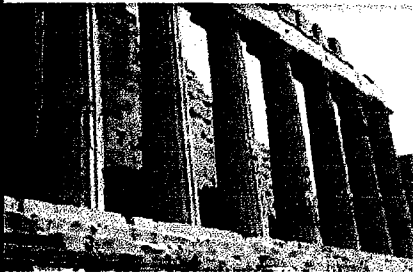
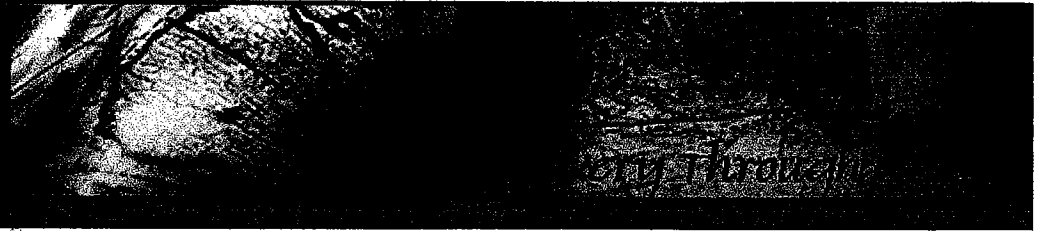

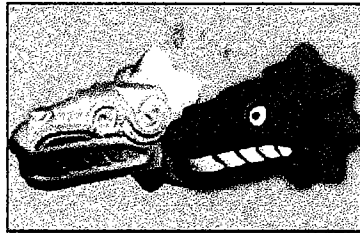

1200 - 1521 AD

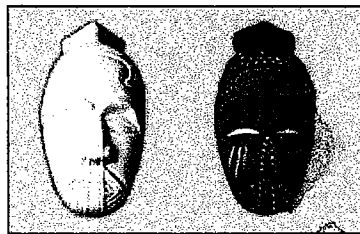

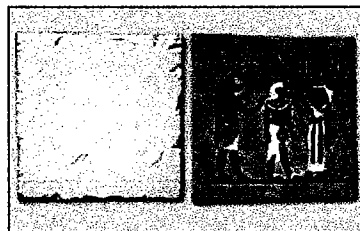
