READING FIRST CONTINUANCE ASSURANCES AND AMENDMENTS

In order to facilitate the release of funds for FY07 and continue the *Reading First* grant in 21 schools in Palm Beach County for Year Three of implementation, the following assurances are made by The School District of Palm Beach County:

Principal Survey Assurance - The School District of Palm Beach County assures that each principal at a Reading First site will complete the End of the Year Principal Survey and will submit the information in the given timeline.

Reading First Grant Assurance - The School District of Palm Beach County assures that all conditions of the grant will be implemented with fidelity and integrity.

The following amendment to the current grant is made: one-half the salaries and benefits of one *Reading First* Instructional Specialist, one *Reading First* Resource Teacher, and one *Reading First* Statistical Analyst will each be paid from the Phase One *Reading First* Grant for FY07. The rationale for this change is to provide a vehicle for increased support and more cohesive alignment between the Phase One and the Phase Two *Reading First* Grant schools. Therefore, the DOE 101 Budget Narrative attached for the 2006-2007 Phase One *Reading First* grant includes only one-half the salaries and benefits total for these three staff positions. The remaining costs to fund these three staff positions will come from the 2006-2007 Phase Two *Reading First* Grant. An additional result of this amendment is that administrative costs for each of the grants are held to a minimum.

All amendments previously requested remain in effect. These include the funding formula for allocation of coaches and the matrix of intervention materials/programs recommended to *Reading First* schools.
