GENERAL OBJECTIVE: To develop an understanding of the benefits of team building as it

relates to working with the Key Experiences, Child Observation

Record (COR) and parental involvement.

- 13. facilitate communication of how daily observations and anecdotal record keeping are important parts of the High/Scope approach.
- 14. identify the characteristics of a useful anecdotal note.
- 15. describe what a Child Observation Record (COR) is and how is it used.
- 16. identify the advantages of the COR over typical child assessment and evaluation tools.
- 17. identify the advantages of the High/Scope daily team planning process.
- 18. describe the elements of the team planning process.
- 19. identify the advantages of parents becoming involved in the education of their children.
- 20. describe the elements of the High/Scope approach to parents.

DELIVERY PROCEDURES:

Participants will:

- 1. participate in all required training and/or workshops.
- 2. participate in discussion, role playing and problem solving strategies
- 3. read professional material related to the field of early childhood education.
- 4. network with participants to share best practices
