GENERAL OBJECTIVE:

To extend pre-kindergarten teachers' knowledge of developmentally appropriate practices and the means of successfully applying this philosophy to curriculum development, room design, classroom management, and parent involvement programs.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES:

Within the duration of this program, participants will demonstrate an understanding of how to:

- 1. Plan and develop effective teaching strategies for the implementation of appropriate small group activities.
- 2. Plan and develop effective teaching strategies for the implementation of appropriate large group activities.
- 3. Demonstrate the ability to design and develop age appropriate units for use in the learning centers.
- 4. Demonstrate the ability to implement age appropriate activities with emphasis on active learning.
- 5. Identify new course materials in research in Early Childhood Education with the emphasis on the development of Infant/Toddlers through four years of age.
- 6. Demonstrate knowledge of Early Childhood Education through the reading and discussing of professional articles and journals.
- 7. Demonstrate knowledge of current issues and concerns addressed by professional early childhood educations.
- 8. Demonstrate and discuss appropriate practices regarding staff-child interaction.
- 9. Demonstrate the ability to use child-initiated interest to develop specific activities in each area of the classroom.
- 10. Develop techniques and demonstrate strategies for the implementation of conflict resolution procedures.
- 11. Develop the ability to use critical thinking skills as a part of problem solving activities.
- 12. Develop techniques for observational note taking (anecdotal notes) for the developmental assessment of children's progress and achievement relative to curricular and special needs.

DELIVERY PROCEDURES:

Participants will:

- 1. Attend all required workshops.
- 2. Plan effective teaching strategies for small and large group activities.
- 3. Prepare and present a mock developmentally appropriate group activity.
- 4. Arrange simulated classroom learning centers for maximizing the learning atmosphere.
- 5. Initiate classroom activities specifically generated from child's interest.

EVALUATION OF PARTICIPANTS:

Participants will demonstrate mastery of at least 80% of the objectives through a variety of planned and implemented activities with young children. The assessment will include written assignments and classroom observations.

FOLLOW-UP ACTIVITIES:

Participants will:

- 1. Model and demonstrate appropriate small and large group activities.
- 2. Provide and share feedback regarding implementation of developmentally appropriate classroom practices.
- 3. Provide mentoring opportunities to other staff and peers.
- 4. Share ideas, research, lessons, and/or best practices.

COMPONENT EVALUATION:

Participants and Instructors will assess the degree to which the procedures address the specific objectives and make recommendations for revision through a questionnaire/survey.
