SUBJECT: FY19 RESULTS OF THE PARENT, STUDENT & STAFF VERSIONS OF THE SCHOOL EFFECTIVENESS QUESTIONNAIRE (SEQ)

The District administered the School Effectiveness Questionnaire (SEQ) from January to February 2019. The SEQ measures perceptions regarding the effectiveness of our District schools. The SEQ provides important information to schools and the District to ensure a Positive and Supportive School Climate, which is a central theme in the Strategic Plan.

The categories for the SEQ were developed from a review of national school climate surveys.¹ The categories in the **Parent** version of the SEQ are: School Climate (16 items), Diverse Community (2 items), High Expectations (4 items), Individual Concerns (4 items), and Parental Involvement (8 items). The categories in the **Student** version of the SEQ are: School Climate (24 items), Challenging Assignment (5 items), Diverse Community (5 items), Parental Involvement (3 items), Individual Concerns (5 items), and College Preparation (7 items), for middle school and high school students only. The categories in the **Staff** version of the SEQ are: Instructional Leadership (18 items), High Expectations (5 items), School Climate (24 items), Diverse Community (3 items), Decision Making (3 items), and Student Conduct (9 items).

Response rates for Parent, Student, and Staff versions are provided in Table 1. Tables 2 through 5 report the percent of positive responses overall and in each of the categories for the Parent, Student, and Staff versions of the SEQ for the District and by School Level, respectively.

¹ Category labels were taken from research literature related to the structure of school climate.

SEQ Response Rates from FY16 to FY19 (Table 1):

- Parent response rates for FY19 have increased over the prior FY18 SEQ but have remained critically low for the District and at most schools since FY16.²
 - Rates increased over prior FY18 SEQ at every school level and were highest at Elementary, followed by Middle, then High schools.
- Student response rates for FY19 increased over the prior FY18 SEQ for the District.
 - Rates have decreased since FY16 at every school level.
- Staff Response Rates for FY19 have increased over the prior FY18 SEQ.
 - Rates increased at Elementary and Middle schools since FY16 but decreased in High schools.

FY19 Percent Positive Response Rates by Category, and by District and School Level for Parent, Student, and Staff (Table 2):

The percent positive responses are comprised of those responses on the SEQ Likert scales that denote agreement (strongly, moderately, or agree), the extent of influence for decision making (moderate influence or a great deal of influence), or the degree of concern (where negative individual concerns or adverse student conduct is a minor problem or not a problem). Table 2 below displays the FY19 SEQ percent positive response rate in each of the categories of the SEQ for the District and by School Level, respectively. As noted, parent responses should be viewed with caution due to the limited response rate.

For Table 2:

For the two categories of Diverse Community and School Climate that are reflected in all three (Parent, Student, and Staff) versions of the SEQ, the percent positive response rate is lowest for students. For the two categories of Individual Concerns and Parental Involvement that are reflected in both Parent and Student versions of the SEQ, the percent positive response rate is lowest for students. For the category of High Expectations that is reflected in both Parent and Staff versions of the SEQ, the percent positive response rate is similar for both. The category of Challenging Assignments in the Student version of the SEQ (equated with High Expectations) has a lower percent positive response rate when compared with the category of High Expectations in the Parent and Staff versions. All other categories are unique to separate versions of the SEQ. For these categories, the percent positive response rates were highest in Elementary, followed by Middle, then High.

FY16 - FY19 Percent Positive Response Rates Overall and by SEQ Categories (Tables 3-5):

For Table 3:

- While a limited sample, the percent of parents in the District responding positively to the SEQ overall has remained at similar levels since FY16.
 - There was an increase in the District positive response rates in the categories High Expectations Individual and Individual Concerns.
- Parent positive response rates overall in Elementary schools has remained at similar levels since FY16.
 - There was an increase in the Elementary positive response rates in the categories High Expectations Individual and Individual Concerns.
- Parent positive response rates overall in Middle schools has remained at similar levels since FY16.
 - There was a decrease in Middle positive response rates for the category of Diverse Community and an increase in the categories of High Expectations and Individual Concerns.
- Parent positive response rates overall in High schools has remained at similar levels since FY16.
 - There was an increase in High positive response rates for the category of High Expectations.

The trend seen District-wide for parent positive response rates was also seen across school levels with the exception of the decrease for Diverse Community in Middle. Elementary parents expressed the highest positive responses followed by Middle and then High School.

For Table 4:

- The percent of students in the District responding positively to the SEQ overall has decreased from FY16 with the single largest decrease occurring from FY18 to FY19.
 - There was an increase in the District positive response rates for Challenging Assignments, Parental Involvement, and College Preparation.
 - There was a decrease in the District positive response rates for School Climate, Diverse Community, and Individual Concerns.

The trend seen District-wide for student positive response rates was also seen across school levels regarding the increase in positive response rates for Challenging Assignments, Parental Involvement, and College Preparation (not included for Elementary) and the decreases noted in School Climate, Diverse Community, and Individual Concerns. Elementary students expressed the highest positive responses while Middle and High School positive response rates were mixed.

For Table 5:

- The percent of staff in the District responding positively to the SEQ overall has increased from FY16.
 - There was an increase in the District positive response rates across all categories with the exception of Diverse Community with similar rates since first introduced in the SEQ in FY18.

The trend seen District-wide for staff positive response rates was also seen across school levels regarding the increase in positive response rates for High Expectations, Parental Involvement, and College Preparation (not included for Elementary) and the decreases noted in School Climate, Diverse Community, and Individual Concerns. Elementary staff expressed the highest positive responses followed by Middle and then High School.

In addition, at the April Principal Leadership Academy the teacher SEQ results were reviewed with principals to model a process that they may use at with their schools. Schools can now review the Student, Parent, and Staff survey to compare across groups, to the district averages, themselves from 2018, and to similar schools. Schools will identify strengths and opportunities for growth for which to apply the available resources. Further, principals were encouraged to engage other school staff in developing systems to support improved culture and climate on campus.
