



**This AGREEMENT is entered into as of this August 1, 2007,
by and between**



**The School Board of Palm Beach County, Florida
(herein referred to as "The District")**

and

**Florida Atlantic University
Board of Trustees
(herein referred to as "FAU")**

WHEREAS, the District is desirous of providing proper training for approximately 45 teachers in the Reading Recovery teacher training program in the Department of Elementary Education/Title I, and FAU, by and through its College of Education ("COE"), is desirous of providing proper training and orientation to such teachers; and

WHEREAS, the District and FAU have a long history of cooperation in training teachers; and

WHEREAS, the District and FAU have previously entered into a similar agreement to enhance learning opportunities for selective and qualified teachers of the District,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the District and FAU agree to provide such training as follows:

The purpose of the SPONSORED Early Literacy Program in Reading Recovery is to provide information to elementary school teachers to update their skills and develop new expertise within their areas of responsibility.

The program will:

1. provide two (2) FAU courses consisting of three (3) credit hours each,
2. be provided in up to three (3) sessions of approximately 15 students each, with a maximum of 45 students total,
3. be staffed by faculty specially trained as Reading Recovery Teacher Leaders approved by FAU and the District,
4. be approved by the COE for six (6) hours of FAU academic credit,
5. provide three (3) hours of 5000 level credit for each of the two (2) courses – one in Fall 2007 and one in Spring 2008,
6. consist of forty-five (45) hours of course work for each three (3) credit hour session,
7. use tests and grades to determine performance, and
8. be limited to a maximum of 20 students per session.

Course number EDG 5931 "Reading Recovery I" will commence with the agreed upon dates beginning fall 2007 semester. Course number EDG 5931 "Reading Recovery II" will commence with the agreed upon dates at the start of spring term in January 2008.

The course sessions will be administered as a Sponsored Program through the COE. This will include:

- I. Registration of students:
 1. will take place on the start date determined by agreement with the District and the COE,
 2. be handled by the COE at the agreed upon Palm Beach County School District class site(s),

3. will include 3 credit hours of FAU academic credit for each forty-five (45) hour course, and
4. will be provided in fall semester (2007) and spring semester (2008) for a maximum registration of 45 students per semester.

II. Class Scheduling:

1. site arrangements will be made by the District and conveyed to the COE in a timely manner, including name and number of contact person at each site, and
2. will be determined by faculty prior to start dates for each 45 hour course.

III. Managing the budget listed below including:

1. paying the course instructors, and
2. invoicing the District.

BUDGET

The District will be charged the FAU '07-'08 academic year graduate tuition rate per student enrolled. Based on a maximum of forty-five (45) students per semester, at a charge of \$805.59* per student, costs to the District are estimated at \$36,251.55 each semester. Total cost for two semesters is estimated at \$72,503.10. In addition, a fee of \$200 per student may be charged to cover faculty and administrative costs if fewer than 10 students are enrolled per section. Funds are payable to FAU by the District thirty (30) days after receipt of invoice. Tuition does not include the provision of books and materials, which shall be the responsibility of the District and/or the students.


*Tuition is calculated at a 10% increase from the fall 2006 tuition rate. Actual tuition set by the state for fall 2007 has yet to be determined.

The COE agrees to assume responsibility for academic integrity of the courses and provide academic credit. In addition, both parties agree there will be no discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, religion, age, marital status and condition of handicap.

The period of this Agreement is August 1, 2007 through June 30, 2008, and is subject to approval by Florida Atlantic University Board of Trustees and The School Board of Palm Beach County, Florida, Department of Elementary Education/Title I.


