Memorandum of Understanding

Web-Based Instruction Programs - North East Florida Educational Consortium (NEFEC)

This memorandum of understanding is between the District School Board of Putnam County on behalf of the North East Florida Educational Consortium and the District School Board of Palm Beach County.

Purpose

The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding is to comply with the priorities of the program which include the following:

- Improving student performance on Sunshine State Standards
- Addressing unmet needs of low-performing students in dropout recovery programs or summer school programs
- Meeting the needs of the programs that are serving students expelled or suspended from Florida public schools including, but not limited to, Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) Facilities.

NEFEC, through funding provided by the Florida Legislature (HB 5001 – 2006 General Appropriations Act, Item #124,) will assist the aforementioned school district in obtaining and implementing Educational Options, Inc. NOVEL/STARSTM, a web-based, comprehensive, competency-centered curriculum provided through an allocation entitled Web-Based Instruction Programs - NEFEC. For the purposes of this project, the program shall be called the NEFEC Dropout Prevention/Credit Recovery Program.

Terms of Agreement

The initial terms of the agreement shall commence upon signing and shall continue until June 30, 2007.

Responsibilities

Each party in this agreement will provide the following support for the initial start-up, implementation and reporting requirements of the NEFEC Dropout Prevention/Credit Recovery Program:

Work with vendor regarding the training of administrators and teachers as well as providing district-level technical support.	Schedule training and pay the initial start up cost to the vendor for training.
Assist in coordinating district orders for the number of annual single-use or reusable licenses directly from vendor.	Pay Educational Options, Inc. directly for the entire cost of the program and receive reimbursement by NEFEC upon receipt of the required paperwork. The reimbursement schedule is as follows: • \$200 of the \$270 cost for each reusable license • \$120 of the \$180 cost for each single-use license • Entire cost of single-use license (\$180) for DJJ facilities • Full reimbursement for site licenses • Full reimbursement of teacher training fees
 Compile and submit quarterly reports to DOE Compile and submit fourth quarter (summative) report Develop required fiscal reports for the 2nd and 4th quarters 	Comply with the required data for quarterly reports as per the RFA by: Participating in scheduled conference calls with stakeholders regarding implementation Providing timely and complete district level reports on all aspects of the program including a qualitative analysis of the impact on students and instructors Reviewing data to make adjustments as needed to improve the expected outcomes Failure to comply with reporting requirements will result in referral to Florida DOE for noncompliance.
Review the requirements specified in the proposal and produce marketing information for dissemination by the district.	Recruit students who are in the target population specified in the application (high school drop outs; high school students identified as in danger of dropping out of school; students expelled or suspended from school and/or are behind in credits to graduate.)
Comply with the requirements for dissemination of information about the program through web sites and statewide meeting presentations.	If requested participate in state-wide dissemination of the information about the program.

Release of Student Data

By signature NEFEC assures that the released student data will be handled with confidentiality as required by Florida Statute 1002.22(3)(d)5. The data will be used only for the evaluation of students enrolled in schools/educational facilities participating in the NEFEC Dropout Prevention/Credit Recovery Program.

Summary of District Responsibilities

In order for schools to participate and be successful in the implementation of **NOVEL/STARS**TM districts must:

- Provide district support for implementation of the program
- Provide the classrooms and technology to implement the program
- Market the program to the target population
- Work with NEFEC on required reports to the DOE
- Fund the initial cost of the licenses for use in the program
- Complete Request for Reimbursement Forms including documentation of purchases and send to NEFEC in a timely fashion
- Participate in dissemination of information regarding program
