SUBJECT: FY2010 FCAT RETAKE RESULTS FOR

GRADES 10, 11, AND 12

High schools students who have not yet passed the Grade 10 FCAT may retake the FCAT in October and in March. In October, at grades 10, 11, and 12¹ in the School District of Palm Beach County (SDPBC), 7,856 students took the October FCAT Retake in Reading and 3,657 students in Mathematics; in March, 5,181 students took the FCAT Retake in Reading and 2,146 students in Mathematics.

In most FY2009 to FY2010 October comparisons, as well as March comparisons, the SDPBC percents of students passing has remained about the same at grades 10, 11, and 12 (see Tables 1-4). Exceptions to this pattern are detailed below:

- The FY2010 October FCAT Mathematics Retake percents passing were statistically higher than the FY2009 October percents passing at grade 10 (25% to 32%) and at grade 11 (44% to 48%).
- The FY2010 March FCAT Mathematics Retake percent passing were statistically higher than the FY2009 March FCAT Math Retake percents passing at grade 11 (31% to 35%).
- The FY2010 October FCAT Reading Retake percents passing were statistically higher than the FY2009 October percents passing at grade 10 (11% to 16%) and at grade 11 (29% to 34%).
- The FY2010 March FCAT Reading Retake percents passing were statistically lower than the FY2009 March FCAT Reading Retake percents passing at grade 11 (27% to 20%) and at grade 12 (18% to 13%).
