## **PROCLAMATION**

## **FOREIGN LANGUAGE WEEK**

**WHEREAS**, in 2001, the United States Congress recognized the importance of foreign language study, formalizing it in the "No Child Left Behind Act" by designating foreign languages as a core academic area; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2002 Florida Legislature passed legislation requiring Florida public schools to develop a K-12 foreign language plan; and

**WHEREAS**, according to the U.S. Census Bureau in 2002, 24 percent of Florida's residents speak a language other than English at home; and

**WHEREAS**, a 2000 survey of Florida businesses indicated that more than half employed up to 50 percent bilingual employees; and

**WHEREAS**, according to the centers for the International Business Education and Research, foreign language study provides the ability to gain comprehensive understanding of and interaction with the cultures of United States trading partners, and thus establishes a solid foundation for successful economic relationships; and

**WHEREAS**, research indicates students with four or more years of foreign language study scored higher on college entrance examinations than students who did not.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Superintendent and School Board of Palm Beach County proclaims March 5 – 11, 2007, as *Foreign Language Week* for Palm Beach County schools.
