**GENERAL OBJECTIVE:** To develop an understanding of appropriate and effective teaching

strategies utilizing the High/Scope Educational Approach through active learning, daily routine, adult-child interaction and the

learning environment.

- 10. identify the rationale for having large group experiences.
- 11. identify the negative implications of directive and controlling interaction styles.
- 12. identify effective strategies for helping adults enter children's play.
- 13. describe the communication strategies for supporting and extending children's play.
- 14. identify the rationale for using encouragement verses praise and give specific examples of encouragement.
- 15. demonstrate knowledge of the steps in helping children resolve conflicts with others.
- 16. describe the characteristics of an effective interest center.
- 17. describe the rationale for using open-ended materials and real-life materials in a High/Scope classroom.
- 18. identify the rationale for labeling containers and materials.
- 19. identify various labels by use of examples as related to the classroom.
- 20. describe the role of the adult in the outdoor environment of a High/Scope classroom.
- 21. ensure communication about common outdoor safety hazards and name the steps that can be taken to improve safety outdoors.

#### **DELIVERY PROCEDURES:**

Participants will:

- 1. participate in all required training and/or workshops.
- 2. participate in discussion, role playing and problem solving strategies
- 3. read professional material related to the field of early childhood education.
- 4. network with participants to share best practices
