SUBJECT: FY2001-FY2005 ACT Results

The Department of Research and Evaluation has completed an analysis of the FY2005 ACT High School Profile Report produced by the ACT Corporation. Tables 1 and 2 contain data pertaining to the participation rate and average composite scores for participating School District of Palm Beach County (SDPBC) high schools, the SDPBC, Florida, and the Nation. Table 3 contains the data for Black, Hispanic, and White seniors in the SDPBC.

Individual schools and districts can use the ACT results from multiple years to conduct self-evaluation and self-comparisons; however, the ACT Corporation cautions against using the results of the ACT to compare performance between states and the Nation. ACT states the following in their report: "State norms may differ from national norms for non-educational reasons such as the demographic make-up of a state's ACT-tested graduates compared to the Nation."

Individual school results are presented in Tables 1 and 2. A brief summary of statistically significant participation rate and composite score changes since FY2001 is provided below.

Participation Rate

- ◆ This year, 2,693 SDPBC seniors took the ACT, which yielded a participation rate of about 29%. The participation rate in the SDPBC has remained stable for the past five years.
- ◆ The participation rate of Black seniors (32%) has shown a significant upward trend since FY2002.
- ◆ The participation rate of Hispanic (22%) and White seniors (25%) is significantly lower than their participation rate in FY2001.

Composite Scores

- ◆ The average score in the SDPBC (20.3) is significantly lower than the average score of FY2001.
- ◆ The average score of White seniors (22.8) is significantly higher than their average score in FY2001.
- ◆ The average score of Black seniors (16.5) has remained stable since FY2001.
- ◆ The average score of Hispanic seniors (19.5) is significantly lower than their average score in FY2001.

These results will be shared with appropriate staff. Also, schools have received information about their ACT test takers and will use this information in the school improvement planning process.
