Old Business	<p>Mental Health Committee – No one from the committee available to report</p> <p>Wellness Promotion Task Force (WPTF) – Paula Triana informed that the School District is in the process of completing the application and requirements for the Healthy School District Assessment due this Friday, April 13. The requirements and the application process has changed, therefore, they are not sure if they will be able to maintain the gold status. They had a team on the <i>Lets Move Campaign</i>, over 50 schools and 11 departments participated which logged over 7 million minutes. The next WPTF meeting will be on Thursday, April 19th at the Board Room. The theme is Safety Matter Everyone Working Together, they will have an Expo 25 minutes before and 25 minutes after the meeting.</p> <p>CDC Grant Advisory Committee – Cheryl Phillips informed that Pete Stewart is submitting the 5-year grant proposal due on April 13, 2018, they should know the outcome by July. They are adding more books dealing with bullying, LGBTQ and mental health to the diversity library for all elementary and secondary schools. They had about 150 students, several police officers and 3 School Board Members -- Erica Whitfield, Karen Brill, and Marcia Andrews -- at the Pride Parade on March 25. School Police officers and Pete staffed a booth the entire weekend at Palm Beach Pride Fest. The Human Growth and Development curriculum is up for K-12 grade. They are also in the process of revamping and modernizing 9th grade and will work their way down the grade levels as needed. The high school HG&D curriculum deals with issues such as consent, sexting, sexual harassment, teen dating violence, sexual transmitted diseases, HIV, etc.</p> <p>School Health Services Report – Dr. Cathy Burns informed that the Federally Qualified Health Center Genesis Community Health Center and FoundCare are both presenting a health clinic in three high schools. 	<p>Community High School and will be presenting one in Boynton Beach Community High School. FoundCare will be presenting a clinic in Palm Beach Lakes Community High School. Tessa Onia informed that the Genesis Clinic in Atlantic HS started on January 29th. They mailed parents the letters and have been working on doing class visits, the teachers are very receptive. They provide medical services, school physicals, sports physicals, manage chronic diseases, working on the VFC license to provide vaccines.</p> <p>Brenda informed that they are also waiting on the CLEO approval to do STD testing and the alarm system available for the pharmaceutical refrigerator/freezer in order to have the vaccines on site. In addition, Joe Toste is a social worker at Atlantic HS and is very busy, they are interested in forming trauma groups after seeing the needs. The Boynton Beach HS clinic is still under construction; Mr. Sims, the principal, is eager to get services started and the social worker has already started providing services.</p>
