SUBJECT: FY2005-FY2009 SAT I RESULTS

The College Board has recently released the results of the FY2009 SAT Reasoning Test (SAT I) for college-bound seniors who took the test. The SAT I measures critical reading, mathematics, and writing abilities and is designed to be used with secondary school records and other information in assessing student readiness for college-level work. SAT I performance and participation is a Key Result for the School District of Palm Beach County (SDPBC).

SAT I results from multiple years can reveal trends in the demographic characteristics of test takers and their academic preparation. The results can also provide individual schools and districts with one way of self-evaluation and self-comparison. However, the College Board states that caution should be used in making comparisons between local, state, and national results because not all students in a high school, school district, or a state take the SAT I.

Results

From FY2008 to FY2009, average scores for the SDPBC remained about the same,² while the participation rate decreased.³

Participation Rate

- From FY2008 to FY2009, the participation rate for the SDPBC declined (54% to 46%).
 - Participation rates decreased eight percentage points for White students (61% to 53%), three points for Black students (34% to 31%), and five points for Hispanic students (47% to 42%).

³ It is likely that SAT participation has decreased because more students are taking the ACT.

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¹ The SAT Writing test did not exist until FY2006.

² Using SDPBC effect sizes, changes in SAT average scores of four points or more indicate a significant change.

Critical Reading, Mathematics, and Writing Average Scores

- In FY2009 average scores in the SDPBC were higher than those of the State in reading (501 vs. 497), mathematics (507 vs. 498), and writing (484 vs. 480). SDPBC average scores were the same as the Nation in reading (501 vs. 501), but lower in mathematics (507 vs. 515) and writing (484 vs. 493).
- From FY2008 to FY2009, SDPBC average scores remained about the same in reading (501 to 501), mathematics (506 to 507), and writing (484 to 484).
 - Average scores for White and Black students remained about the same in reading (White: 525 to 526, Black: 440 to 438), mathematics (White: 533 to 535, Black: 434 to 435), and writing (White: 508 to 507, Black: 423 to 423).
 - Average scores for Hispanic students increased by five points in reading (484 to 489) and writing (467 to 472), and remained about the same in mathematics (488 to 490).

Tables 1 – 6 contain information about the number of test takers, participation rates, and average scores for the SDPBC, its schools, the State, and the Nation. Table 7 contains data for Black, Hispanic, and White seniors in the SDPBC. Schools that have no data for five years and schools that have closed are not reported.

These results will be shared with appropriate staff to provide direction for improvements in curriculum and instruction. Also, schools have received information about their SAT test takers and will use this information in the school improvement planning process.
