<b>Old Business</b>	<p><b>Mental Health Committee</b> – No one from the Committee available to report. The next SHAC Mental Health meeting is scheduled for January 16, 2018.</p> <p><b>Wellness Promotion Task Force (WPTF)</b> – Paula Triana informed that the last WPTF meeting was held on November 16, 2017, they had the opportunity to brainstorm. The Policy revision progress is going well. Hopefully they will be taking the policy for presentation to the Board in February 2108, and going for adoption in May, 2108.</p> <p>The Hunger Relief Collaboration Team (HRCT) met for the first time in November and will have a second meeting on January 23, 2018 to address how they can collaborate with hunger at the school level. The HCD does a good job of surveilling these students and where the schools are.
