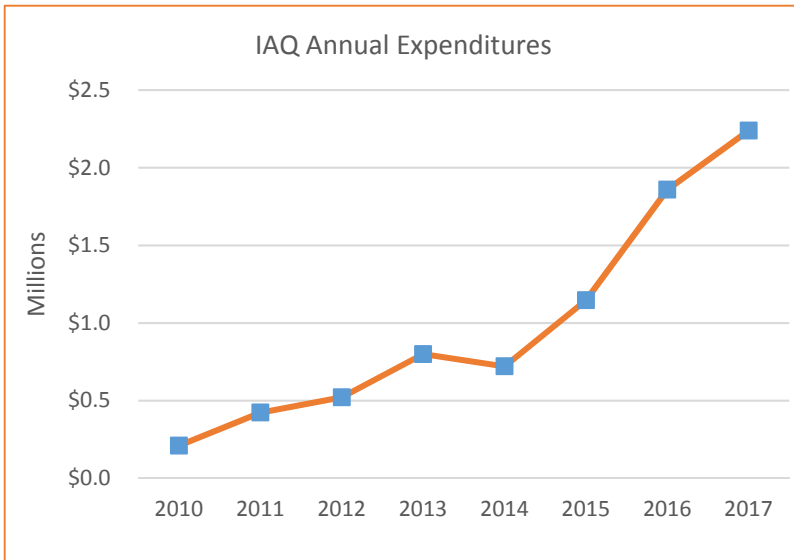
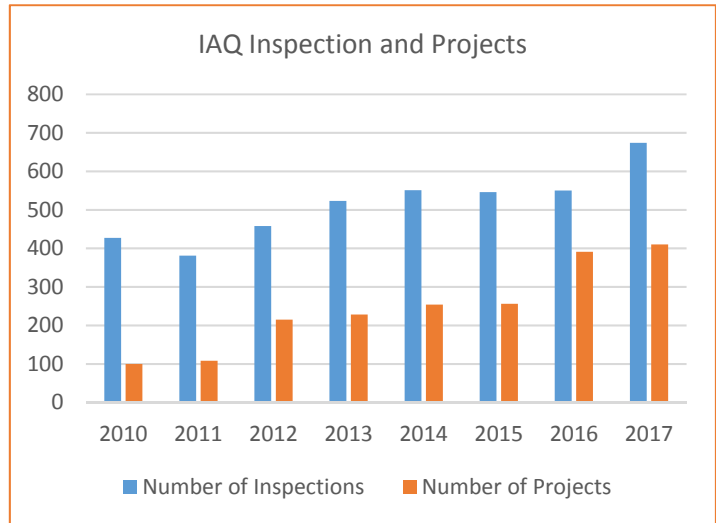
Fiscal Year 2017: Indoor Air Quality a Year in Review

Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) is the quality of the air within the built environment. Environmental & Conservation Services' (ECS) Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) program is an integral component of the department's mission to provide healthy, sustainable, learning and working environments for all students, staff and visitors to District facilities. Further, this program supports the District's goal to safeguard the health, wellness and safety of students and staff while promoting a high performance culture.

The Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) program provides services directly to school centers through IAQ assessments and environmental remediation projects related to hazards such as water damage, mold, odors, infectious disease, fire, flood response, and natural disasters such as hurricanes, tornados, heavy inundations, and/or localized flooding.

During the FY17 school year, IAQ staff responded to 674 IAQ inspection requests:

- 159 schools and 10 facilities were inspected
- 44 sites had 5 – 10 inspection requests
- 9 sites had 10+ inspection requests.

ECS staff conducted 410 IAQ-related projects utilizing 5 separate environmental consultants and 5 IAQ contractors.

ECS' IAQ program total expenditure for FY17 was \$2,239,203.76.
