SUBJECT: FALL FCAT/FCAT 2.0 RETAKE RESULTS FOR GRADES 10, 11, AND 12

On November 30, 2011, the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) released the results of the Fall FCAT/FCAT 2.0 Retakes. Students enrolled in public schools in the State of Florida must pass the FCAT/FCAT 2.0 in reading and FCAT in mathematics in order to graduate with a standard diploma. Those students in grades 10, 11, and 12 who have not yet passed the FCAT/FCAT 2.0 may participate in the Fall and Spring Retake.¹ For the School District of Palm Beach County (SDPBC), the number of students in grades 10, 11, and 12 who took the Fall FCAT/FCAT 2.0 Reading and FCAT Mathematics Retakes was 7,340 and 3,249, respectively.²

In the Spring of FY2011, the State continued to use the FCAT for reading and mathematics, but introduced the new FCAT 2.0 for reading. Students who failed the Spring FY2011 FCAT 2.0 in reading must take the FCAT 2.0 Reading Retake, while students who failed the Spring FY2011 FCAT in reading must take the FCAT Reading Retake.³ Because there are now two different reading retake tests, the SDPBC cannot compare its reading passing rates from FY2011 to FY2012.

An analysis of the Fall retakes revealed the following major findings:

- From FY2011 to FY2012, for FCAT Mathematics Retakes, the percent of SDPBC Grade 10 students passing decreased 12 percentage points (from 33% to 21%), while those of the State decreased five percentage points (from 28% to 23%).
- In FY2012, for FCAT Reading and FCAT 2.0 Reading Retakes, the percents passing in the SDPBC showed no discernable pattern when compared to those of the State.

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¹ Students may also meet the graduation requirement by achieving a concordant score on the SAT or ACT tests.

² This does not include test scores for 35 students in reading and 115 students in mathematics that were invalidated by the State pending further investigation.

³ Students who entered grade 9 in FY2010 must earn passing scores on the Grade 10 FCAT 2.0 Reading and Grade 10 FCAT Mathematics assessments.
