ADULT GEOGRAPHIC APPLICATION NARRATIVE

SUPPORT FOR STRATEGIC IMPERATIVES: The adult education programs in Palm Beach County uphold the State's mission and goals by implementing programs that align with Florida's K-20 Strategic Plan. In support of Florida's reading initiative, *Just Read, Florida*, intensive professional development activities will train teachers with an effective interactive approach to reading. All adult education teachers, primarily those teaching FCAT remediation, will be trained to incorporate the Creating Independence through Student-owned Strategies (CRISS). This project focuses on teaching students how to learn through reading, writing, talking and listening. Students will be able to apply these strategies in all subject areas.

Palm Beach County's population growth has generated a greater need for literacy programs, primarily for limited English proficient adults; as well as, a need to provide opportunities to increase high school graduation through our Co-Enrolled and GED programs. As a result, adult education programs are continuously expanding throughout Palm Beach County, creating a need for program evaluation and a standardization process for management information. The Certification of Adult Programs (CAP) evaluation process will establish consistent standards and practices across programs and provide a procedure for monitoring performance and reporting accurate participant outcomes to NRS. The Certification of Adult Programs (CAP) is a collective accountability program which include understanding the value of data integrity and which supports **Strategic Plan 7**. CAP will become the fundamental framework for providing correct data to support state and federal (NRS) requirements. This project will grant the opportunity for a perpetual process of school improvement to meet federal, state and local program requirements, provide accountability, and maximize student outcomes. For this evaluation process to be successful, extensive staff development for administrators, teachers, and

data processors is required. Furthermore, personnel will provide continuous guidance, supervision and assistance to each site during the implementation phase of CAP. In addition, the TOPSpro training for ESOL teachers will further account for data quality reporting. TOPSpro generates a number of reports using aggregated data for program accountability. Teachers can use these reports to target instruction in the classroom and assure that students receive a high quality, individualized academic program. In addition to increasing student performance, TOPSpro will assure that students meet the standards of the curricula and that CASAS test scores are accurately reported to WDIS. The District is able to meet **Strategic Imperative 3** by offering students several opportunities to prevent them from dropping out of high school. Through the Adult High School Credit Program, students are able to make up credit coursework required for graduation and improve their GPA, as well as, receive FCAT remediation. Each student is required to meet with a Guidance Counselor for necessary counseling and appropriate referral to the Adult High School Credit Lab. Students receive high quality instruction for FCAT remediation, providing supplementary opportunities for FCAT success so that students will be able to graduate with a standard high school diploma. The GED Preparatory Program is an alternate option for dropout prevention and provides students with a "State of Florida High School Diploma." Finally, this project will support Strategic Imperative 8 by increasing the implementation sites of the Florida GED PLUS program. This will provide GED students with the knowledge and skills necessary to enroll in postsecondary education in order to improve and enrich their own and their families' lives. In addition, a collaborative arrangement with PBCC provides counseling and financial assistance for vocational programs. The benefit of Florida GED PLUS is to provide students with the skills needed to obtain a GED diploma and to assess their readiness for a college diploma, granting credit courses. A counseling component is necessary in order to identify which students qualify for the program, as well as to provide students with the information and support to be successful. These programs will be

implemented with the support of the Adult Education and Family Literacy Geographical Grant and will supply the necessary Primary Core Measures required for the grant.

Recruitment of adult students and marketing the District's adult education programs are ongoing processes. Furthermore, posters and brochures are disseminated to the District's Guidance Coordinators at each of the 25 high schools and 9 alternative sites. Further marketing is accomplished through our collaborative partners such as the Literacy Coalition, the Palm Beach Public Library and Palm Beach Community College (PBCC).

GEPA: This project will assist the District in meeting the GEPA requirement. The District has policies in place regarding equitable access to adult education programs addressed in the provision of Section 427 of the General Education Provisions. This project will assist with providing services to adults with disabilities. An agreement with the Center for Group Counseling will test GED participants requesting accommodations to the GED Tests, free of charge. This project will also provide additional opportunities for professional development in addressing specific disabilities in the classroom.

EQUITABLE SERVICES FOR PRIVATE SCHOOL PARTICIPATION:

Adult education in Palm Beach County has continuously supported private schools and homeschooled students. Private school students have continuously been enrolled in the Adult High School Credit Program in order to make up any failed courses and graduate on time. In addition, the District provides homeschoolers the opportunity for a GED Preparation program through Virtual Education as well as a means of obtaining their "State of Florida High School Diploma."
