee of work by the District.

14.0 CANCELLATION OF AWARD/TERMINATION

14.1 In the event any of the provisions of this proposal are violated by the proposer(s), the Superintendent or designee will give written notice to the proposer(s) stating the deficiencies and unless the deficiencies are corrected within ten (10) days, recommendation will be made to the District for immediate cancellation. Upon cancellation hereunder, the District may pursue any and all legal remedies as provided herein and by law. In the event that it is subsequently

determined that a cancellation under this paragraph was incorrect, the termination shall be converted to a termination for convenience pursuant to the next paragraph.

- 14.2 The District, reserves the right to terminate any contract resulting from this RFP, at any time and for no reason, upon giving 30 days prior written notice to the other party. If said contract should be terminated for convenience as provided herein, the District will be relieved of all obligations under said contract. The District will only be required to pay to the proposer(s) that amount of the contract actually performed to the date of termination.
- 14.3 The awardee(s) will have the option to terminate the contract upon written notice to the Director of Purchasing. Such notice must be received at least 90 days prior to the effective date of termination.
- 14.4 Cancellation of contract by awardee may result in removal from bidders/proposer list for a period of three years.

15.0 FUNDING OUT, TERMINATION, CANCELLATION

- 15.1 Florida School Laws prohibit School Board from creating obligations on anticipation of budgeted revenues from one fiscal year to another without year-to-year extension provisions in the agreements.
- 15.2 It is necessary that fiscal funding out provisions be included in all RFPs in which the terms are for periods of longer than one year.
- 15.3 Therefore, the following funding out provisions are an integral part of this RFP and must be agreed to by all proposers:

The School Board may, during the contract period, terminate or discontinue the services covered in this RFP for lack of appropriated funds upon the same terms and conditions as set forth in Section 14.0, Cancellation of Award / Termination.

Such prior written notice will state:

- a. That the lack of appropriated funds is the reason for termination, and
- b. Agreement not to replace the services being terminated with services similar to those covered in this RFP from another vendor in the succeeding funding period.

"This written notification will thereafter release the School Board of all further obligations in any way related to such equipment covered herein".

This completed statement must be included as part of any contract submitted by the successful proposer. No contract will be considered that does not include this provision for "funding out".

16.0 DEFAULT

In the event that the awarded proposer(s) should breach this contract the District reserves the right to seek remedies in law and/or in equity.

17.0 DEBARMENT

17.1 The Board shall have the authority to debar a person / corporation for cause for consideration or award of future contracts. The debarment shall be for a period commensurate with the

seriousness of the causes, generally not to exceed three (3) years. When the offense is willful or blatant, a longer term of debarment may be imposed, up to an indefinite period.

18.0 <u>LEGAL REQUIREMENTS</u>

- 18.1 It shall be the responsibility of the contractor to be knowledgeable of all federal, state, county and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations and School Board Policy that in any manner affect the items covered herein which may apply. Specifically, proposer(s) is to adhere to School Board Policies 3.12 and 3.13, pursuant to the following, with respect to any criminal arrests and convictions, and is on notice thereto that any employees involved in any Chapter 435, Florida Statutes offenses are precluded from continuing to work on the project and must be replaced. Failure to comply may result in the immediate termination of the vendor's contract at the sole discretion of the School District. Lack of knowledge by the proposer(s) will in no way be a cause for relief from responsibility.
- Proposer(s) doing business with the District are prohibited from discriminating against any employee, applicant, or client because of race, creed, color, national origin, religion, sex or age with regard to but not limited to the following: employment practices, rates of pay or other compensation methods, and training selection.

19.0 FEDERAL AND STATE TAX

19.1 The District is exempt from federal and state taxes for tangible personal property. The Purchasing Department Coordinator will sign an exemption certificate submitted by the successful proposer(s). Proposer(s) doing business with the District will not be exempted from paying sales tax to their suppliers for materials to fulfill contractual obligations with the District, nor will any proposer be authorized to use the District's Tax Exemption Number in securing such materials.

20.0 CONFLICT OF INTEREST

All proposers must disclose the name of any officer, director, or agent who is also an employee of the District. All proposers must disclose the name of any District employee who owns, directly or indirectly, any interest in the proposers' business or any of its branches.

21.0 INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

- 21.1 Proof of the following insurance will be furnished by the awarded proposers/bidders to the School District of Palm Beach County by Certificate of Insurance. All insurance must be issued by a company or companies approved by the School District.
- Original Certificates of Insurance meeting the specific required provision specified within this contract/agreement shall be forwarded to the Palm Beach County School District's Purchasing Department, ATTN: Nancy Kowalczyk, Senior Purchasing Agent, and approved prior to the start of any work or the possession of any school property. Renewal certificates must be forwarded to the same department prior to the policy renewal date.
- 21.3 Thirty days written notice must be provided to the Palm Beach County School District via certified mail in the event of cancellation. The notice must be sent to the Purchasing Department.
- The awarded bidders shall provide complete copies of any insurance policy for required coverage within seven days of the date of request by the Purchasing Department but in any respect at least 30 days prior to the commencement of any term. For all contracts with a bid amount of

\$500,000 or more the actual INSURANCE POLICY must be included with the Certificate of Insurance.

- A. WORKERS' COMPENSATION: Proposer(s) must comply with FSS 440, Workers' Compensation and Employees' Liability Insurance with minimum statutory limits.
- B. COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY: Awarded proposers/bidders shall procure and maintain, for the life of this contract/agreement, Commercial General Liability Insurance. This policy shall provide coverage for death, bodily injury, personal injury, products and completed operations liability and property damage that could arise directly or indirectly from the performance of this agreement. It must be an occurrence form policy. THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OF PALM BEACH COUNTY SHALL BE NAMED AS AN ADDITIONAL INSURED ON THE CERTIFICATE FOR COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY INSURANCE.

The minimum limits of coverage shall be \$ 1,000,000 per occurrence, Combined, Single Limit for Bodily Injury Liability and Property Damage Liability.

C. BUSINESS AUTOMOBILE LIABILITY: Awarded proposers/bidders shall procure and maintain, for the life of the contract/agreement, Business Automobile Liability Insurance. THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OF PALM BEACH COUNTY SHALL BE NAMED AS AN ADDITIONAL INSURED ON THE CERTIFICATE FOR BUSINESS AUTOMOBILE LIABILITY INSURANCE.

The minimum limits of coverage shall be \$ 1,000,000 per occurrence, Combined Single Limit for Bodily Injury Liability and Property Damage Liability. This coverage shall be an "Any Auto" form policy. The insurance must be an occurrence form policy.

In the event the contractor does not own any vehicles, we will accept hired and non-owned coverage in the amounts listed above. In addition, we will require an affidavit signed by the contractor indicating the following:

D. PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY: The awarded proposer/bidder shall procure and maintain Professional Liability Insurance for the life of this contract/agreement, plus two years after completion. This insurance shall provide coverage against such liability resulting from this contract. The minimum limits of coverage shall be \$500,000 with a deductible not to exceed \$5,000. The deductible shall be the responsibility of the insured. Professional liability policies shall include an endorsement whereby the awarded bidder holds harmless the Palm Beach County School District and each officer, agent and employee of the Palm Beach County School District against all claims, against any of them, for personal injury or wrongful death or property damage arising out of the negligent performance of professional services or caused by an error, omission or negligent act of the awarded bidder or anyone employed by the awarded bidder.

This policy must be continued or tail coverage provided for two years after completion of the project. This is a requirement for firms responding under Category A.

22.0 INDEMNIFICATION / HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT

- Awarded proposers/bidders shall, in addition to any other obligation to indemnify the Palm Beach County School District and to the fullest extent permitted by law, protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless the School District, their agents, officers, elected officials and employees from and against all claims, actions, liabilities, losses (including economic losses), costs arising out of any actual or alleged;
 - A. bodily injury, sickness, disease or death, or injury to or destruction of tangible property including the loss of use resulting therefrom, or any other damage or loss arising out of, or claimed to have resulted in whole or in part from any actual or alleged act or omission of the contractor, subcontractor, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, of anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable in the performance of the work; or
 - B. violation of law, statute, ordinance, governmental administration order, rule or regulation by contractor in the performance of the work; or
 - C. liens, claims or actions made by the contractor or any subcontractor or other party performing the work.
- 22.2 The indemnification obligations hereunder shall not be limited to any limitation on the amount, type of damages, compensation or benefits payable by or for the contractor of any subcontractor under workers' compensation acts; disability benefit acts, other employee benefit acts or any statutory bar.
- 22.3 This article will survive the termination of this contract.

23.0 PUBLIC RECORDS LAW

All proposal documents or other materials submitted by the proposer in response to this RFP will be open for inspection by any person and in accord with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes.

24.0 PERMITS AND LICENSES

24.1 The proposer(s) will be responsible for obtaining any necessary permits and licenses and will comply with laws, rules, and regulations whether state or federal and with all local codes and ordinances without additional cost to the District.

25.0 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

The proposer(s) will indemnify and hold harmless, the District from liability of any nature or kind, including costs and expenses for or on account of any copyrighted, service marked, trademarked, patented or un-patented invention, process, article or work manufactured or used in the performance of the contract, including its use by the District. If the proposer(s) uses any design, device, materials or works covered by letters, service mark, trademark, patent, copyright or any other intellectual property right, it is mutually agreed and understood without exception that the proposal prices will include all royalties of costs arising from the use of such design, device, or materials in any way involved in the work.

This article will survive the termination of any contract with the School District.

26.0 <u>COST INCURRED IN RESPONDING</u>

All costs directly or indirectly related to proposal preparation, representation or clarification shall be the sole responsibility of and be borne by the proposer.

27.0 SUB-CONTRACTS

- 27.1 Nothing contained in this specification will be construed as establishing any contractual relationship between any sub-proposer(s) and the District.
- 27.2 The proposer(s) will be fully responsible to the District for the acts and omissions of the subproposer(s) and their employees.
- 27.3 After award of contract, any changes in subcontractors or subproposers requires prior School District written approval.

28.0 INDULGENCE

28.1 Indulgence by the District on any non-compliance by the proposer does not constitute a waiver of any rights under this RFP.

29.0 JOINT PROPOSAL

In the event multiple proposers submit a joint proposal in response to the RFP, a single proposer shall be identified as the Prime Vendor. If offering a joint proposal, Prime Vendor must include the name and address of all parties of the joint proposal. Prime Vendor shall provide all bonding and insurance requirements, execute any Contract, complete the REQUIRED RESPONSE FORM shown herein, have overall and complete accountability to resolve any dispute arising within this contract. Only a single contract with one proposer shall be acceptable. Prime Vendor responsibilities shall include, but not be limited to, performing of overall contract administration, preside over other proposers participating or present at District meetings, oversee preparation of reports and presentations, and file any notice of protest and final protest as described herein. Prime Vendor shall also prepare and present a consolidated invoice(s) for services performed. The District shall issue only one check for each consolidated invoice to the Prime Vendor for services performed. Prime Vendor shall remain responsible for performing services associated with response to this RFP.

30.0 <u>SUB-CONTRACTING/MINORITY BUSINESS PARTICIPATION</u>

- 30.1 The District strongly encourages the use of Minority/Woman owned business enterprises for participation as associates, joint-venturers, prime proposers, and sub-proposers in contracting opportunities.
- In order to receive evaluation credit for M/WBE participants, the proposer or firm(s) to be utilized by the proposer must be certified by the District or the State of Florida at the time that the proposals are due. In order to receive evaluation credit for M/WBE participation, the proposal must identify the specific certified M/WBE firm or firms upon which evaluation credit is sought, shall indicate the extent and nature of the M/WBE's work, and shall include the percentage of the total engagement which will be received by the M/WBE firm in connection with the proposal. M/WBE participation in auxiliary services (e.g., graphics, printing and other services) is acceptable but will only be given evaluation credit if it augments the primary service of this RFP.

This form must be submitted with all requests for payment.
- 30.4 Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) indicates a business entity which is owned and operated by a minority. In this instance, minority or handicapped group members are citizens of the United States or lawfully admitted permanent residents who are African American, Hispanics, Women, Native Americans, Asian-Pacific, Asian-Indian, and eligible others as outlined in Administrative Order 1-18.
- The Palm Beach County School District only recognizes as acceptable for certification as minority/woman business enterprises those firms, vendors, and consultants that have successfully completed the certification requirements of the State of Florida Office of Supplier Diversity or the Palm Beach County School District's Office of Diversity in Business Practices. In the case of those firms or small business enterprises that are certified with the State of Florida Office of Supplier Diversity the firm shall be required to include a copy of their certification letter or certificate. The letter or certificate will only be deemed valid if the dates for certification have not expired. Any pending application with the Palm Beach County School District or the State of Florida Office of Supplier Diversity shall not be considered as certification of the vendor making application for consideration as a M/WBE firm.

31.0 PUBLIC ENTITY CRIMES

- A person or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime may not submit a bid/RFP on a contract to provide any goods or services to a public entity, may not submit a bid/RFP on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work, may not submit bids/RFPs on leases of real property to a public entity, may not be awarded or perform work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor, or consultant under a contract with any public entity, and may not transact business with any public entity in excess of the threshold amount provided in Section 287.017, for CATEGORY TWO for a period of 36 months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list.
- The proposer(s) certifies by submission of this RFP, that neither it nor its principals is presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by any State or Federal department/agency.

32.0 USE OF OTHER CONTRACTS

32.1 The District reserves the right to utilize any other District contract, any State of Florida Contract, any contract awarded by any other city or county governmental agencies, any other school board, any other community college/state university system cooperative bid agreement, or to directly

negotiate/purchase per School Board policy and/or State Board Rule <u>6A-1.012(6)</u> in lieu of any offer received or award made as a result of this bid, if it is in the best interest to do so. The District also reserves the right to separately bid any single order or to purchase any item on this bid if it is in its best interest to do so.

33.0 ASSIGNMENT OF CONTRACT AND/OR PAYMENT

- The proposer shall not enter into subcontracts, or assign, transfer, convey, sublet, or otherwise dispose of the ensuing contract, or any or all of its right, title or interest herein, or its power to execute such contract to any person, company, or corporation without prior written consent of the District.
- The proposer will be prohibited from publishing or releasing any information related to the requested services without the prior written permission of the School District. All reports and other documents resulting from the ensuing contract will remain the sole property of the District.

34.0 REQUIREMENTS FOR PERSONNEL ENTERING DISTRICT PROPERTY

- Possession of firearms will not be tolerated on School District property; nor will violations of Federal and State laws and any applicable School Board policy regarding Drug Free Workplace be tolerated. Violations will be subject to the immediate termination provision heretofore stated in Section 18.1.
- 34.2 "Firearm" means any weapon (including a starter gun or antique firearm) which will, is designed to, or may readily be converted to expel a projectile by the action of an explosive; the frame or receiver of any such weapon; any destructive device; or any machine gun.
- No person who has a firearm in their vehicle may park their vehicle on School District property. Furthermore, no person may possess or bring a firearm on School District property.
- 34.4 If any employee of an independent contractor or sub-contractor is found to have brought a firearm on School District property, said employee will be terminated from the School Board project by the independent contractor or sub-contractor. If the sub-contractor fails to terminate said employee, the sub-contractor's agreement with the independent contractor for the School Board project shall be terminated. If the independent contractor fails to terminate said employee or fails to terminate the agreement with the sub-contractor who fails to terminate said employee, the independent contractor's agreement with the School Board shall be terminated.
- Proposers are advised that they are responsible to ensure that no employee, agent or representative of their company who has been convicted or who is currently under investigation for a crime against children in accordance with <u>FS 435.04</u> will enter onto any school site.

35.0 AGREEMENT

A purchase order and/or a contract will be released, after award, for any work to be performed as a result of this RFP. Should there be any conflict between the terms of the RFP, response to the RFP (proposal), and the terms of the agreement (Sample Contract), the terms of the agreement shall be final and binding and the RFP shall control where in conflict with the proposal. If proposer requires an additional contract, then proposer should include their sample contract as an attachment to the proposal submitted for review.

36.0 POSTING OF RFP CONDITIONS / SPECIFICATIONS

Failure to file a specification protest within the time prescribed in §120.57(3), Florida Statutes, will constitute a waiver of proceedings under Chapter 120, Florida Statutes, and applicable Board rules, regulations and policies.

37.0 POSTING OF RFP RECOMMENDATION / TABULATIONS

- 37.1 RFP recommendations and tabulations will be posted at the Fulton Holland Educational Services Center, Purchasing Department for review by interested parties, at 3300 Forest Hill Boulevard, Third Floor, A-Wing Suite A-323, West Palm Beach, FL, on March 11, 2005 at 3:00 p.m., and will remain posted for a period of 72 hours. If the RFP tabulation with recommended awards is not posted by said date and time, A "Notice of Delay of Posting" will be posted to inform all proposers of the new posting date and time.
- Any person adversely affected by the decision or intended decision must file a notice of protest, in writing, within 72 hours after the posting. The formal written protest shall state with particularity the facts and law upon which the protest is based. On the event the Purchasing Department receives late bid(s), the return of the sealed bid(s) will be after the posting period has expired.
- Any person who files an action protesting an RFP specification, a decision or intended decision pertaining to this RFP pursuant to FS 120.57(3)(b), shall post with the Purchasing Department, at the time of filing the formal written protest, a bond secured by an acceptable surety company in Florida payable to the School District of Palm Beach County in an amount equal to 1 percent (1%) of the total estimated contract value, but not less than \$500 nor more than \$5,000. DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE CERTIFICATION

Preference must be given to vendors submitting a certification with their bid/proposal certifying they have a drug-free workplace in accordance with Section <u>287.087</u>, Florida Statutes. This requirement affects all public entities of the State and becomes effective January 1, 1991. The special condition is as follows:

<u>IDENTICAL TIE BIDS</u> - Preference shall be given to businesses with drug-free workplace programs. Whenever two or more bids which are equal with respect to price, quality, and service are received by the State or by any political subdivision for the procurement of commodities or contractual services, a bid received from a business that certifies that it has implemented a drug-free workplace program shall be given preference in the award process. Established procedures for processing tie bids will be followed if none of the tied vendors have a drug-free workplace program, a business shall:

- 1) Publish a statement notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession, or use of a controlled substance is prohibited in the workplace and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition.
- 2) Inform employees about the dangers of drug abuse in the workplace, the business's policy of maintaining a drug-free workplace, any available drug counseling, rehabilitation, and employee assistance programs, and the penalties that may be imposed upon employees for drug abuse violations.

SECTION II - Services

The Contractor shall provide INDOOR AIR QUALITY SERVICES per specifications in RFP RFP-05C-005N and the corresponding proposal submitted by the Contractor, which by reference herein becomes part of this contract. All addenda issued to RFP RFP-05C-005N, if any, are also made a part of this contract.

SECTION III - Cost of Services

The Contractor shall be paid for services as listed in the RFP and awarded for INDOOR AIR QUALITY SERVICES for the School Board of Palm Beach County.

SECTION IV - Terms and Conditions

The Contractor shall have the option to terminate the contract upon written notice to the authorized representative of the School Board. Such notice must be received at least 90 days prior to the effective date of termination. The School Board shall have the option to terminate the contract without cause upon written notice to the authorized representative of the Contractor. Such notice must be received at least 30 days prior to the effective date of termination and the Contractor shall only be entitled to compensation up to

the date of termination. The Contractor shall not be entitled to lost profits.

Early termination of the contract by the Contractor may prohibit the Contractor from submitting proposals for a period of three years from the date of completion of the contract. The School Board shall establish the expiration date of the contract for use thereof.

There shall be no assignment of the contract or compensation to be derived therefrom by the Contractor.

Included in this Agreement are the terms and conditions as described in the Request for Proposal RFP-05C-005N, which are incorporated by reference herein and made a part hereof.

SECTION V - Indemnification/ Hold Harmless Agreement

Awarded proposers/bidders shall, in addition to any other obligation to indemnify the Palm Beach County School District and to the fullest extent permitted by law, protect, defend, indemnify and hold harmless the School District, their agents, officers, elected officials and employees from and against all claims, actions, liabilities, losses (including economic losses), costs arising out of any actual or alleged;
