GENERAL OBJECTIVE: Participants will examine and implement effective instructional

oral reading strategies for building word recognition, fluency, and

comprehension that increases student performance.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVE:

Within the duration of this program, participants will:

1. demonstrate an understanding of benchmarks for fluency development.

- 2. examine ways to build reading fluency.
- 3. demonstrate an understanding of the benefits of reading aloud.
- 4. ensure an understanding of preparing for read alouds.
- 5. employ the skills needed to conduct read alouds.
- 6. specify the appropriate methods of responding after read alouds.
- 7. compare ways to support reading for developing and struggling readers.
- 8. demonstrate an understanding of the benefits of repeated reading.
- 9. demonstrate an understanding of implementing repeated reading through direct instruction.
- 10. utilize performance reading as an effective technique to engage readers.
- 11. ensure an understanding of creating instructional synergy.
- 12. facilitate clear communication to key stakeholders regarding instructional practices and student achievement.
- 13. ensure oral reading strategies are implemented across curriculum content.
- 14. demonstrate an understanding of ways to assess word recognition and fluency through oral reading.
- 15. analyze skills in order to evaluate fluency using informal classroom assessments.

PROCEDURES:

Participants will participate in professional development activities that examine effective instructional oral reading strategies for building word recognition, fluency, and comprehension that increases student performance by:

- 1. actively participating in activities that lead to mastery of the targeted specific objectives of this component.
- 2. reading and discussing related research with colleagues.
- 3. modeling effective instructional techniques.
- 4. simulating various instructional methods.
- 5. sharing constructive feedback related to targeted oral reading strategies.

EVALUATION OF PARTICIPANTS:

Participants will demonstrate mastery of the targeted specific objectives as evidenced through the professional contact's observation notes, participant's product samples, participant's written reflections, and/or assessment tools.

FOLLOW-UP ACTIVITIES:

Participants will complete and submit 3 or more of the following:

- 1. documentation showing impact to job performance.
- 2. documentation showing impact to increased student performance.
- 3. develop a portfolio of selected indicators of implementation.
- 4. current student assessment results indicating increased word recognition, fluency, and comprehension.
- 5. written reflections.
- 6. authentic word recognition, fluency, and comprehension products.
